If you want to experience Los Cabos beaches and their wonderlands, exploring under the sea is a great plan. Los Cabos provides a temperate climate that makes snorkeling and scuba diving possible all year round.

With depths from 15 to 60 feet and a range of sea-life, including rays and puffer fish, this area ranks high on the list of popular dives. Fabulous snorkeling can be experienced in the East Cape where the coral reefs have grown exponentially since being declared a marine sanctuary.



Another must-dive are the coral reefs found in the Cabo Pulmo National Park and marine protected area. If diving at these depths are not on your bucket-list, try diving or snorkeling with the oceans largest shark, the whale shark, which is a gentle filter-feeder and can grow up to 30 feet long.
