



Dear Mayor Muldoon and Town Councilors,

We appreciate your continued observance of the environment in our town and thank you for reaching out with this public conversation.

Regarding the topic of Food Trucks, we would ask that you do not change any ordinance that would allow their operation in town, for any length of time.

While we recognize there is a short term supply and demand challenge at certain times of the day right now, we also need to share we have not received one complaint from a visitor about the situation and their dining experience in Jackson Hole. I'm sure some are frustrated by the length of time or reduced in dining experiences, but our business are serving their needs to the best of their ability and they are doing a great job, given the completely challenging work environment they face. This is a time to support small business while they can provide service to our visitor, knowing by the middle to late August this demand will slow.

Introducing Food trucks is not a solution the Chamber can support knowing how many restaurants spoke against this in June (and previously) and are still of the same mindset. The future implications and unintended consequences of letting businesses operate that do not have the same high entry costs to operate food service in this town, is not a solution at any time, and least of all as this time.

We applaud you and your staff for the parklet work, social spacing improvements, and public messaging/communications of these changes.
