160th Anniversary Civilian Guidelines

Civilian Impressions

- 1. All Civilian participants are expected to be in period appropriate clothing for the duration of the event.
- 2. Appropriate shoes will be worn at all times. No athletic shoes or sandals.
- 3. Ladies should wear appropriate day dresses of one fabric. No white shirts/skirt combos, no ball gowns during the day.
- 4. Appropriate undergarments are strongly encouraged.
- 5. Hair should be dressed in a bun or chignon on the back of the head. Hair should not be worn down or loose.
- 6. Modern make-up, facial piercings, and nail polish is discouraged.
- 7. Children should be dressed in period civilian attire.
- 8. For event safety, we request that civilians not bring firearms.
 - ❖ Antique firearms are not allowed. ALL firearms will be inspected onsite and must pass NC Historic Sites safety requirements.
- 9. For historical accuracy, **NO FLAGS are permitted in the civilian camp** Bonnie Blue, Hardee's Corps, Confederate Nationals, Confederate Battle, Union Regimental, or US 35 star.
- 10. The civilian camp will be kept free of anachronistic items such as coolers, heaters, modern food containers, etc. Please keep all modern items out of view at all times.
