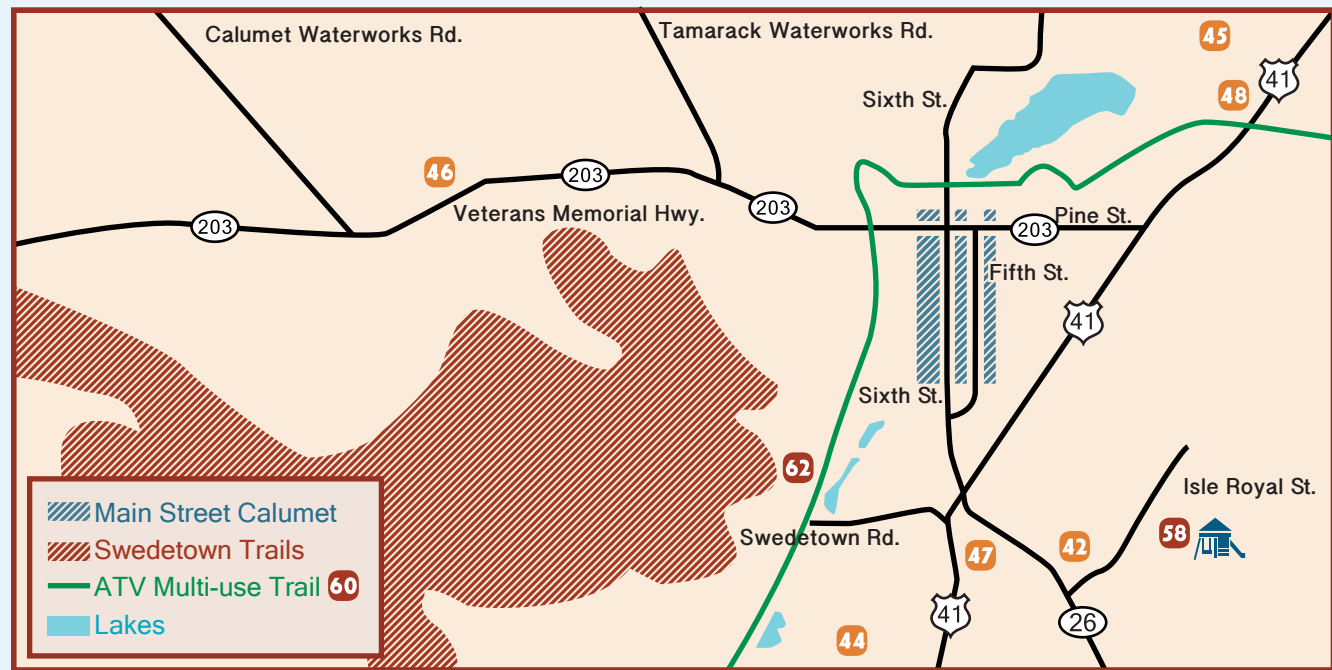
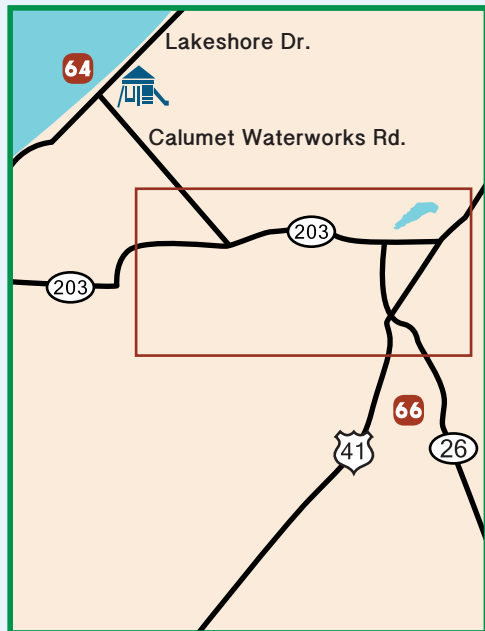

Swedetown Trails 62

Swedetown Recreation Area hosts 1900 acres of rolling, primarily wooded land set aside for public use by Calumet Township. It offers outstanding year-round trails for all ages and abilities. In summer and fall seasons the trail system features more than 25 miles of purpose-built single track mountain bike trails. This trail system is also enjoyed for nature hikes, dog walking and trail running. For winter recreation there are 30K of groomed ski trails, back country loop trails, and three marked snowshoe trails. The four season Swedetown Chalet provides a welcoming starting point for trail adventures.



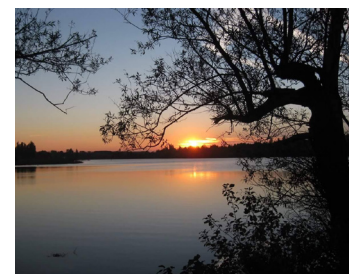

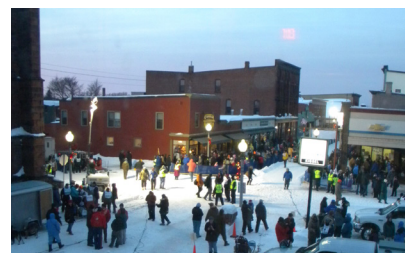
Daniell Park & Summer Music Series 59

Daniell Park, located on the corner of Pewabic and Third Streets, was donated to the Village of Laurium in 1937 Joshua Daniell for use as a public park. The WPA then constructed a concrete band shell atop a poor rock foundation. The park was used occasionally from the 1940's through 1970's. The park was renovated in 1974 by the Village Street Department. Many local and visiting musicians have enjoyed the pleasure of performing at this unique outdoor venue during the annual summer concert series which started in 1985, and continues each summer on Thursday evenings.



Calumet Lake Lions Park 63

Located on Calumet Lake, this park was created in partnership with the Calumet Lions Club. The park features picnic tables, a barrier-free walking trail and parking lot. It also features a horse shoe pit and large grassy areas for roaming or playing ball. There is an area to launch canoes or kayaks. The park is also home to a 18-hole disc golf course. COPPERDOG 150 February/March

Join us for the CopperDog 150 and CopperDog 80 sled dog races. Watch for these races the first weekend in March when Calumet will host 350+ dogs racing through Michigan's Keweenaw Peninsula. The CopperDog 150 covers 150 miles in three days, while the CopperDog 80 covers approximately 77 miles in two days.

GREAT BEAR CHASE SKI MARATHON March

The Great Bear Chase started in 1981 as a late-winter cross-country ski race showcasing Michigan's Keweenaw Peninsula. Skiers can choose from the 50k Skiathlon, our signature freestyle and classic 50k races, or freestyle or classic 25k or 10k distances. All events are chip timed, and compete on beautiful power tilted trails. Join us for a laid-back, skier-oriented weekend.



PASTY FEST Late June

Pasty Fest is an annual event held the Saturday before the 4th of July. Celebrate the Cornish food staple, the pasty; Yoopers have been enjoying these pocket meals for over 100 years. GREAT DEER CHASE MOUNTAIN BIKE RACE 3rd Saturday in August

Gipp Recreation Area & Ice Arena 58

The George Gipp Recreation Area hosts four baseball fields, a basketball court, a tennis court, sand volleyball court, horseshoe pits, bocce ball and children's playground are open from May through November. The George Gipp Arena (formerly known as the Bicentennial Arena) is open annually from November through March and hosts public skating, hockey, figure skating and private rentals.

Calumet Waterworks Park 64

On 16 acres on the shore of Lake Superior, this beautiful day park has two overhead pavilions, toilets, picnic areas, playground, volley and basketball courts. There is also a baseball area and a handicapped ramp to access the beach. Perfect for any medium size gathering, a pavilion can be reserved by calling the Calumet Township Office at 906-337-2410.

ATV/Multi-Use Trails 60

There are many miles of ATV trails that cross the Keweenaw Peninsula and many of them intersect in Calumet and Laurium. A lot of these trails were old railroad beds or mining roads. While trail conditions vary with season they are generally friendly to hiking, biking and ATV use in the summer and snowmobiling in the winter. Many trails are groomed for snowmobiling in the winter season. The Keweenaw ATV Club provides a detailed map of this trail system. For more information, visit their website at kweenawatvclub.com.



Calumet Colosseum & Guts Frisbee Hall of Fame 55

Built in 1913, the Calumet Colosseum is a single-sheet ice arena with four large locker rooms. A concession stand is operated during both practice and game times. This rink serves as home ice for Calumet Copper Kings High School Hockey and the Calumet Wolverines, our local Great Lakes Hockey League Men's Team. The second floor houses the International GUTS Frisbee Hall of Fame.

Calumet Historic District

The Calumet (Red Jacket) Downtown Historic District located between Fifth and Sixth Streets, from Scott Street to Pine Street. The Historic District is completely contained in the Calumet Historic District, a National Historic Landmark District, and Keweenaw National Historical Park. It was designated a Michigan State Historic Site in 1973 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974.

Keweenaw National Historical Park

Keweenaw NHP was established to preserve and interpret the story of the region's copper mining industry. U.S. Congress legislated that the National Park Service and the park's advisory commission partner with sites owned and operated by a variety of organizations. Formal partners include the Keweenaw Heritage Sites (see legend on other side). Keweenaw NHP operates a free visitor center/museum and offers themed seasonal tours.
