WATERFALL WATCH

The best time for waterfall touring is typically mid-March through early June. The winter snowfall rapidly melts, recharging streams and waterways which feed the falls.

47.3899, -87.8305 🚯 🖸

- From Copper Harbor, turn south at the Copper Harbor Visitor Center onto Manganese Rd. and go approximately 2 miles. Note: These are unpaved two-track roads. Expect rough conditions.
- Turn left onto Clark Mine Rd. and go approximately 2 miles.
- Clark Mine Rd. turns slightly right and becomes Burma Rd. Keep going for another 3.6 miles.
- Turn right on Mandan Rd. and go about 1 mile.
- Turn left following signs to Hoar Lake/Fish Cove. Road ends in a rustic parking lot.
- Follow foot path to Lake Superior shoreline.
- Lower Falls can be accessed from Fish Cove via a challenging one-mile hike west along the shoreline.
- · Hike north along river 0.5 miles to reach Upper Falls.

SILVER RIVER FALLS

47.4628, -88.0724 🔳 🙄 🔛

- 4.5 miles east of Eagle Harbor along State Hwy. M-26.
- · A rustic parking area is located on the south side of the bridge spanning Silver River.
- A foot path to the falls is located on the north side of M-26.

- Three miles northeast of Eagle River on State Hwy. M-26.
- 40-foot drop.

EAGLE RIVER LOWER FALLS 6 47.4123, -88.2964 🔳 🙄 😓

- At the bridge on State Hwy. M-26 in Eagle River.
- 60-foot drop.

EAGLE RIVER UPPER FALLS 47.4000, -88.2887 🔳 🙄 📋

- From US Hwy. 41 in Phoenix, take M-26 about 0.8 miles.
- Small roadside parking area on right.

CONGLOMERATE FALLS

47.3298, -88.4339 🔳 🙄 📋

- North of Calumet, turn left on Five Mile Point Rd. in Ahmeek.
- Drive 2.6 miles and turn left on South Farmer's Block Rd.
- Go straight one mile, then continue onto the two-track wooded road where the paved road makes a 90-degree right turn.
- Drive 0.4 miles to parking area near falls. Easement on private property-please drive slowly, stay on easement.

10 REDRIDGE DAM

47.1496, -88.76587 🖸 🙄 📋

- From State Hwy. M-26 in Houghton, take Houghton Canal Rd. approximately 4.8 miles to Redridge.
- Drive west 5.8 miles to the dam on the left.

WYANDOTTE FALLS 11

46.8905, -88.8775 M 🙁 📋

- Drive 1.5 miles southwest of Twin Lakes State Park on State Hwy. M-26.
- Turn west onto Poyhonen Rd. to a parking area 0.8 miles on left.
- 250-yard walk along a rustic trail.

CANYON FALLS

46.6277, -88.4705 🔳 🔁 📋

- · From Houghton, drive south on US Hwy. 41 approximately 42 miles.
- Canyon Falls Roadside Park (MDOT Parking) will be to the left. A short hike to the falls.
- Called the "Grand Canyon" of the UP. 30-foot drop.
