The DeWitt Community stretches along the southern border of Clinton County and encompasses a variety of residential neighborhoods, sprawling agricultural lands, five school districts and multiple municipalities including the City of DeWitt's quaint downtown district nestled along the banks of the Looking Glass River.

DeWitt is ideally located 10 miles north of the State Capitol Building in Lansing, 10 miles northwest of the Michigan State University campus, 45 minutes east of Grand Rapids and 90 minutes west of Detroit.

Commuting is not an issue, as DeWitt is located at the junction of two major highways providing ease of travel throughout the state and beyond. US 127 extends north to the Mackinaw Straits and Michigan's Upper Peninsula as well as south through Ohio. The I-69 corridor provides a clear path across the state from Indiana to Port Huron and entry into Canada. Both highways connect with I-96, the major travel route from Detroit to Grand Rapids and on to Lake Michigan.

The Capital Region International Airport is located within 10 minutes of most neighborhoods in DeWitt and provides both national and international passenger travel, freight transport, and a separate terminal for private aircraft.

We are extremely proud of our community and committed to creating a strong sense of place for both the residential and business communities today and into the future.

This publication has been designed to provide an introduction to our community; we hope you will join us by making DeWitt your home and place of business.



Flistory of the DEWITT COMMUNITY

In the late 1700's, Michigan was inhabited by various Native American tribes. The wilderness terrain, comprised mostly of dense forests and waterways, provided a perfect habitat for wildlife; however, proved challenging for settlers.

For decades, perhaps centuries, the Native Americans located in the Saginaw Valley would migrate west along the rivers in search of food and shelter. As the seasons changed so did their needs and tribes began seeking better shelter by moving further into the densely wooded areas along the Looking Glass River during the winter months. One of the most common areas created from this movement was the Indian Village of Wabwahaseesee, later referred to by the white settlers as "Indian Green." It was this place of bountiful fish, game, and dense forests that later developed into what is known today as the City of DeWitt.

As surveyors explored the trails set forth by the migrating tribes, lands were acquired by the federal government with many acres sold or awarded to well-connected and affluent patrons with the hope settlements would be developed, which in turn would encourage people to migrate from the densely populated areas of the east.

A number of small villages were developed along the north and south banks of the Looking Glass River in DeWitt Township; however, it was not until 1833 when Captain Scott and his family migrated from Ann Arbor to the site of the present day City of DeWitt, did the community really start to grow.

Capt. Scott built his home along the banks of the Looking Glass River and under his influence a rapid influx of settlers began. He constructed a number of buildings including a hotel to accommodate the new arrivals. "Scotts Place" was known far and wide in the 1830's and 40's as a great gathering place.

The Village of DeWitt became the center of government, culture, commerce, travel and education for all Clinton County and served as the county seat from 1839-1857.

As a bustling center of commerce and government, DeWitt supported more than five major hotels including the "Clinton House," which was once the finest hotel between Detroit and Grand Rapids and served as the temporary courthouse for Clinton County.

Viable means of transportation, or the lack thereof, played an important role in the development of communities across the state.




Waterways and makeshift roads were the only means of travel until roadways could be built to facilitate the movement of wagons. The 1840's saw the construction of the first railroads in the Detroit Area then the Detroit and Pontiac Railroad Company completed a line of track from Detroit to Pontiac in 1843. They proceeded to extend the line west through Shiawassee and Clinton Counties with the last stop being located in the Village of St. Johns. This station provided state legislators greater flexibility as they could now travel via stagecoach from Lansing to St. Johns and then proceed by rail to other destinations.

While the railroad station proved to be of tremendous benefit to Clinton County and the Village of St. Johns, not so for DeWitt. In 1857 the County Seat was moved from DeWitt to St. Johns along with the migration of many prominent residents and businesses. This migration caused a real period of stagnation in DeWitt. It is believed the reason DeWitt survived during these years was due to the stability and prosperity of area farms.

The 20th Century brought a new beginning to DeWitt. The creation of the Lansing and Suburban Electric Railway which traveled from Lansing (through DeWitt) to St. Johns once again brought much activity to DeWitt including the retirement and migration of many "well-to-do farmers" and young families. Families were once again establishing homes in the area as the new interurban railway offered a viable means of transportation to jobs in Lansing.

DeWitt continued to prosper and suffered only minor effects from the Great Depression as Woodruff Bro's Bank survived intact and the Rosevale Packing Company kept a large percentage of the area's residents and farmers employed. However, a fire on October 21, 1930 proved most disastrous to the community. The fire leveled three of the four corners of the main intersection of the business district destroying eight buildings including the historic "Clinton House." Fortunately, this did not hamper the increase of residential development. By the mid 1930's, DeWitt was being described as a "pleasant affluent community."



The Community TODAY

The pride, commitment, and determination of the residents to rebuild and expand over the decades have greatly contributed to the current prosperity of the DeWitt Community today. The tremendous growth over the last 25 years has been built on a solid foundation of excellent schools, quality of life, reasonable taxes and proximity to the Greater Lansing Region.

What was once a small, fruitful Village, is now a prospering community of more than 20,000 people. Even though the community has grown substantially over the decades, residents continue to enjoy the amenities of small town living such as a quaint downtown district, vast agricultural lands, beautiful parks, multiple commercial districts, recreational areas, strong school districts and a variety of safe and walkable, family-friendly neighborhoods.

Due to DeWitt's centralized location in the mid-Michigan region, local residents are able to participate in, and enjoy, a number of exciting activities offered by organizations in DeWitt and neighboring communities. Events such as county fairs, art & music festivals, Big Ten sporting events, Broadway performances, along with an abundance of recreational areas





including Sleepy Hollow State Park, Motz County Park, and numerous inland lakes and rivers throughout the state.

Commercial DISTRICT

The DeWitt Community encompasses thousands of acres of rich farm land, community parks, and family- friendly neighborhoods all of which are supported by a variety of small businesses and larger commercial areas throughout DeWitt and nearby communities.

Downtown DeWitt offers a quaint small town business district focused on the entrepreneur. Showcased by the Looking Glass River and beautiful parks; you will find, familyowned restaurants, pharmacy and a variety of service related businesses along with the Chamber of Commerce.

Schavey Road Plaza is a spacious outdoor shopping plaza nestled among the residential neighborhoods west of downtown. Here you will find a variety of small restaurants, numerous medical services, specialty businesses, the YMCA and the DeWitt District Library.

Business 27 Corridor stretches from the Lansing/DeWitt Township Border at Sheridan Road north to St Johns. The six-mile corridor running through DeWitt, offers a wide variety of commercial enterprises from franchised restaurants, family owned businesses, service stations, financial institutions, retail shopping including Meijer, hotels, banquet center and office buildings housing a variety of businesses and medical facilities.

Eastwood Town Center is an upscale outdoor mall nine miles southeast of downtown DeWitt. Eastwood offers 55 shops, a variety of restaurants, NCG's 18 screen movie theater, high end apartment building, and a variety of hotels.

Frandor Shopping Center is a large outdoor mall located just south of Eastwood between Lansing and East Lansing. This unique area offers everything from workout facilities to retail shops, along with restaurants, financial institutions, and large retail stores.

Lansing Mall Area is located 12 miles southwest of DeWitt and offers numerous retail possibilities within a multi- block area. This area offers national retail chain stores and restaurants, indoor mall, new movie theater, and financial institutions.

Meridian Mall Area is located 15 miles to the southeast of DeWitt. This commercial area spans several hundred acres with the Meridian Mall being the focal point. This area offers a wide variety of retail stores from high-end to discount, restaurants and specialty shops of all types.



Local GOVERNMENT

The DeWitt Community is governed by four separate municipalities with the largest portion governed by the City of DeWitt and the Charter Township of DeWitt.

The City of DeWitt is located in the center of the area and covers approximately 2.7 square miles with a 2010 reported population of 4,507. City Hall is located at 414 E. Main Street just a few blocks east of downtown. The City is a Mayor/ Council form of government. The City Council meetings are held at 7:00 pm the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at City Hall. Visit the City's website for exact meeting dates and times. www.DeWittmi.org

DeWitt Charter Township stretches along the southern border of Clinton County from Airport Road east to Chandler Road; Sheridan Road north to Cutler Road. The Township governs an area of approximately 28 square miles with a 2010 reported population of 14,321. It is governed by an elected Board of Trustees including a Supervisor, Clerk, and Treasurer. The Board of Trustees meets the second and fourth Monday of each month at 7 pm at the DeWitt Township Hall located at 1401 W. Herbison Rd. DeWitt Township and the City of DeWitt work in cooperation with each other to build one of the most attractive communities in Mid-Michigan. While each has its own governing structure they have been leaders in regional cooperation, creating and combining such operations such as the DeWitt Area Recreation Authority (DARA), DeWitt District Library, and Southern Clinton County Municipal Utilities Authority (SCCMUA).

The western and northern parts of the DeWitt community are governed by the townships of Watertown, Riley, and Olive.

Watertown Charter Township stretches along the southern border of Clinton County just west of DeWitt Township, while Riley and Olive Townships border to the north. All three have separate administrative offices, elected officials, and local ordinances.

Police, Fire and Emergency MEDICAL SERVICES

The success and stability of a community is truly dependent on the support of the local police and fire departments. The DeWitt Community is very fortunate to have the best!

The **City of DeWitt** operates a 24-hour Police Department with a staff of six full-time officers which includes a Chief, a Lieutenant and six part-time officers and an Administrative Assistant.

The Department is proud to be a community oriented agency, still performing many of the services long since abandoned by larger, busier departments. Like many small communities near metropolitan hubs, the Department's first line of defense against the encroachment of criminal activity is an ongoing and aggressive program of preventative patrol, 24 hours a day.

The **DeWitt Charter Township Police Department** provides services to residents and businesses on a full-time basis. The Department is dedicated to providing excellent law enforcement and public service in an effort to maintain a high quality of life throughout the DeWitt Community.

The Department is comprised of a Chief, a Lieutenant, two Sergeants, a Detective, eleven Patrol Officers (including one K-9 team) and administrative staff.

The DeWitt Community enjoys the luxury of multiple fire departments with well-trained and committed fire and emergency personnel.

The **DeWitt Area Emergency Services**

Authority is responsible for delivering fire protection and emergency medical services for a 77 square mile area encompassing the City of DeWitt, Olive and Riley Townships. The Authority has three Stations and is strictly a volunteer/paid on call department consisting of 23 firefighters.

The **DeWitt Township Fire Department**

is a public safety branch of DeWitt Charter Township with two stations. Educational OPPORTUNITIES

The DeWitt Area has the unique opportunity of being serviced by five public school districts, major universities, two year colleges, trade schools and graduate schools. The greatest portion of the area is serviced by the DeWitt Public School District which encompasses the entire northwest corner of DeWitt Township, the City of DeWitt and portions of the central and western areas of DeWitt Township along with a portion of Watertown Township. The Lansing School District services the southern portion of the area, Bath the northeast corner, and East Lansing covers a small portion of the southeast corner of DeWitt Township. The St. Johns School District services the areas north of DeWitt Township and portions of northern part of Watertown Township.

DeWitt Public Schools

DeWitt Public Schools are preparing students today for the challenges and opportunities of a global society. By joining together with our community and families, we provide an environment of excellence that results in achievement for all students.



Programming at DeWitt Public Schools includes:

We begin with offering preschool for children ages three to five using the research-based High/Scope early childhood curriculum. Our kindergarten through twelfth grade program focuses on aligning curriculum and instruction to the Common Core State Standards and the Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations. Students are taught by highly qualified and skilled staff at all levels, with an emphasis at the elementary level on the core content areas of mathematics, language arts, science, and social studies. In addition to core academics, students at the elementary level have classes and instruction in technology, music, art, and physical education. Beginning in sixth grade, students receive focused instruction in either band or choir.

At the secondary level, grades seven through twelve, students learn in an environment where they are encouraged to question, apply knowledge, and develop career skills in a block schedule. A variety of sports are offered for both boys and girls at the secondary level including football, basketball, cross country, wrestling, ice hockey, baseball, softball, volleyball, swimming, soccer, tennis, golf, track and competitive cheerleading.

In addition, the school district offers an alternative education program for high school students and a before and after school program (K.I.D.S.) for students at the elementary level.

Chinese Global Education Program

DeWitt Public Schools is planning to start a Global Chinese Education Program in 2016-17. This is an exciting program that will bring teachers of the Chinese language to DeWitt Schools and also bring 15-17 year-old Chinese students to the high school. Fireplaces and Wood Stoves

- Clean and Inspect your chimney or wood stove annually, using a certified chimney specialist
- Vent pipes should be three feet above the roof
- Make sure wood stoves and portable kerosene heaters have met building codes
- Burn only wood in fireplace or wood stove

Outdoor Fire Safety Tips

- Stack firewood at least 30 feet away from your home
- Regularly clean the leaves, pine needles and other debris off the roof of your home
- Make sure there are no tree branches hanging above the chimney, flues or vents
- Store flammable materials at least 30 feet from your home
- Use fire resistant plants and vegetation for landscaping
- Trees and brush should be thinned within 30 feet from your home
- Water sources need to be accessible to the fire department

Fire Safety for Children

- Children should wear fire-retardant clothing
- Children need to be taught about fire and fire safety
- Children should never play around electrical appliances or heaters
- Children should know the fire escape plan

Smoke Alarms

- Smoke alarms should be tested every month and replace batteries at least once a year
- Smoke detectors should be replaced every ten years

Fire Escape Plan

- Develop a fire escape plan and practice it with your family
- Have a designated meeting area away from the driveway, in the yard where all family members are to go

Kitchen

- Do not overload extension cords
- Look for the UL tag on appliances
- Check wiring on appliances routinely
- Replace worn, old, or damaged appliance cords
- Place portable electrical heaters at least 3 feet from curtains, furniture, etc.
- Children should never play around electrical appliances or heaters
- Keep a fire extinguisher handy
