Montego Bay, popularly called Mobay, is Jamaica's tourist capital. It is the second largest city and a major cruise port with numerous beach resorts. This resort region also includes the popular Doctor's Cave Beach as well as snorkeling and diving at coral reefs in the protected waters of the Montego Bay Marine Park.

Nearby, **Falmouth** is the capital town of Jamaica's Trelawny Parish. It's a busy cruise port that lies between Ocho Rios and Montego Bay on the island's north shore. The town is characterized by its Georgian architecture, concentrated in the Falmouth Historic District. To the south, the 18th-Century Good Hope Estate was originally a sugar plantation. Further east, the Martha Brae river cascades over limestone rocks in the cockpit country, then meanders into the seas.

» Animal Farm & Nature Reserve

Animal Farm & Nature Reserve offers tours to individuals or groups, to view a wide range of exotic birds and animals, as well as learn about alternative energy with solar and bio-gas generating plants.

Ocho Rios, spanish for "Eight Rivers", is truly the centrepiece of Jamaica. A former fishing village, it's now a resort with a cruise ship harbor and a busy bay beach lined with hotels. The fern-clad hills and cascading waterfalls of Ocho Rios are located in the heart of the north-coast region. The surrounding parish of Saint Ann is home to a rainforest. rivers and waterfalls, including Dunn's River Falls, a terraced 180 meter mountain waterfall with lagoon pools, surrounded by trees.

A short drive from "Ochi" is **Runaway Bay**, a tranquil seaside town Spanish colonizers fled from to Hispaniola, when the British took possession of Jamaica in 1655. Some of the best diving and snorkeling sites can be found along the Runaway Bay coastline.





Nestled between the majestic Blue Mountains and one of the world's largest natural harbours you'll find **Kingston**, Jamaica's capital city and a cultural mecca for those who are drawn to our rich cultural heritage and music.

Famously, Kingston is the birthplace of reggae music and serves as a rite of passage for music fans from all over the world. One popular stop is the Bob Marley Museum, where fans can tour Marley's former home and recording studio and come one step closer to connecting with the life and legacy of this legendary artist. But music isn't Kingston's only attraction. Visitors can also tour the historic Devon House mansion, which dates back to the late 19th century and is renowned for its homemade ice cream. The National Gallery of Jamaica is another must-visit cultural destination, showcasing the works of Jamaican artists from the 1920s to the present day. History buffs will enjoy visiting Port Royal, an historic old fort that was once a hub for piracy in the Caribbean.





» Rio Grande Rafting


