Kellogg Manor

Restored to its original grandeur in 2000, the home is rich with history and elegance with natural gardens around a lovely lakeside setting, making the Manor House truly a destination for all.

Kalamazoo Mall

Air Zoo

Step into aviation history with over 50 historic aircraft, captivating exhibits, and the stories behind flight's most iconic moments. A truly memorable experience celebrating the spirit of aviation.



Dr. Nathan Thomas House

When the Underground Railroad passed through southern Michigan, Dr. Nathan Thomas, an ardent Quaker Abolitionist living in Schoolcraft, was asked to open his home as a Station. During the twenty years the Station was in operation, 1,000 to 1,500 escaping slaves were given food, shelter, medical aid, and encouragement.

Vicksburg Historic Village

An open-air museum that brings the past to life with its beautifully preserved and restored buildings dating back to the late 1800s and early 1900s. With free admission, visitors can stroll through and experience what life was like in a small Midwestern town over a century ago.
