


Breathtaking Snoqualmie Falls


Woodinville Wine Country

Juanita Beach Park offers guests 1,000 lineal feet of waterfront with a dock that juts out over the water for even better views. You'll likely spy adorable baby ducklings along the way, or maybe a great blue heron poised along Juanita Creek, quietly waiting for the perfect opportunity to snare a snack.
