


EXPLORE EVEN MORE...

Other notable Colorado destinations include:

- Aspen Ski Resort – 230 miles, 4 hours
- Boulder – 16 miles, 27 minutes
- Colorado Springs – 106 miles, 2 hours

- Fort Collins – 30 miles, 50 minutes
- Grand Junction – 276 miles, 4.5 hours
- Vail Ski Resort – 130 miles, 2.25 hours



HIKING AND BIKING IN AND AROUND LONGMONT

These trails are easy and flat and great for hiking, biking and walking your dog:

- **McIntosh Lake** - An easy, 3.6 mile trail loops around the lake. The walk includes beautiful wildflowers and a variety of wildlife, and is good for all skill levels.
- **Pella Crossing** - Pella Crossing Loop Trail is a 1.4 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Hygiene, Colorado. The area offers fishing and walking trails and beautiful views of Longs Peak and is a wetlands habitat. The trail is good for all skill levels and offers a number of activity options.
- **Lagerman Reservoir** - This 1.6 mile, moderately trafficked loop trail winds past striking wildflowers and is great for walks, birding and nature trips.
- **Golden Ponds** - With a magnificent view of Longs Peak and the Front Range, this park is comprised of 94 acres, with 56 acres of water surface in four ponds. Wildlife of all kinds is viewed in the park. Good for all skill levels.
- **LoBo Trail** - This 12.8-mile, planned trail from Longmont to Boulder features a lake and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a variety of activity options and is accessible year-round.

LYONS (12 miles), home to Planet Bluegrass, is a charming, small, mountain town featuring locally-owned restaurants, antique shops and galleries. Don't miss the Lyons Pinball Museum, and, in the summer, the Lyons Redstone Museum. Hike at Heil Valley Ranch, Hall Ranch or Rabbit Mountain.

ESTES PARK (33 miles) is the site of the iconic Stanley Hotel, Aerial Tramway, Estes Park Museum, Lake Estes Marina and downtown restaurants and shops, including souvenir stores, boutiques and galleries.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK (RMNP, Estes Park, 33 miles) is Longmont's majestic neighbor and home to Longs Peak, the namesake mountain (14,000 foot or "Fourteener") for Longmont. RMNP celebrated 100 years in 2015 and offers 415 square miles of exciting activities, including hiking, camping and wildlife viewing.

NEDERLAND (32 miles) is a quirky mountain town, home to Eldora Mountain Ski Resort, the Carousel of Happiness, Wild Bear Mountain Ecology Center and Barker Reservoir. The town is located along the Peak to Peak National Scenic Byway.

NIWOT (7 miles) is a quaint, historical town nestled between Longmont and Boulder. The town is named after Chief Niwot, a tribal leader with the southern Arapaho tribe and notable figure in Colorado's history. Visit small shops and antique stores along Second Avenue.

BOULDER (16 miles) features the Pearl Street Mall, a vibrant pedestrian-only mall, with unique restaurants and shops, fun events and street performers. Also, visit the University of Colorado (CU), Celestial Seasonings, Chautauqua and the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR).

THE WILD ANIMAL SANCTUARY (Keenesburg, 36 miles) is an expansive, 720-acre facility that provides a loving home for large animals rescued from abusive or illegal conditions. Resident animals include African lions, wolves, bears, tigers a camel, and many other species. View the animals in their natural environment from the "Mile Into the Wild", an elevated walkway spanning one amazing habitat after another.
