- 1. Stroll through the iconic hand-painted pumpkin displays at Jerry Smith Farm. FREE; fee for additional activities
- 2. Have fun on the 4-acre adventure farm located at Thompson Farm. Wed.-Fri. admission is \$4.95-\$7; fee increases on weekends. Additional fee for pumpkins and raspberries.
- 3. Rustic Road Brewing Company's Lakeside Oktoberfest happens September 26-29 at HarborPark Celebration Place. FREE admission
- 4. Military veterans and their families will have the opportunity to climb for FREE at Boundless Adventures during a special event on September 27.
- 5. Go fly a kite! The Time to Fly Kite Fest is September 28 at Lincoln Park. FREE

- 13. The Fall Into Fun Festival is October 12 at Veterans Memorial Park. There are costume contests for dogs and humans, and decorated windows in Downtown Kenosha. FREE

- 44. Go Fish! For FREE! No fishing licenses are needed January 18-19 in Wisconsin during Free Fishing Weekend.
- 45. Take a brisk walk along the lakefront. FREE
- 46. You can rent snowshoes to use at Bristol Woods Park from the park's Pringle Nature Center during designated hours. There are more than four miles of trails. \$5 rental for general public
- 47. Check out the Snow Daze Festival in Downtown Kenosha on January 25. There will be dozens of ice sculptures to enjoy! FREE
- 48. Enjoy the cross-country ski trails at Brighton Dale Park, Fox River Park, and Petrifying Springs Park. You can also snowshoe! FREE
- 49. Silver Lake Park has more than 2.5 miles of groomed cross-country trails and over 10 miles of single track trails. Also enjoy mountain bike trails year-round. FREE

- 70. Visit ArtWorks and The Pencillarium in the Union Park Arts District. One building houses an art gallery, a custom framing service, and a pencil seller. FREE to browse
- 71. Stop by Brat Stop's Cheese Mart for cheese curds and more Wisconsin treats. Prices vary
- 72. Carthage Fine Arts invites the public to a variety of art exhibits throughout the school year in the H. F. Johnson Gallery of Art on the Carthage College campus. FREE
- 73. A gift shop and art gallery in one, view the works of award-winning local artists at Pollard Gallery & Gifts. FREE to browse
- 74. Bring the kids to the Resource Center inside the Civil War Museum. There's a kid size cabin made out of giant Lincoln Logs and many more fun activities. FREE

- 80. Experience a "sculpture wonderland"! The Sculpture Walk HarborPark is a biennial outdoor art exhibit that runs along the harbor and features 10 NEW inspiring works of art. FREE
- 81. Visit the sculpture that commemorates the second stop on the Winter Dance Party Tour (Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, The Big Bopper, and Dion and the Belmonts). The concert took place in Kenosha on January 24, 1959. FREE
- 82. Ride an authentic Electric Streetcar to restaurants, shops, museums, historic districts, and more in Downtown Kenosha. \$1 & under
- 83. Walk, bike, or drive through Kenosha's four historic districts. Explore and appreciate the architecture and history of the buildings. FREE
- 84. Get your picture taken with the Greetings From Kenosha mural by artist Kelly Witte in Downtown Kenosha. FREE
- 85. In the Library Park Historic District, view a plaque that notes the birthplace of acclaimed actor, writer, director, and producer Orson Welles. FREE
- 86. Visiting Wisconsin for the first time? Take a picture with the "Welcome to Wisconsin" sign at our Wisconsin Welcome Center Kenosha. FREE

- 95. On Saturdays, shop at Kenosha Public Market. It's outdoors near Veterans Memorial Park through October, then inside the Kemper Center Simmons Auditorium. FREE to browse
- 96. Cheer on the Firebirds! Carthage College is a NCAA Division III program. Sports include football, cross country, basketball, volleyball, wrestling, soccer, and more. Ticket prices vary; throughout the 2024-25 school year, all Kenosha County and Racine County residents can attend sporting events for FREE
- 97. Enjoy Third Thursdays in Downtown Kenosha! On the Third Thursday of each month, take advantage of special activities, deals, and more at participating businesses in Downtown Kenosha. Offers vary
- 98. Meet the makers at the Kenosha Art Market in the Union Park Arts District on October 20. FREE to browse
- 99. October is the last month of the year to climb the 1866 Southport Lighthouse tower for an amazing view (must be 8 or older)! The seasonal attraction re-opens in May. \$10 & under
- 100. Wilmot Flea Market happens at the Kenosha County Fairgrounds on Sundays through October 13. \$2 & under admission
- 101. Watch for this annual sign that winter is coming to an end: Big Star Drive-In re-opens around March 1. Prices vary
