- Home to the America's largest sea cave, the Sea Lion Caves are located just north of Florence on the All-American Road Hwy 101.
- The Cascades Raptor Center has over 60 birds of prey that call it home. See hawks, eagles, owls & falcons up close in South Eugene.
- 20 historic covered bridges decorate the Eugene, Cascades & Coast region, the greatest number of any county west of the Mississippi River. Tour seven in Cottage Grove with step-on guides in costume.
- The Oregon Truffle Festival, the first of its kind in North America held annually in January in Eugene.
- Over a dozen wineries boast award-winning Willamette Valley Pinot noir, Pinot gris and Chardonnay.
- Beer aficionados will appreciate the variety of beer from international selections to homebrews poured in the city's bars, bottleshops, breweries and taphouses on the Eugene Ale Trail.
- Three National Scenic Byways and three dedicated Scenic Bikeways wind through the Eugene, Cascades & Coast region.
- The Nike shoe was invented in Eugene. See the world's oldest shoe at the UO Museum of Natural & Cultural History across from Historic Hayward Field.
