

Kenosha Area: A Taste of History 2 Day Tour



ARRIVAL DAY 1

9 AM – At **The Civil War Museum**, board a train bound for the battle front and hear personal stories of soldiers, nurses, doctors and clergymen. Travel back home on a riverboat and see how life was forever changed.

11:30 AM – Tour **Durkee Mansion and Kemper Center**. The 1860s await you in great splendor and elegance in this lovingly restored Victorian mansion along Lake Michigan.

1 PM – Enjoy a taste of Deutschland hospitality, with a German lunch at **House of Gerhard** where the Old World Charm will make you feel simply “Wunderbar”.

2:30 PM – Take a ride into yesteryear aboard an authentic **Electric Streetcar!**

3:00 PM – Enjoy a step-on guide tour along the Lake Michigan shore, and through Kenosha’s four **National Register Historic Districts**.

4 PM – Tour **Tenuta’s Italian Market**, a Kenosha tradition since 1950. Savor the aroma as you enter the store featuring many specialty groceries and spices. Don’t miss the cannoli!

5 PM – Check into one of Kenosha’s premier hotels for the evening.

6 PM – Enjoy an Italian-American dinner at **Casa Capri**, one of Kenosha’s oldest and finest restaurants featuring steaks, seafood, and authentic Italian recipes.

DAY 2

9 AM – Visit **Rhode Center for the Arts and its Pollard Gallery**. Tour the beautiful historic theater. Pollard Gallery, one of many Kenosha Area art galleries, has on exhibit a partial collection of portraits by international portrait artist George Pollard and children’s works by Nan Pollard.

10:30 AM – See how Kenosha County developed and grew at the **Kenosha History**

Center. Discover Kenosha’s rich auto-making history! You may also climb to the top of the **1866 Southport Lighthouse**. While on Simmons Island, stop for photos with the **Kenosha Lighthouse Studio at North Pier Lighthouse** as your backdrop.

NOON – Enjoy a lakeside lunch at **Boat House Pub & Eatery**.

1:30 PM – Shop at the **Jockey Factory Store** in Downtown Kenosha which features your favorite innerwear, cozy sleep and loungewear, and a large selection of stylish active and casualwear. Since the dawn of the 19th century, the original American underwear brand—Jockey International, Inc.—has called Kenosha home.

2:45 PM – Shop for produce, baked goods, jams, dips, pickles, and more at the Country Store at **Jerry Smith Produce & Pumpkin Farm**, a third-generation locally owned and operated family farm (seasonal).

4:00 PM – Depart for home.
