▶ History of Lake Norman

Lake Norman was created in 1963 by Duke Energy (formerly Duke Power Company) and is named after former Duke Power President Norman Cocke. The lake serves the area in many ways, including flood control, electricity, water, waterfowl preservation, and by providing a terrific source of recreation. Duke Energy has three power plants on Lake Norman: Cowans Ford Hydroelectric Station, Marshall Steam Plant, and McGuire Nuclear Station.
