Flowing north about 160 miles into Lake Ontario, the Genesee is the only river that completely crosses New York State. Along the way, it has carved stunning gorges nearly 600 feet deep, formed hidden valleys, and is home to some of the most scenic and productive farm country found anywhere. It tumbles over beautiful waterfalls in Rochester and throughout the breathtaking Letchworth State Park. And Livingston County is at the heart of it all!

This region experiences four distinct seasons, each with its own appeal and character. The changing of seasons keeps the bountiful outdoors accessible year-round, while inviting indoor attractions await rain or shine.

Livingston County is a paradise for outdoor enthusiasts, boasting numerous parks and nature trails. "I DO" WITH A VIEW

Letchworth is one of New York's most breathtaking wedding backdrops. Couples can exchange vows beside one of the park's three main waterfalls or in serene wooded settings.

You can choose to plan a full-service wedding at the historic **Glen Iris Inn** or a more intimate celebration with a park permit. Whether you want an elegant gathering or a simple, nature-filled ceremony, Letchworth provides the perfect backdrop.

KNOWN AS THE "Grand Canyon of the East", this park is one of the most iconic spots in LivCo. Surround yourself with the beauty of cascading waterfalls and deep gorges as you stroll, hike, or drive more than 14,000 acres. There's something for every skill level — and reaching the park's three main waterfalls is easy by car or foot.

NATURE FOR EVERYONE

The **Autism Nature Trail**, commonly known as The ANT, is a first of its kind experience in nature designed for visitors on the autism spectrum — enjoyable for all abilities and ages. The one-mile looped trail features stations at intervals, offering a range of experiences from quiet points of engagement to active exploration.

BRING THE OUTDOORS IN

Visit the **Humphrey Nature Center**, a state-of-the-art facility with interactive exhibits that highlight the plants, animals, geology and river ecology of Letchworth. Open year-round, check out experience-based programs ranging from guided hikes to onsite lectures and presentations.

Don't miss the park's **Maple Weekends**, held Saturdays in March. Interactive workshops introduce you to the history of syrup and tasty pancake breakfasts.

MAKE A BIG SPLASH

Experience exhilarating whitewater rafting, courtesy of **Adventure Calls Outfitters**. On warm days, paddlers can cool off by body surfing the "New Wave Rapids" or get soaking wet at the "The Leap of Faith." You can also cool off with a dip at **Harvey Pool**. Open late June through Labor Day, the Olympic-sized pool, closest to the Mount Morris park entrance, is open to the public.

A DAM GOOD TIME

The **Mount Morris Dam** is the largest concrete dam east of the Mississippi. This historic structure offers exhibits and scenic vistas. You can visit for a self-guided or guided tour, April to October (reserve tickets online).

Explore the **Visitor Center** and spend time on the grounds to enjoy captivating overlooks, picnic shelters, and a playground. During the winter, explore the trails on snowshoes or cross-country skis.

FINGER LAKES TRAIL LETCWORTH BRANCH

This 24-mile trail showcases the rustic charm of Letchworth, winding along the eastern side and offering stunning views of waterfalls and the gorge. In addition, with eight side trails available, you can extend your adventure by over 14 miles of exploration.

GENESEE VALLEY GREENWAY STATE PARK

This pet-friendly park follows the historic remains of the Genesee Valley Canal and Pennsylvania Railroad. Spanning 90 miles, you'll encounter gorges, farmland, wetlands, and other natural features along the way. Explore 17 historic abandoned locks of the canal between Nunda and Portage. The Greenway is not only a great spot for cycling, but also horseback riding, hiking and, in the winter months, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and snowmobiling.

ERIE-ATTICA TRAIL

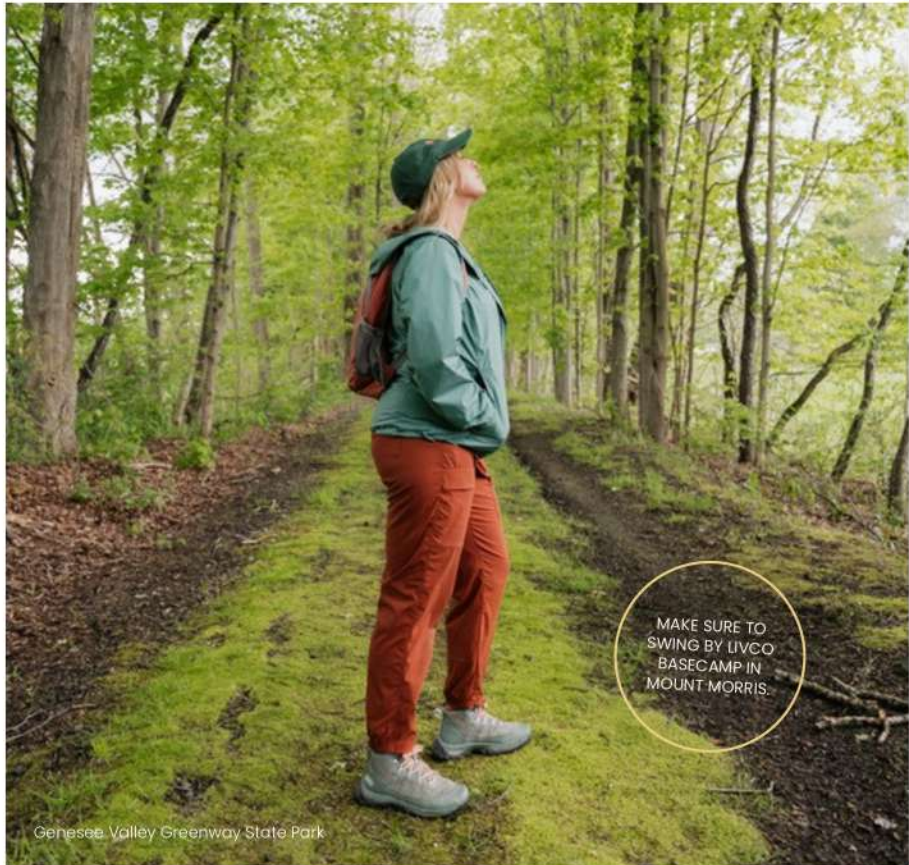
This trail offers scenic views with a side of history. Named for the area's railroads, the trail contains the original truss bridge that crosses the Genesee River. Starting in Avon, the trail connects with the **Genesee Valley Greenway State Park** after approximately a mile.

GETTING THERE

Head to **LivCo Basecamp** in Mount Morris to grab your Letchworth State Park and Genesee Valley Greenway State Park maps. **Finger Lakes Trail (FLT)** maps are available at the FLT Service Center, also located in Mount Morris.

STONY BROOK STATE PARK

A "hidden gem" in the region, explore hilly woodlands, a deep gorge with rugged cliffs overlooking three waterfalls, and fascinating rock formations. The **Gorge Trail** is the easiest and most scenic while the **Rim Trail** climbs up towering cliffs through the woods. Spend time swimming in the natural stream-fed pool, picnicking, hiking, and bird watching. The campground offers tent and trailer sites as well as eight cabins available for rent.

CONESUS LAKE WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA

At the south end of **Conesus Lake** is a pristine parcel of over 1,120 acres of undeveloped marsh, grass and woodland. A large flooded lowland area allows for excellent kayaking and canoeing along and through an abundance of natural wildlife cover.

A nature trail on the western edge provides viewing of the wetland, upland habitats and many wildlife species. Nesting ducks and geese abound in the marsh area, along with nesting Bald Eagles.

HARRIET HOLLISTER SPENCER STATE RECREATION AREA

Six miles south of **Honeoye Lake**, this area offers panoramic views of the countryside along hiking and biking trails. The area was created after 680 acres of land were given to New York State from the estate of Harriet Hollister Spencer, a horticulturist, rose expert, and civic leader, after her death in 1962.

OSSIAN STATE FOREST

The 1,303-acre forest offers a rustic experience with little development. This forest shares a long common boundary with **Rattlesnake Hill State Wildlife Management Area** and a parcel of Allegany County forest lands. If you're looking for specialty recreation, explore this state forest for mountain biking and horseback riding. Outdoor lovers from across New York State also flock to Ossian year-round for its exquisite wildlife watching and unbeatable hunting.

HEMLOCK-CANADICE STATE FOREST

Explore 6,684 acres of state forest featuring the two beautiful undeveloped Finger Lakes, **Hemlock** and **Canadice** as well as 14 miles of hiking trails. Explore **Bur Oak Trail**, located north of Hemlock Lake, **Willow Oak Trail**, which loops near **Reynolds Gully** waterfall, or **Walnut Trail**, where you'll find the ruins of former homes that once were on Hemlock Lake. Love biking? Try out **Northern Hemlock Lake Trail**, a popular biking option that follows an old road about three miles on the eastern shore of Hemlock Lake.

SONYEA STATE FOREST

Genesee Valley Greenway State Park passes through Sonyea State Forest. You can discover railroad remains as you explore **Keshequa Gorge** and its creek. The water's edge is a favorite spot for a peaceful picnic.

CHOOSE YOUR OWN WATER-FUL ADVENTURE

CHASE WATERFALLS

The Genesee River Valley offers a bounty of cascading waterfalls, trickling down rocks or plunging over 100 feet into the mist below. Explore **Keshequa Creek Falls** in Dansville, **Papermill Falls** in Avon, **Reynolds Gully** in Springwater, and **Fall Brook Falls** in Geneseo.

Note: Fall Brook Falls is privately owned and only accessible by guided hiking tours provided by **Trail Otter**.

PADDLE WITH NATURE

From kayaks to stand-up paddle boards, our lakes are ideal for paddling. Find ideal paddling on remote **Hemlock Lake**, the **Conesus Lake Inlet** wetlands, and the **Genesee River** from Mt. Morris to Indian Fort Nature Preserve.

MAKE THE BIG CATCH

Try your hand at fishing with **Upstate Anglers Guide Service**, offering four or six-hour fishing charters on **Conesus Lake**. Specializing in Bass, Walleye, Pike, and panfish, they cater to all angler experience, from first-timers to experts.

Don't hang up your rod and reel when the snow flies. As one of the shallowest Finger Lakes, **Conesus Lake** is the perfect spot for ice fishing in the winter.

Prefer fly fishing? Cast out a line at **Oatka Creek** or **Springwater Creek**.

RIDE THE WAVES

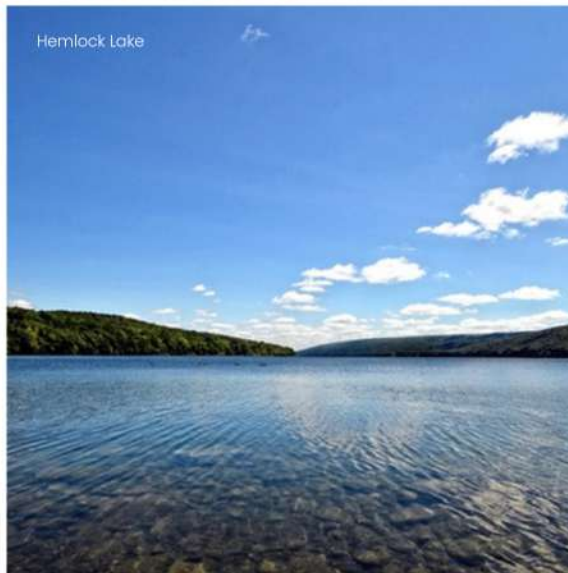
Whether it's wakeboarding, jet skiing, or tubing, tie up your gear to a boat and ride the waves of **Conesus Lake** - you'll feel like you're flying across the water.

CONESUS LAKE

Conesus Lake is well-known for "floatillas" and pontooning all summer long. Take your vessel onto the water, drop an anchor, and enjoy the summer sun!

HEMLOCK LAKE

Enjoy a peaceful setting at remote Hemlock Lake with beautifully wooded shorelines. Keep in mind, boats can be no longer than 16 feet and outboard motors no larger than 10 horsepower.

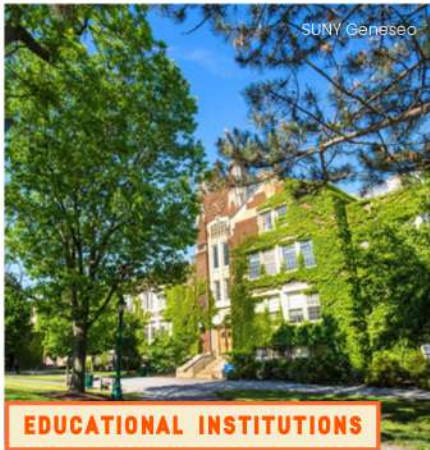

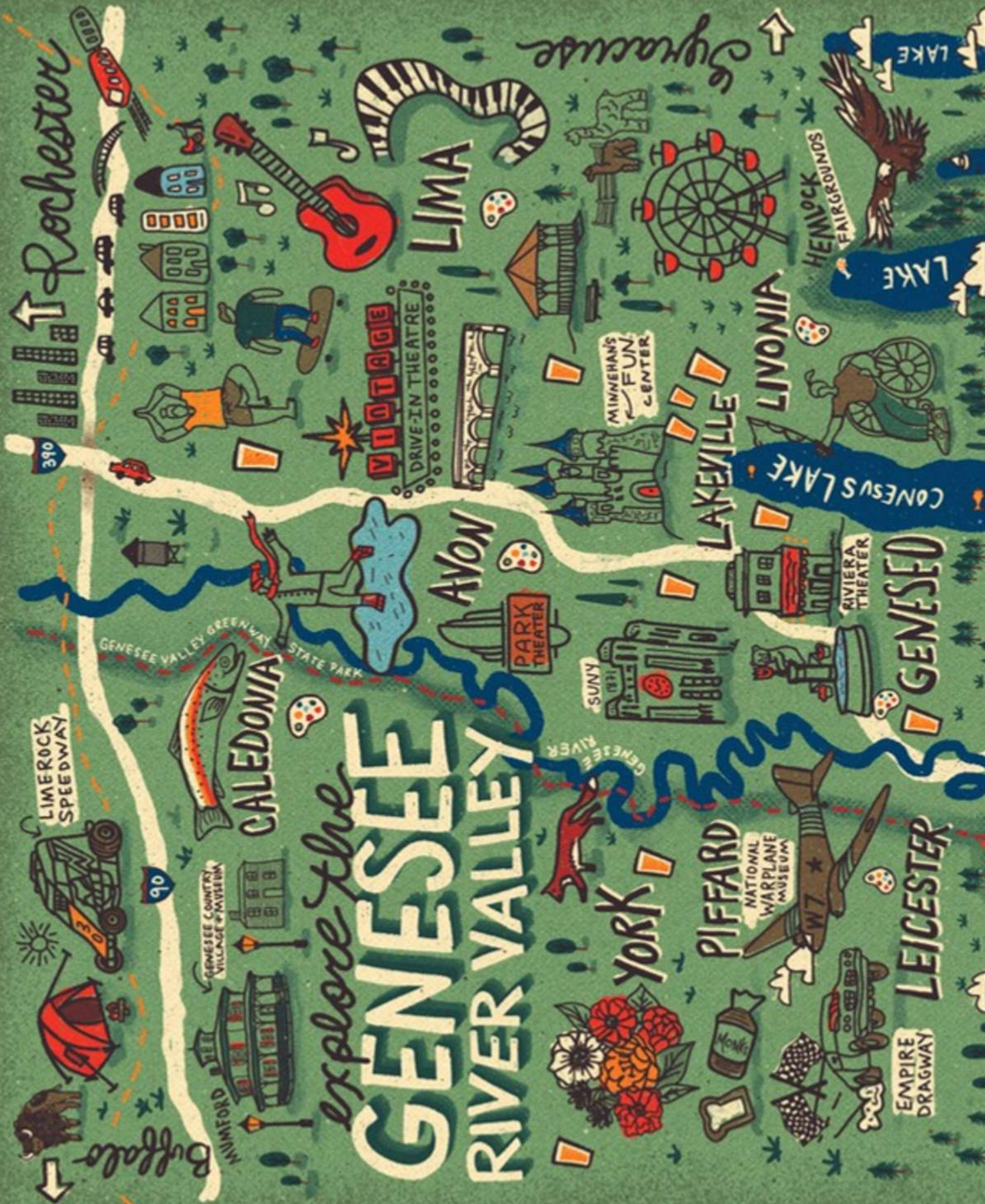
History and charm run deep in the region's villages and towns. Quaint shops, historic architecture, and timeless Main Streets invite discovery at every turn. Livingston

Wander through nearly 70 historic buildings, meet costumed interpreters, and experience life in the 19th century. Don't miss the on-site **Nature Center**, where you can stretch your legs on trails and learn about the landscapes that once greeted early settlers. Finish the day at the Village Tavern, with an extensive selection of craft beer and classic American cuisine the kids will love.

DAY TWO

After, enjoy a few rounds of bowling at **Livingston Lanes**, **Mt. Morris Lanes**, or **Raider Lanes**. Stop at **T's on Genesee** for dinner and Italian desserts. Then, make your way to the **East Avon Vintage Drive-In**, which features three screens and double features. Stock up on popcorn and candy and settle in under the stars.

DAY FOUR

Start your last day with a hearty breakfast at the **Cozy Kitchen**. Then feed the fish at the **Caledonia Fish Hatchery**. If you're visiting in the summer, check out a concert at **little Lake Brewing**, **Vitale Park**, or the Sunset Concert Series at the historic **Wadsworth Homestead**. Bring a blanket, relax on the grass, and enjoy live music as the kids dance and play. Finish the day enjoying cocktails and woodfire pizza at **Caffe Tazza**, a cozy Italian eatery with an outdoor patio.

DAY FOUR

As you wrap up your trip, embark on a creative endeavor at a class at **Ironwood Studios**. Weld your own one-of-a-kind piece in the studio's vintage, rural barn alongside instructor and artist, Stacey Mrva. Make sure to visit one of the many murals scattered throughout LivCo. Each reflects the stores, people, and culture of the region.

End the day enjoying the sun setting over **Conesus Lake** and dinner at **Ember Woodfire Grill**. Up for one more stop? Explore a selection of breweries on the **LivCo Libation Loop**.

FOR THE ADVENTURER

Livingston County offers an engaging mix of invigorating and relaxing pursuits that showcase the region's breathtaking natural beauty.

DAY ONE

On your first day in LivCo, get off the beaten path in **Letchworth State Park** on a guided hike with **Trail Otter**. The outfitter offers tours that can be customized to your needs and interests. Bring your binoculars - birdwatching is plentiful in the park. Want for a different view? See the park from above, soaring high with **Balloons Over Letchworth**.

Cap off your day with dinner at a local favorite, **The Yard of Ale**, a restaurant that combines casual vibes with fine-dining quality, and that's known for its prime rib dinners.

DAY TWO

Fuel up at **Cosmic Charlie Café**, where you can find out-of-this-world beverages and breakfast burritos - just what you'll need before heading next door to **Sunrise Bouldering**, an indoor, bouldering, all-skill-level gym.

Get your adrenaline pumping on a whitewater rafting trip with **Adventure Calls Outfitters**. Then kick up your feet for the evening at the only rooftop brewery in LivCo, **Solitude Brewing Company**.

DAY THREE

Take to the skies in a World War II aircraft with the **National Warplane Museum**. From May to October, book a ride in the aircraft of your choice for an experience you will be talking about for a long time. Stop for a bite at **Kalash Kitchen**, owned by indigenous Kalasha people of the Himalayas and serving up authentic Greek dishes.

FOR THE **FOODIE**

Spend your time sampling the endless flavors of LivCo's diverse dining scene without running out of delicious options.

DAY ONE

Start with a stop into one of the coziest coffee shops in the region, **Milk & Honey Café**. Agritourism goes hand-in-hand with culinary tourism and, luckily, LivCo boasts lots of local farms. See one for yourself with a visit to a woman-owned and operated medicinal herb and mushroom farm, **Fallbrook Farms**. For dinner, snag a reservation at **Galene**, a lakeside restaurant with raw bar specials and coastal cuisine.



DAY TWO

Peruse local goods and breakfast options at **Six Sprouts Farm Market**. Stop for lunch at the original **Tom Wahl's**, an iconic destination known for signature Wahlburgers and root beer floats. Then breath in the fresh air while hiking or biking the **Erie Attica Trail**. Finish the day with farm-to-table French cuisine at the **Caledonia Village Inn**.

DAY THREE

Visit the **Abbey of the Genesee**, where Trappist monks sell specialty items like **Monks' Bread**. Stop for artisan goods at **Dansville Granola**, **The Valley Shop**, and **Wendy's Pantry**. After you work up an appetite, enjoy a bite at **The Refinery Kitchen**, where the Kimchi sandwich is a must-order or **The Normal**, known for BBQ with a Scandinavian twist, both in Lima.

DAY FOUR

Kick off the morning kayaking on **Conesus Lake** or sitting by the water at **Vitale Park**. Afterward, it's time to see why the Finger Lakes have become known as a renowned wine destination. Sample vino at the westernmost Finger Lakes winery, **Deer Run Winery**, and get brunch in the on-site **Tankroom Café**. Stop at one of **Cooperative Las Cazuelas'** monthly pop-ups for authentic, homestyle Mexican.

Spend the afternoon brewery hopping with **RocTours**, offering local, drinks-focused tours that include door-to-door pickup and drop-off. Then, enjoy live music at one of LivCo's favorite venues, **Fanatics Pub**.

LOCAL DELICACIES

NO TRIP TO WESTERN NEW YORK is complete without tasting our homegrown delicacies. Check out these legendary regional creations:

TRASH PLATE

First created in Rochester, the trash plate is a tasty concoction that combines burgers or hot dogs, fries and sides like macaroni salad and baked beans into one dish. Find locally at **Shoreless Acres General Store** or **University Hots**.



BUFFALO WINGS

The origin story of Buffalo wings starts with Teressa Bellissimo, co-owner of the original Anchor Bar in Buffalo. In the 1960s, what started as an incorrect shipment turned into a famed app, traditionally doused in hot sauce. Stop into almost any bar or tavern in LivCo and you'll find them on the menu.



BEEF ON WECK

Another classic originally from Buffalo, this sandwich is made with thinly sliced, rare roast beef on a salty and caraway seed-crusted roll called a "kummelweck". Prepared with au jus and horseradish for a spicy kick. Grab your own at **T's on Genesee** or **Tee & Gee Bar and Grill**.

Begin with yoga at **Magic Held Here**, **Ritz Mountain Yoga**, or **Yoga Bhoga Yoga Studio**, setting the tone for a peaceful day. Recharge with baked goods and coffee from **little Lake Brewing**. Head to **Spindle and Knots**—a calming creative haven. Whether you're shopping for yarn, taking a class, or learning a new craft, it's the perfect space to slow down and embrace a new mindful hobby.

In the afternoon, book a session at **Cedar House Wellness**. Try an infrared sauna or cold plunge therapy to reset your body and mind. End your evening with quiet reflection, enjoying the stillness of the countryside.

AVON

WHERE HISTORY MEETS FUN

The Village of Avon is located on Routes 5 + 20 in northern Livingston County. Originally a stagecoach crossing community, Avon became known as a spa destination (thanks to the nearby mineral springs) and a popular destination for harness horse racing. Today, you can explore Avon's history at the **Five Arch Bridge**, built for the railroad in the 1850s, or the **Avon Inn**, built in 1840. Avon also offers a whole lot of fun, with popular attractions like the **East Avon Vintage Drive-In Theatre** and **Tom Wahl's**.

CALEDONIA

KNOWN FOR FAMOUS FISH

The historic village of Caledonia is located on the Routes 5 + 20. A Caledonia's claim to fame? Home of the oldest fish hatchery in the Western Hemisphere. Established by Seth Green in 1864, the hatchery is still in operation today. Downtown boasts a cluster of antique shops, home furnishings stores, art galleries, and boutiques. Be sure to stop by the **Caledonia Village Inn**, serving French-inspired farm-to-table cuisine or **Pastique**, a home décor and gift boutique.

DANSVILLE

FAIRIES AND SCENIC PARKS

The Village of Dansville, located along Interstate 390, is the southern gateway to Livingston County. Main Street, which runs along Route 63, is home to historic storefronts including an historic movie theater, brewery, and retail shops where you can buy boutique gifts and local products. Dansville was one of the first towns established in Livingston County, in 1795. One of its historical highlights? Dansville is home to the first Chapter of the American Red Cross established by Clara Barton.



GENESEO

WHERE TOWN MEETS GOWN

Along Route 20A, the Village of Geneseo, a designated National Landmark Village, is comprised of a diverse collection of historic homes. Nestled on the hillside of the Genesee River Valley, Main Street runs along Route 39 and borders the campus of **SUNY Geneseo**. In addition to the campus, Main Street is packed with so much to do and see.

LEICESTER

SMALL TOWN CHARM

Located on Route 20A and Route 36, this small village is home to the most popular **Letchworth State Park** entrance. Make a stop to visit the **Village Park**, where you can catch live music in the summer, as well as **Starr Park** for superb sledding. Dine at **Gatherings at the Depot** and shop at **2nd Time Around Consignment** with a large selection of comic books, action figures, and games.

LIMA

A HUB FOR MUSIC

Traditionally known as the *Crossroads of Western NY*, Lima is located at the intersection of Routes 5 + 20 and NYS Route 15A and is home to restaurants and taverns, antique, and collectible shops. Among these is **Crossroads Antiques Mall**, an antique store located in a former church selling rare and hard-to-find items. The **WE Shop** offers unique gifts created by local artisans and entrepreneurs.



LIVONIA

LAKEFRONT + LIBATIONS

For travelers who want to hit the water, there's no better village than Livonia, which sits along Route 20A between **Conesus and Hemlock Lakes**. Livonia is home to several stops on the **LivCo Libation Loop**, including **No BS Brew Company**, **OSB Ciderworks**, **little Lake Brewing**, and **Solitude Brewing Company**. In the village, stop at **Simply Positive**, an artisan store and **Wanda's**, a local favorite family restaurant.

MOUNT MORRIS

ANTIQUES AT EVERY TURN

Main Street in Mount Morris runs along Route 36, parallel to **Genesee Valley Greenway State Park**. The **LivCo Inspirations Trail** draws your attention to the county's wealth of public art, but this village has more murals than the rest. Antique shops, eateries, and an old-fashioned candy shop make it the perfect destination for a day of strolling. Be sure to make a stop at the county's official visitor center, **LivCo Basecamp**.

NUNDA

SEASONS OF OUTDOOR FUN

Off the beaten track, but adjacent to the magnificent waterfalls and hiking trails of **Letchworth State Park**, the Village of Nunda (pronounced "noneday") is a hidden treasure. Surrounded by rolling hills and pastoral views, this historic village is home to **The Valley Shop**, a quaint boutique shop. Hit the links at **Woodlyn Hills Golf Course**. And when you're hungry, try **Kish-a-wa Creamery** or **Lulu's Coffeehouse**.

FOLLOW THE ART

Get out your phone because we have spots in LivCo that will brighten up your feed. Many murals have popped up in our region, so plan an awesome photo adventure for you and your friends on a sunny day.

1 FLOWERS OF LETCHWORTH

📍 83 Main Street, Mt Morris

Muralist: Ouizi

Using larger-than-life visuals and negative space, this mural depicts the natural flora and fauna found at Letchworth State Park, just minutes away. One of the most prominent flowers is Milkweed, a primary food source for Monarch butterflies, which are common to the region.

2 FARMER'S SPECTRUM

📍 1883 Rochester Street, Lima

Muralist: Abigail Penfold

Farmer's Spectrum depicts a variety of fruits and vegetables common to the Genesee River Valley, in a rainbow of colors. Locals are proud of their small-town character, scenic rolling hills, and agricultural land with some of the highest-quality soil in the country.

3 BIG HEART

📍 134 Main Street, Leicester

Muralist: Kacy Jackson

Inspired by the motto, "Little Village with a Big Heart", this mural is located on the side of a building that was once known as the Leicester Casino, a spot for weddings and live entertainment from the 1930s-50s. It played host to bands including music-legend Chubby Checkers.

4 CLARA BARTON NEW

📍 170 Main Street, Dansville

Muralists: Melissa Stratton Pandina + Gabriela Sepulveda

One of the largest murals in LivCo, this mural honors the founder of the American Red Cross, Clara Barton. Founding the first chapter in Dansville in 1881, Barton also served as its president. The Chapter 1 House is just steps away from the mural, on Ossian and Elizabeth streets.

5 SEED

📍 60 North State Street, Nunda

Muralist: Matthew Mederer

This mural is inspired by Burt's Seeds, a popular seed company known for beautiful lithographic packets, which was founded in the region over 100 years ago. Today, you can see images of W.D. Burt Seed packets on coffee cups, sachets, towels, wallpaper and framed prints – it all started with Burt's giant pumpkin!

6 WISDOM

📍 125 Main Street, Geneseo

Muralist: KEY DETAIL

The largest mural in LivCo, Wisdom blends nature and education featuring imagery inspired by SUNY Geneseo, a key part of the village and a hub for arts and culture. In the mural, you'll see nods to the nature of the region including waterfalls, acorns, and colors of the iconic Genesee River Valley sunset.

7 WILD MUSTANG

📍 175 Main Street, Dansville

Muralist: Arlin Graff

Inspired by the equestrian history in the region, this mural depicts a larger-than-life mustang running wild, highlighting the connection between civilization and nature.

8 TROUT CULTURE

📍 3103 Main Street, Caledonia

Muralist: Tim Parsley

Trout Culture gives visitors an underwater perspective as an ode to the story of Seth Green, "Father of Fish Culture in North America," who established the first fish hatchery in the Western Hemisphere in Caledonia in 1864.

9 LIFT OFF LIVONIA NEW

📍 27 Main Street, Livonia

Muralist: Tim Parsley

The majestic Great Blue Heron, often spotted at the south end of Conesus lake, is stunningly captured mid-flight at sunset in this mural. A beautiful reminder of the peaceful lake life that is central to the Livonia community.

10 FIRST FLIGHT

📍 16 Commercial Street, Livonia

Muralist: Justin Suarez

Did you know Hemlock Lake is the site of New York's longest-known nesting spot for the bald eagle? First Flight pays tribute to the repopulation of bald eagles in the region resulting in over 300 new bald eagle nests, with dozens in the area. Bald eagles are no longer endangered and are a common, yet exciting sight.

11 HORSE COUNTRY

📍 79 Genesee Street, Avon

Muralist: Ivan J. Roque

Horse Country is inspired by the story of the Genesee Valley Breeders Association – the oldest thoroughbred breeding organization in the country – that was established in 1914 by Mrs. Herbert Wadsworth who helped develop cavalry horses for WWI.

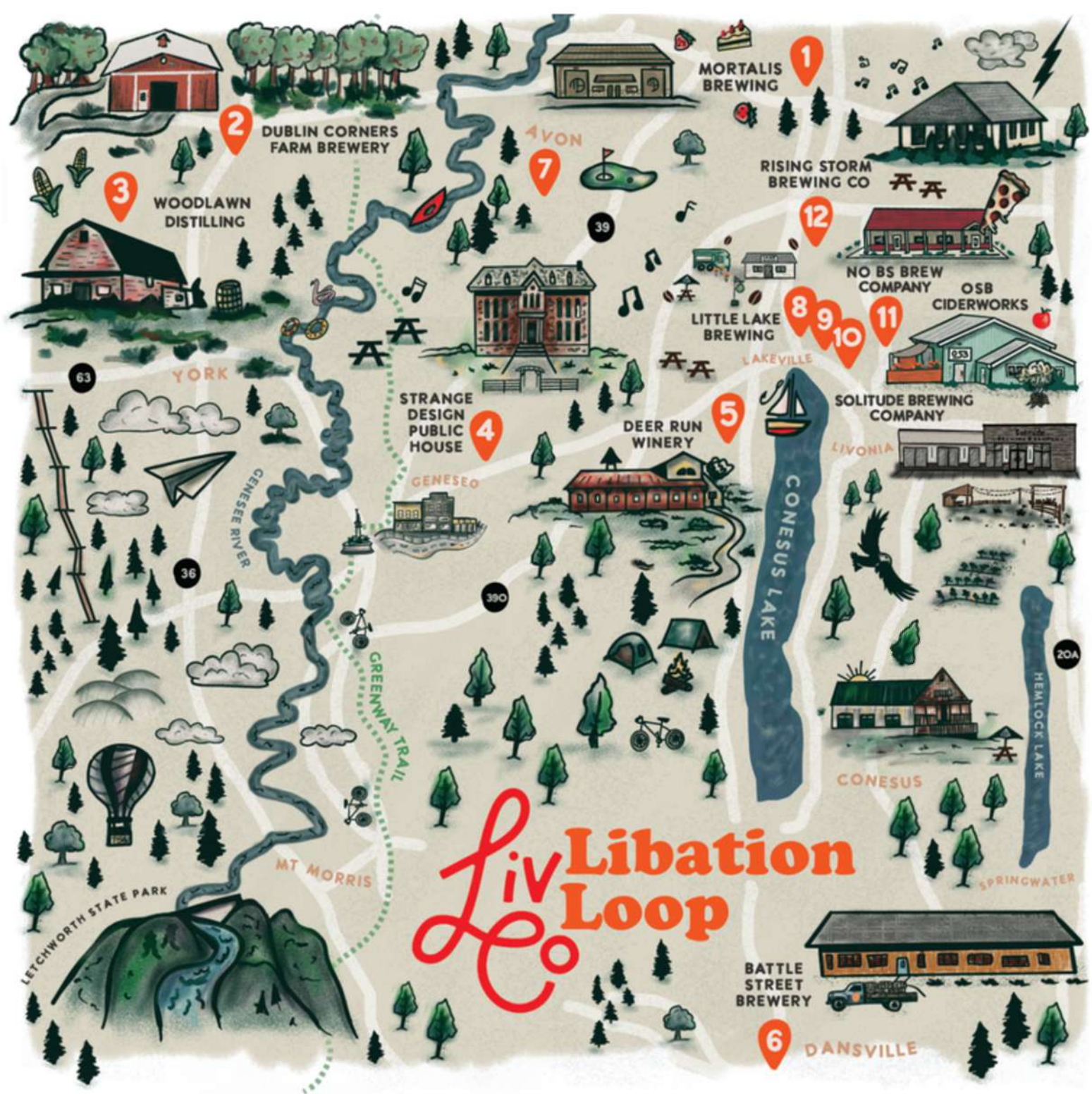

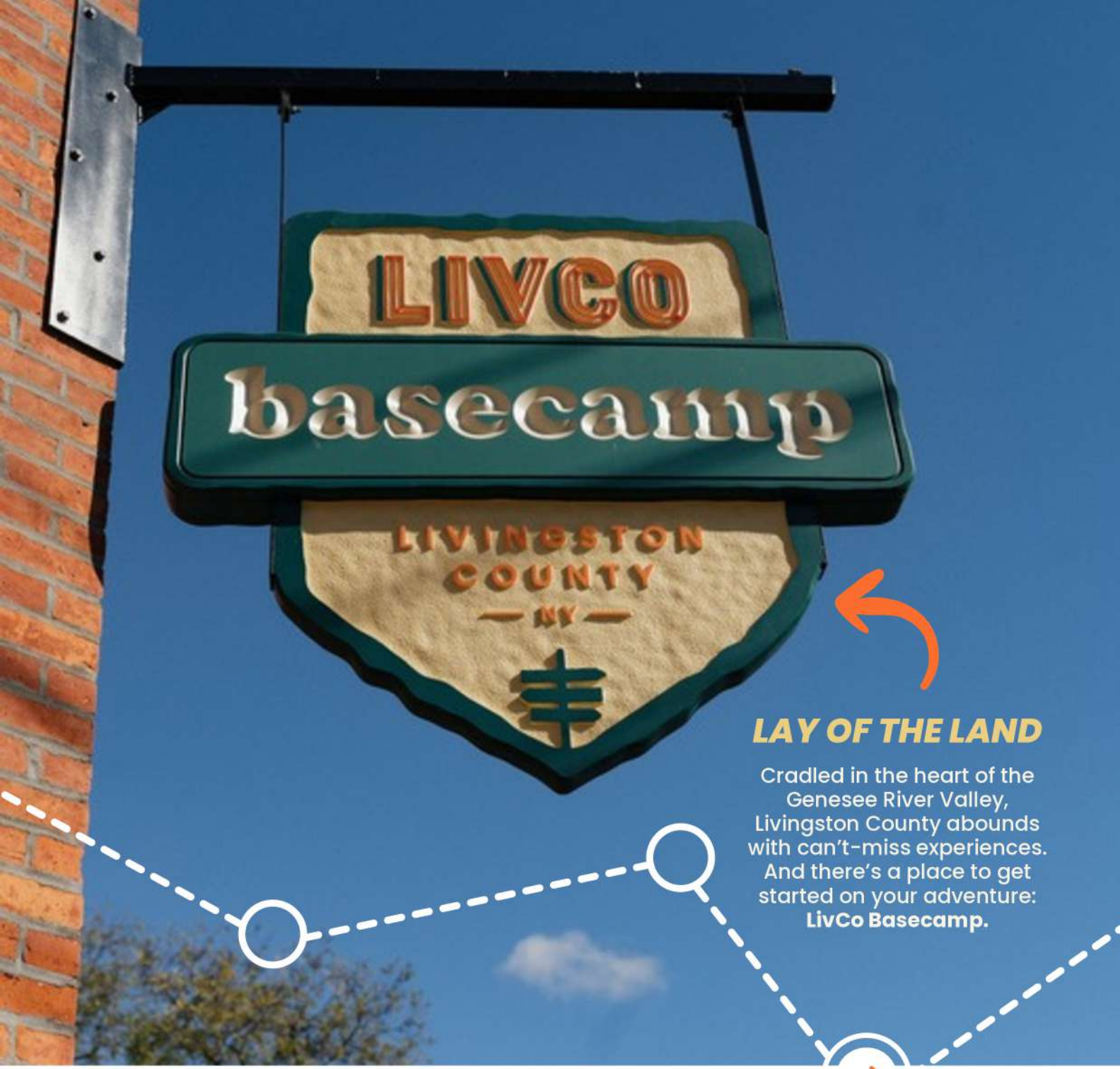
