PLAN AHEAD

Before you pack, check the forecast. You may need to pack a refillable water bottle, snacks, umbrella, insect repellent, non-toxic sunscreen, sunglasses and cap, and compass or map.

LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND

Preserve the past. Observe rocks, plants and artifacts.

RESPECT WILDLIFE

Watch wildlife from a distance and never feed or handle wild animals. Keep an eye out and leash on your pups at all times.

PACK IN, PACK OUT

Inspect your rest area for wrappers, trash or spilled food. Be sure to pack up all the litter you have. Strive to leave the site in better condition than when you arrived.

BE COURTEOUS & KIND

Respect other visitors and be trail-friendly — maybe even say 'hi' while passing by. Let the sounds of nature prevail - save the music for your car ride.

STAY ON THE TRAIL

Use existing trails and rest stops. Walk in the center of the trail.

Last but definitely not least, wherever you go, appreciate the scenery of the Genesee River Valley.








YOUR PERFECT **SUMMER AWAITS IN** LIVINGSTON COUNTY

Find your next fun-inthe-sun, summer vacay in the Genesee River Valley.

We have plenty of suggestions for what to do while you're here. In the pages ahead, you'll learn more about recreation options, from water adventures to hiking trails and delectable dining, whether you prefer to shop for your own ingredients at the farmer's market, search the county for the best icecream cone, or dine with drinks on a patio, Livingston County has it all. Plus, spectacular events that encapsulate the spirit of small-town fairs, plenty of delicious eateries, boutique shopping, and family activities.

So — what are you waiting for? Let's start planning your LivCo summer getaway now. The only thing you'll regret is not making the trip sooner.





River, opportunities for water **HOME TO** TWO FINGER recreation abound in Livingston LAKES AND County, no matter which town or THE GENESEE village you happen to be staying in. Boating, fishing, tubing, waterskiing, canoeing, paddleboarding, kayaking, swimming - it's all here waiting for you. Even if you don't quite want to get your hair wet, you can still enjoy the county's aquatic bounty, thanks to multiple scenic lakeside hikes and plenteous opportunities for waterfront dining. Each water destination around the region offers something different.

MUST-VISIT NATURAL WATER DESTINATIONS

CONESUS LAKE

Conesus Lake, also known as the jewel of Livingston County, is the westernmost Finger Lake and offers spectacular fishing and paddling, as well as nature trails and opportunities for wildlife watching and birding.

You might even find the beautifully mysterious turtle-like stones, or Conesus stones, as they are known around the world. These stones were formed in the ice age when glacial debris 10,000 feet thick created dams that built the Finger Lakes, and they've been found as far away as Siberia and Iceland.

HEMLOCK LAKE

Hemlock Lake is known as the most undeveloped of the Finger Lakes, if you're looking for seclusion and pristine nature, this is where to go.

In the 1970s, the last wild bald eagle in New York State was found nesting at the south end of Hemlock Lake. Since then, diligent work to restore bald eagles has resulted in over 300 nests - with dozens in the area. They are no longer endangered and are now a common sight. While visiting LivCo, check out the mural First Flight in downtown Livonia painted by Rochester native Justin Suarez. The mural depicts two eagles flying over Hemlock Lake in celebration of the ongoing conservation efforts.

GENESEE RIVER

The Genesee River travels between Pennsylvania and the Rochester Harbor, offering paddling and sightseeing opportunities aplenty in a peaceful setting. Wind down the Genesee River on a warm summer's day with a group of friends or family, just be sure to check river conditions prior to starting your trip, know your route, and paddle within your abilities.

1. EMBRACE THE THRILLS OF WHITEWATER RAFTING

If you're looking for an adrenalinepumping experience, book an excursion with Adventure Calls Outfitters. Take a whitewater rafting excursion through Letchworth State Park, "The Grand Canyon of the East", for five-plus miles of rapids and scenery. In addition to whitewater rafting, Adventure Calls also offers kayaking excursions (when the water's too low for rafting), and camping and fishing packages. Go ahead and toss a change of clothes into your trunk - you're gonna get wet.

BOAT ALONG THE WATERS OF THE FINGER LAKES

On a hot summer's day, there's nothing better than taking a boat out on the water. Mark's Leisure Time Marine rents a range of boats on Conesus Lake, from fishing boats to powerboats to pontoons, as well as non-motorized boats and fun extras like water skis. Tropical Creations Boat Rentals offers a range of motorized and non-motorized rentals. Don't want to actually drive the boat yourself? Tropical Creations also offers daily cruises, private charters, and audio tours. Other places for rentals include Conesus Lake Boat Rentals and Smith Boys Marina.



LEARN HOW TO FISH WITH THE EXPERTS

As one of the state's best fishing destinations, LivCo offers multiple waterways for serious anglers to love. But, you don't need to be a pro to enjoy fishing the area's lakes, thanks to Upstate Anglers Guide Service. The company offers daily fishing charters throughout the region, four to six hours for each experience, and they'll provide all the equipment you need for a memorable time.



MAKE A SPLASH IN STATE PARKS

Longing for some relaxation in the heart of nature? If you're looking to swim the day away, you can find a spot for a dip at **Harvey Pool** in **Letchworth State Park**. Open late June through Labor Day, the Olympic-sized pool, closest to the Mount Morris park entrance, is open to the public.

Covering hundreds of acres of breathtaking natural land, **Stony Brook State Park** is known for its gorges and waterfalls which flow into a spring-fed natural pool that keeps cool throughout the summer. Not only is the water cool and refreshing, but it's incredibly clear and vibrant with turquoise hues that make this spot a true hidden gem. Stony Brook is also filled with campsites, cabins, picnic tables, restrooms, hiking trails, and a playground for everyone to enjoy.

5. PADDLE THROUGH NATURE

Luckily, there are several outfitters throughout LivCo that can hook you up with whatever you need to paddle along: kayaks, canoes, paddleboards, and more. Plus, just as you'll find numerous rental options, you'll find just as many potential paddling experiences.



GALENE

LAKEVILLE, NEW YORK

What's a summer trip or a lakeside getaway without a little fresh seafood? That's what Galene offers, in the New American restaurant's coastal-inspired setting. Treat your tastebuds at the cold bar, or tap into the latest foodie trends when you peruse the tinned fish menu. If you and your crew of friends are in town on a Sunday, don't miss the Sunday brunch. No time to stick around? From Memorial Day to Labor Day, you can place your order at the restaurant's outdoor patio takeaway window.

CORSA ON THE LINKS

GENESEO, NEW YORK

In Geneseo, at the Livingston Country Club, Corsa on the Links offers fresh, seasonal, elevated dining on the outdoor patio and bar. There's no need for a prior golf game to enjoy this picturesque setting. Just pull up a chair, take in the views, and dine on delicious menu options like the chicken French, sirloin steak, or slow-roasted prime rib.

EMBER WOODFIRE GRILL

O LIVONIA, NEW YORK

The summer patio at Ember Woodfire Grill welcomes you with live entertainment and a menu filled with bites designed for sharing. Pass out the plates and divvy up servings of inventive options like sweet potato egg rolls and black garlic dill pickle pizza. Save room for dessert, you won't want to miss options like the oatmeal cake with chocolate peanut butter frosting, or the coconut cake made with chocolate ganache and salted almonds. The libations menu is equally fun, with classic cocktails taking center stage.

WHISTLING FARMER PUB

O NUNDA, NEW YORK

After a game of golf at Woodlynn Hills Golf Course, stick around for an evening of farm-to-table cuisine at the Whistling Farmer Pub. Of course, there's no need to be a golfing group to enjoy dinner here. Make the journey to this modern American eatery for gastropub favorites that take full advantage of LivCo's robust agricultural scene.

THE BRONZE

GENESEO, NEW YORK

The Bronze is an eclectic and stylish eatery serving up local bites and sips from some of the region's most passionate farmers, makers, brewers, and distillers. Every bite you take is as fresh as can be, with some of the ingredients merely hours old. The dinner menu changes seasonally, but you can expect shareables like charcuterie boards and flatbreads, alongside entrées such as pasta, steak, and seafood. Be sure to make a reservation to guarantee your spot.

CAFFE TAZZA

O DANSVILLE, NEW YORK

In downtown Dansville, Caffe Tazza combines so many of our favorite things: wine, wood-fired pizza, and tapas, just to name a few. Grab a seat on the patio and tuck into the seasonal menu that includes tempting options like Margherita, Mediterranean, and white truffle pizzas, traditional pasta dishes alongside unexpected international fare, like shrimp tacos and bangers and mash.

YARD OF ALE

PIFFARD, NEW YORK

In Piffard, the Yard of Ale is a delightful historic restaurant that blends a casual environment with fine dining, serving up menu items including steak, chops, fresh seafood, and the crowd-favorite slowroasted prime rib. You won't want to miss dessert. The homemade ice cream comes in daily flavors and is the perfect way to end a summer meal in LivCo.

A ROUND OF GOLF


Hitting the links is one of the best ways to soak in the incredible Genesee River Valley views.

If you're looking to dine and play, a round of golf is a no-brainer at Brae Burn Golf Course in Dansville, Livingston Country Club in Geneseo, or Woodlynn Hills Golf Course in Nunda. Looking for other options for your day on the links? Check out Caledonia Country Club in Caledonia, Conesus Golf Club in Conesus, FarView Golf Course in Avon, Old Hickory Golf Course in Livonia, or Lima Golf & Country Club in Lima. Weather not cooperating? Try the indoor golf simulator at HD Sports Zone in Dansville!

A ROUND OF DRINKS

Grab some drinks or a few at one of the stops on the LivCo Libation
Loop. Livingston County is home to tons of renowned craft beverage makers, sourcing local ingredients and offering the perfect opportunity to stop, sip and savor time with friends and family.

Favorite options near Conesus Lake include OSB Ciderworks in Lakeville, No BS Brew Company in Livonia, Deer Run Winery in Geneseo, and little Lake Brewing in Lakeville. If you're closer to Hemlock Lake, try O-Neh-Da Vineyards. Other spots include Mortalis Brewing Company in Avon, Rising Storm Brewing Company in Avon, Dublin Corners Farm Brewery in Linwood, Strange Design Public House in Geneseo, Battle Street Brewery in Dansville, and Livingston County's only distillery, Woodlawn Distilling in Linwood.


If you visit Livingston County just in time to catch one of the county's many summer festivals, you're in for a treat. Can't-miss summer events draw locals and travelers alike, for old-fashioned fair fun, including carnival rides and scrumptious fair food, and celebrations of the region's history and agriculture.

And don't miss the largest festival in LivCo, the Hemlock "Little World's" Fair, a premier event of the summer. Plus, you'll have tons of other events during the rest of the season. Here's what you can expect.



Happening this year from July 16th to 20th at the Hemlock Fairgrounds, spend sweet summertime at the largest fair in Livingston County. Since 1857, the week-long Hemlock Fair has been a top favorite event throughout LivCo, eagerly awaited year after year. While it does have your classic midway rides and grandstand events, fair food and vendors, it also touts a few standout features that make the Hemlock Fair unlike any other county fair you might've attended in years past.

One of these is, of course, harness racing. The Hemlock Fair can trace its origins back to horse racing, when, in the 1800s, races would bring people from around the county. As the racing events grew, so did the entertainment, until the races expanded into a full-blown fair. This year, the Hemlock Fair will celebrate its 120th year of harness horse racing and, just as it has since 1903, the fair will host the two and three-year old Sire Stakes Races on opening day.





The Hemlock Fair is also home to its own **Heritage** Museum. Here, you can learn more about the fair's historic connections with horse racing, the region's agricultural history, and more. Plus, be sure to enjoy the nightly bands in the Festival Building, 4-H shows highlighting a variety of farm animals, wood carving demos, and monster truck rides. In short, there's something for everyone at the Hemlock Fair.

GRANDSTAND EVENTS

Don't miss an action-packed schedule of daily events at the grandstand. Cheer on everything from the hard-hitting Demolition Derby to the Monster Truck show on Wednesday night followed by the Truck & Traitor Pull happening Friday night.

AGRICULTURAL EXHIBITS, SHOWS & COMPETITIONS

Your visit to the Hemlock Fair isn't complete without enjoying the agricultural roots of the region. Explore animal shows, the 4-H Livestock Auction, science projects by local high school students, photography displays, "Produced in New York" Food Demonstrations, and much more!

MIDWAY ATTRACTIONS

Glittering lights shine brightly on the midway – beckoning fairgoers of all ages to enjoy the rides at the Hemlock Fair. You can see every part of the fairgrounds from atop the Ferris wheel, hop on almost 20 rides, play numerous games along the way, and enjoy bites from local food vendors.



LOOKING FOR **MORE EVENTS** AND FESTIVALS THIS SUMMER?

Steeped in tradition, annual festivals and events in LivCo are a favorite way for locals and visitors to come together to celebrate. From agricultural celebrations to parades full of festivity, there's always something to celebrate! GLORY DAY

O MT MORRIS, NEW YORK

Each year Mount Morris celebrates its most notable past resident, creator of The Pledge of Allegiance, Francis Bellamy, with Glory Day. The patriotic occasion combines a parade, music, vendors, food, and fireworks. Follow the Glory Day Mount Morris Facebook page for updates on the 2024 event.



SUMMER FESTIVAL

GENESEO, NEW YORK

Summer Festival brings tons of family fun to Geneseo for two days. The event kicks off Friday with a performance by the Rochester Metropolitan Jazz Orchestra, and Saturday gets underway with the Teddy Bear Parade down Main Street, followed by bouncy castles, cornhole competitions, a petting zoo, and a free concert in the Geneseo Village Park. New this year, a Makers Fair and Farmer's Market with select artisan vendors will be held on Center and Main Streets both days.



LIMA CROSSROADS FESTIVAL

LIMA, NEW YORK

The Lima Crossroads Festival combines food, family fun, and live music, including lots of blues and jazz music. Pack your running shoes and come hungry, the festival also includes a 5k and barbecue cook-off. And don't miss the Annual Bed Races. a yearly tradition of the festival.



INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

O MUMFORD, NEW YORK

For patriotic fun, spend the Fourth of July at the Genesee Country Village & Museum. The big event features all your holiday favorite foods, patriotic tunes from the bandstand, a parade, a pie-eating contest, hands-on games, the recitation of the Declaration of Independence, and historic displays.



NATIONAL WARPLANE **MUSEUM AIRSHOW**

GENESEO, NEW YORK

You can enjoy two big LivCo events in one weekend if you visit Geneseo! On the Saturday and Sunday of that weekend, the National Warplane Museum hosts the Geneseo Airshow also known as "The Greatest Show on Turf", with aerobatic demonstrations, tours of the museum, a paratrooper jump, and ground battle reenactment.



AVON CORN FESTIVAL

O AVON, NEW YORK

Lastly, to wrap up the summer, the Avon Rotary Corn Festival celebrates all things corn, as one of the region's major crops. Beyond lots of food (with, yes, lots of corn), there's also a corneating contest, live music across three stages, a beer garden, and more than a hundred arts and craft vendors.





















STEP INTO HISTORY AT THE **GENESEE COUNTRY VILLAGE** & MUSEUM

Did you know that the Genesee Country Village & Museum is the largest living history museum in the state? Here, you and your crew can get up close and personal with the area's history thanks to costumed interpreters working among nearly 70 historic buildings.

The Museum offers opportunities to experience more than 20,000 artifacts, paintings, drawings, and sculptures, visit their working farm and Nature Center with five miles of trails, and explore the gorgeous landscape that first brought settlers to the region. Enjoy a full day with dining options including the Depot Restaurant, Freight House Pub, and Flint Hill Store.





WATCH AMERICA'S FAVORITE PASTIME

During the summer, America's favorite pastime comes to LivCo as the Dansville Gliders wooden bat league at Babcock Park in Dansville. Catch a game during their season running from June through August.

SPEND THE DAY AT MINNEHAN'S FUN CENTER

It's easy to spend an entire day at Minnehan's Fun Center in Lakeville and never even realize where the time has gone. There's so much fun to be had. Mini golfing, go-karting, arcade games, batting cages, a soft play area for the smallest members of your crew - the list goes on and on. And when you're hungry, Minnehan's has your fam covered, with kidapproved bites like pizza, hot dogs, burgers, and ice cream.







CATCH A FLICK AT THE VINTAGE DRIVE-IN

Every family loves a movie night, but why not upgrade your movie experience with an old-fashioned trip to the drive-in? At the **East Avon Vintage Drive-In**, you'll get your pick from three screens, and double features showing seven nights a week. Grab your favorite movie snacks from the concessions stand and settle in.

5. SEARCH FOR FAIRIES IN DANSVILLE

Go on a whimsical walk as you follow **Fairy Doors of Dansville**. This is a fully accessible trail that features tiny folk art depicting fairy-size doors, all along the way. There are more than 30 doors to find in total, within the Dansville business district, plus a few extra lurking in **Pioneer Park**.

Use the free map available at dansvilleartworks.com to hunt down each and every door, then be sure to stop by **Dogwood Trading Company** or the **Dansville Public Library** for a surprise, as well as by the human-sized fairy sculpture for photo ops outside 178 Main Street.

6. EXPLORE A FIRST-OF-ITS-KIND NATURE TRAIL

Letchworth State Park is a mustvisit for any outdoorsy family. While visiting, everyone will appreciate one of the park's most unique experiences, the Autism Nature Trail. Designed for a range of abilities, the trail covers a onemile loop with several educational and experiential stations along the way.

CHEER ON THE DRIVERS AT THE LIMEROCK SPEEDWAY

Whether you're just a spectator or want to get in on the action, Limerock Speedway in Caledonia is LivCo's destination for dirt track racing. The track welcomes cars from anywhere to join, and, through the Tri-County Racing Club, aims to develop racing as a family pastime.

FLY HIGH IN A VINTAGE AIRPLANE

The National Warplane Museum restores,

preserves, and displays World War II and Korean War aircraft and hosts an Annual Airshow, with a jaw-dropping display of aerobatics. However, you can also take a ride in one of the museum's vintage aircraft almost any day during the summer. From May to October, just go to the museum's website and book a ride in the aircraft of your choice, for a vacation memory your kiddos will be talking about for a long, long time!



MEET THE FURRY RESIDENTS OF BACKYARD BARNYARD

Backyard Barnyard in Mount Morris is open on the weekends, June through October, and is a steal of a deal for families looking for budget-friendly activities. The kiddos can pet animals and then check out the other fun on the farm, including axe throwing, climbing walls, and - every kid's favorite - inflatables.


10. GET COMPETITIVE AT THE GENESEE VALLEY KART CLUB

The Genesee Valley Kart Club in Avon is a long-running asphalt track that hosts races and racing classes to take your karting experience to the next level. Classes are available for kids as young as five. Just want to watch the high-speed thrills? Entrance is free for spectators.



11. TAP YOUR TOES TO SOME LIVE TUNES

No matter where in LivCo you're exploring, no matter what your favorite music genres, you can likely find some live music to enjoy just about any day of the week. Spots around the county hosting family-friendly music in the summertime including little Lake Brewing, the Avon Park Theater, and the Geneseo Riviera Theater. Be sure to check out the Wadsworth Homestead Summer Concert Series, with outdoor concerts held every first and third Thursday throughout the summer, starting in May, or visit Vitale Park in Livonia, the Village of Leicester, or the Town of West Sparta for their weekly concerts in the park.

Don's wife, Robbin, supports business operations behind the scenes with administrative tasks and technology.

When Don wrapped up his time working at a local restaurant, one thing he knew for certain was that he no longer wanted to work for someone else. Family and friends often commented that he should move his hobbies out of his home kitchen and into his own space. After a few years the opportunity to have a space on Big Tree Road presented itself, Don reconsidered retirement and decided to open little Lake Brewing.

What has changed over the years at little Lake Brewing?

We formed the business in late Fall 2017 and spent months updating and remodeling the small space. We opened our doors on July 16, 2018, selling house-roasted coffee and artisan craft beverages. With a little sandwich board sign out by the road, word started to spread through friends and family. Quickly, the morning menu started to grow and Don honored customer requests to include cappuccinos, lattes, and specialty coffee beverages. We had people comment that it felt like hanging out with friends at home, one visitor even said it was like walking into a Hallmark movie set - exactly the welcoming atmosphere we were looking for!

Get to know Don & Robbin Carll Owners of little Lake Brewing

While the morning business was growing, we moved ahead with acquiring our NYS Restaurant/ Brewer's license. Don spent months building the brew room and was eventually granted a liquor license. This was a bittersweet moment! The approval came during Covid-19 restrictions. It was challenging to say the least. We handed food out the side window for takeout orders. The excitement of getting licensed was put on hold until the restrictions were lifted.

Today, we are finally able to operate as envisioned. We roast coffee, brew beer and seltzer, and serve food. Thankfully, we also have a fantastic staff. Many of them have been with us since 2018. In fact, this was the first job for some of the crew back when they got their working papers in high school! We're proud of our crew and appreciate each of them for their commitment and flexibility.



What's your favorite thing on your menu right now? Any go-to food pairings with your beer?

Don's favorite food and beer menu items right now are a white hot dog smothered with homemade meat hot sauce (a variation of Don's mother's recipe) paired with one of the hoppiest IPA's like A Lure Tropical Haze or Conefish Ale, which will be returning this year. Conefish was released for the Ales for ALS fundraiser in 2022. Don also loves the Grilled Mahi Mahi sandwich. Robbin is vegetarian and loves the vegetarian version of the sesame "tuna" wrap paired with the house-made cream soda.

It's up to the customers to find their favorite food-beer pairings! It's nice to hear what people like and share their ideas with others.

What's the best thing about being in Livingston County?





Founded in the early 1800s and the birthplace of Francis Bellamy, author of The Pledge of Allegiance, Mount Morris was a western New York transport and trade hub well into the 1900s. As was the case with so many American small towns, though, Mount Morris's

downtown started to decline - only to be brought back better than ever. In recent years, the newly revitalized and rejuvenated Mount Morris has attracted travelers from around the world with its local dining scene, boutique shopping, and easy access to Livingston County's abundant natural destinations. Here's how to experience it all, from the past to something brand new, during a Mount Morris day trip.

START WITH CLASSIC DINER FARE

Every good day trip starts with a good breakfast, and Brian's USA Diner is as classic as it gets. Expect diner-style favorites for breakfast, with homestyle flavors, daily specials, and service that's just as speedy as it is friendly. Whether you're craving an omelet, country ham and eggs, biscuits and gravy, or a stack of syrupy buttermilk pancakes, you'll find just what you need to fuel your Mount Morris trip itinerary.


SEE THE SIGHTS AT ONE OF THE **REGION'S MOST FAMOUS ATTRACTIONS**

Hands down, one of LivCo's most popular and beloved attractions is Letchworth State Park, with its picturesque waterfalls and gorges. Go for a hike and explore the more than 14,000 acres including 66 miles of trails. There's something for every skill level - and reaching the park's three main waterfalls is easy by car or foot. You can also explore the Humphrey Nature Center, to learn more about the park and its importance within the local ecosystem, as well as the firstof-its-kind Autism Nature Trail.

The **New Family, One Nation** mural by Shawn Dunwoody sits at the corner of Main and Chapel Street depicting historical figures, and commemorating Mount Morris's 225th birthday. Find Flowers of Letchworth by Louise Jones at 83 Main Street, depicting stunning, larger-than-life florals. An alleyway next to the mural has been dedicated as Livingston County's first Art Alleyway, featuring local artwork and seating.

Another recent addition is the Walk of Fame along Main Street, stretching from the Mills Mansion to Veterans Park, with nine plaques honoring historical local figures. And opposite Zeppo's Creekside Creamery, find the We Remember, We Honor mural by Shawn Dunwoody dedicated to frontline workers, plus Patriotic Angel Wings on the same wall. Go for a stroll and see them all!



Just a short drive from Syracuse, Rochester, and Buffalo, LivCo is close to big city amenities, but far enough removed from the region's larger hubs that you can avoid all the crowds and truly feel as if you're getting away.

Whether your idea of the perfect getaway means hiking among abundant nature or hitting the lake, or spending your time shopping at local boutiques and jumping between local restaurants, breweries, and wineries, LivCo has it all. But how do you go about actually seeing and experiencing it all? If it's your first time visiting, here's how to spend a summer weekend sampling some of the best LivCo has to offer.



DAY ONE

CHECK INTO AN HISTORIC STAY

LivCo boasts many historic bed and breakfasts and inns. For a stay that mixes modern creature comforts with historic touches, try Oak Valley Inn in Geneseo. The property, built in 1868, was originally a poor house on 118 acres, but now offers just over a dozen guestrooms, each with high ceilings, tall windows, private baths, and extra amenities like fireplaces and jetted tubs in the suite rooms.

HEAD DOWNTOWN TO SHOP

The historic village of Geneseo offers local charm in spades. Explore Main Street and make your way to some of the local shopping spots, such as Honeygirl Gourmet, for local food and handmade gifts, FLX Revival, for curated vintage clothing, the Not Dot Shop, for a wide range of gifts, homewares, and furniture, Florence's Perpetual Estate Sale, for antiques and vintage items, and Touch of Grayce, for ethically sourced gifts.




CHANNEL YOUR PLAYFUL SIDE AT LUNCH


ENJOY LIVE MUSIC

Driving to the Genesee River Valley is the preferred transportation method for most visitors to Livingston County. Our roads are calm, and scenic vistas draw you from one destination to the next. On the Western Edge of the Finger Lakes Region, Livingston County is only a short drive from three major upstate New York cities. Rochester is less than 30 minutes north of Geneseo (the seat of Livingston County), Buffalo is about 70 minutes west, and Syracuse is about 90 minutes to the east. Rochester, Syracuse, and Buffalo each have an airport, bus, and train station.
