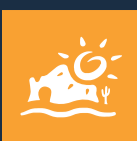




LOS CABOS



ARRIVALS/DEPARTURES PROTOCOLS

The Government of Canada has issued an official travel advisory, instructing all Canadians to avoid all non-essential travel. If Canadians choose to travel abroad, there are protocols in place to ensure the safety of all Canadians upon returning home.

Leaving Canada

To board a plane leaving Canada, some protocols must be met:

- All prior restrictions such as temperature checks, health screening and wearing masks on board the plane
- No symptoms of COVID-19, unless document proof to explain otherwise
- Been refused a flight in the past 14 days due to medical reasons pertaining to COVID-19
- All travellers must wear a mask except for those:
 - Who are two years or younger
 - Individuals who cannot remove their mask without assistance
 - Medical reasons with document proof

ARRIVAL PROTOCOLS

3 STEPS TO LOS CABOS

There are new entry requirements due to COVID health and safety protocols. Complete these three easy steps before you board your plane.



01 Fill out the risk factor questionnaire

Complete the Questionnaire of Identification of Risk Factors in Travelers form – the Federal Aviation Agency requires you to present it upon arrival. Once the process is completed please save the QR code that will appear. You'll need to present the QR code to the federal agents at the security gate.

02 Fill out the official entry form

All foreign citizens traveling to Mexico must fill out the Multiple Immigration Form. Some airlines no longer hand out these forms on board, we recommend you to complete the form online. This document is required to be printed double-sided.

03 Fill out the customs declaration form

Fill out the customs declaration form prior to arriving Mexico. You'll present this form to the customs officer upon arrival. Once you complete the information you will receive a QR code which you'll need to present at customs. You can fill out this document online at:

DEPARTURE PROTOCOLS

4 STEPS TO DEPARTURE

Because of new health and safety requirements due to COVID-19, you must complete these four steps in order to depart from Los Cabos.



01 Fill out the risk factor questionnaire

Just like when you arrived, the Federal Aviation Agency requires you to complete and present the Questionnaire of Identification of Risk Factors in Travelers form in order to depart Los Cabos.

Once the process is completed please save the QR code that will appear. You'll need to present the QR code to the federal agents at the security gate.

02 Get a negative PCR COVID-19 test result and fill out attestation form

• For those travelling to Canada

As of September 7, 2021 all other foreign nationals who qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption will now be allowed entry into Canada. Travellers must be at least 14 days past their second dose of a Canadian- approved vaccine and show a negative COVID-19 molecular test 72 hours prior to entry.

Regardless of citizenship, all travellers over the age of five must provide a negative PCR COVID-19 test result 72 hours prior to your departure time and arrival in Canada and complete an ArriveCAN form before entering the country.

All airlines are required to confirm a negative PCR test result for all passengers returning to Canada. You'll need to submit this to your airline either online or in person.

• For those travelling through the US

All airlines are required to confirm a negative test result for all passengers returning to the U.S. Your test must be taken within 72 hours before your flight. You'll need to submit this to your airline either online or in person.

Submit an attestation (written documentation) to the U.S. Government, through your airline, that you are COVID-19 negative or have recently recovered from COVID-19. Each passenger will be required to submit a form within 72 hours of your flight.

All airlines are required to confirm a negative antigen test result for all passengers returning to the US. You'll need to submit this to your airline either online or in person.



03 Fill out the Multiple Immigration Form

All foreign citizens departing Mexico must provide the Multiple Immigration form that was presented and given upon arrival.



04 Complete your airline's procedures

All Airlines have their own requirements to board your plane home, so make sure you have the documentation needed.

TEST LOCATIONS & INFO ABOUT YOUR COUNTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Fully vaccinated travellers (meaning you have received two doses of approved vaccines) are exempted from quarantining and the Day-8 testing requirement. To qualify for this exemption, you must reach these requirements:

- No symptoms of COVID-19
- Have received your last dose of COVID-19 vaccines at least two weeks prior to entering Canada
- The following are the approved vaccines by the Government of Canada:
 - Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty, tozinameran, BNT162b2)
 - Moderna (mRNA-1273)
 - AstraZeneca/COVISHIELD (ChAdOx1-S, Vaxzevria, AZD1222)
 - Janssen/Johnson & Johnson (Ad26.COV2.S)

There are currently no travel exemptions for those who have not received a full series of approved vaccines.
