### ARRIVAL PROTOCOLS

### 3 STEPS TO LOS CABOS

There are new entry requirements due to COVID health and safety protocols. Complete these three easy steps before you board your plane.



#### 01 Fill out the risk factor questionnaire

Complete the Questionnaire of Identification of Risk Factors in Travelers form – the Federal Aviation Agency requires you to present it upon arrival. Once you fill in the requested information save the QR code that will appear so you can show it to the agents prior passing security.

#### 02 Fill out the official entry form

All foreign citizens traveling to Mexico must fill out the Multiple Immigration Form. Some airlines no longer hand out these forms on board, we recommend you to fill out and print yours online prior to arrival. This document will need to be printed double-sided.

#### 03 Fill out the customs declaration form

You'll need to fill out the customs declaration form both prior to arriving Mexico and prior to departure from Mexico to your home country. You'll present this form to the customs officer upon arrival. You can fill out this document online at:

Once you finish filling out the information, you will get a QR code, save it so you can show it at customs.

### DEPARTURE PROTOCOLS

### 4 STEPS TO DEPARTURE

Because of new health and safety requirements due to COVID, you must complete these four steps in order to depart from Los Cabos.



#### 01 Fill out the risk factor questionnaire

Just like when you arrived, the Federal Aviation Agency requires you to complete and present the Questionnaire of Identification of Risk Factors in Travelers form in order to depart Los Cabos.

Once you fill in the requested information save the QR code that will appear so you can show it to the agents prior passing security.

#### 02 Get a negative COVID-19 test result and fill out attestation form

All airlines are required to confirm a negative test result for all passengers returning to the U.S. Your test must be taken within 24 hours before your flight. You'll need to submit this to your airline either online or in person.

Submit an attestation (written documentation) to the U.S. Government, through your airline, that you are COVID-19 negative or have recently recovered from COVID-19. Each passenger will be required to submit a form within 24 hours of your flight.

#### 03 Fill out the Multiple Immigration Form

All foreign citizens departing Mexico must provide the Multiple Immigration Form that was presented at the arrival.



#### 04 Complete your airline's procedures

All Airlines have their own requirements in order to board your plane home, so make sure you have the documentation needed. Find your airline: American Airlines, United Airlines, Alaska Airlines, Delta Airlines, Southwest Airlines, Frontier and Jetblue.

Required Airline documentation in VeriFly:

- Upload test results to VeriFly
- Fill out attestation form at VeriFly

Once you submit your test results and complete the attestation form your pass will be successfully activated. You will need to show your completed verify pass prior boarding.

- Fill out attestation form in the app.

Required Airline documentation in VeriFly:

- Upload test results to VeriFly
- Fill out attestation form at VeriFly

Required Airline documentation:

- Upload test results to the app
- Fill out attestation form in the app

Once you submit your test results and complete the attestation form your pass will be successfully activated. You will need to show your completed pass prior boarding.

#### Southwest

Please complete each of the below steps prior to arriving at the airport.

1. Submit an attestation (written documentation) to the U.S. Government, through Southwest, that you are COVID-19 negative or have recently recovered from COVID-19. Each passenger will be required to submit a form within 24 hours of their flight. fill out the Southwest attestation form online:

2. Bring physical or electronic documentation of a negative COVID-19 viral test result taken within 1 calendar day preceding your flight's departure to the U.S.

All passengers will need to go to the ticket counter where their documentation will be verified before they can proceed through to security.

#### FRONTIER AIRLINES

Requires that all required documents must be presented physically upon check-in.

Required documents by airline:

- Negative COVID-19 test results
- Attestation form

#### jetBlue

Requires that all required documents must be presented physically upon check-in.

Required documents by airline:

- Negative COVID-19 test results
- Attestation form
