

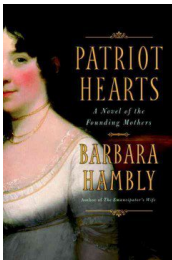
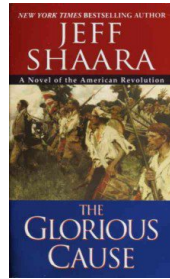


### The Love Letter

As the colonists face an uphill battle in their quest for freedom, General George Washington makes a fateful decision to cross the Delaware River and confront the enemy in New Jersey.

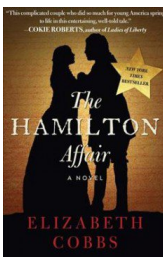
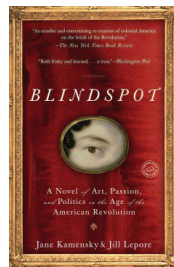


### Patriot Hearts

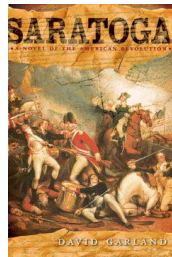
### Blindspot

Relates the tumultuous love story of Alexander Hamilton and Elizabeth Schuyler against the dramatic backdrop of the American Revolution.

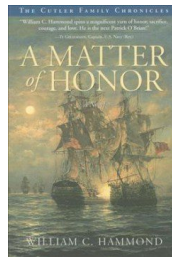
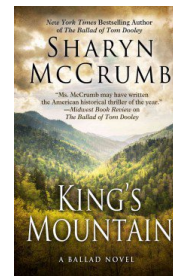


### Saratoga

Drawn into the American Revolution by British officer Patrick Ferguson's threat against his settlement, John Sevier organizes the Carolina Overmountain Men militia.

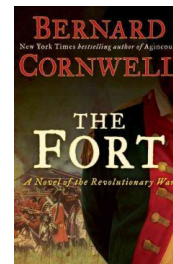


### A Matter of Honor

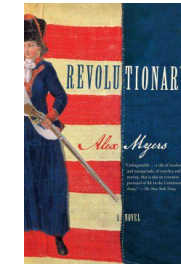
by William Hammond

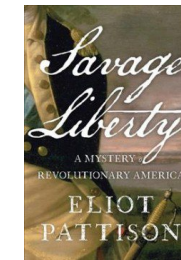
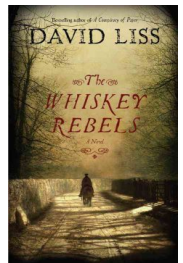


### Revolutionary

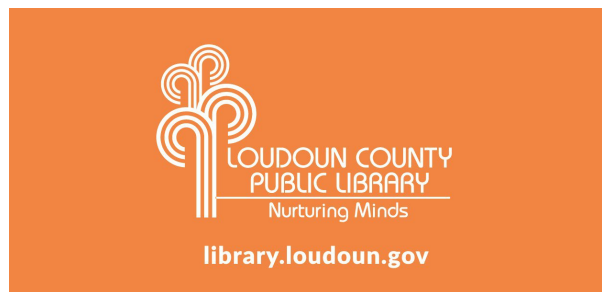
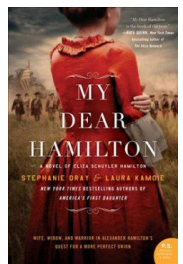


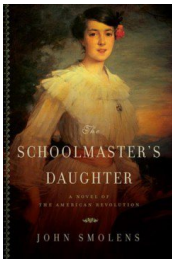
### Savage Liberty

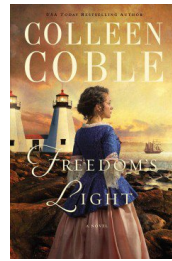

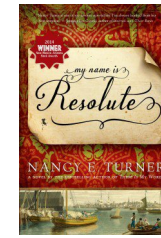
### THE SCHOOLMASTER'S DAUGHTER

A young lighthouse keeper, recently widowed, faces war and deprivation to find happiness with a shipwrecked captain who is a spy for George Washington.

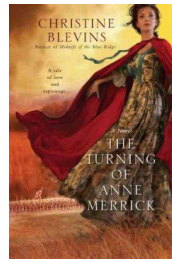


### MY NAME IS RESOLUTE

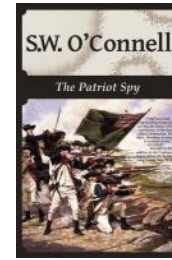
### THE TURNING OF ANNE MERRICK

Fighting for liberty during the American Revolution, Anne Merrick and Jack Hampton run into a British officer seeking revenge after being left for dead.



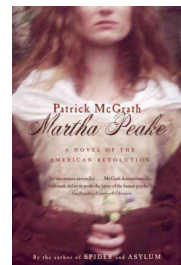
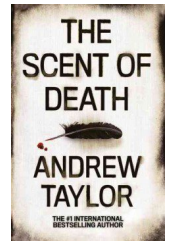
### THE PATRIOT SPY

Even as Minutemen battle Redcoats, an elite corps of American special operations troops wage a shadow war against the British forces.



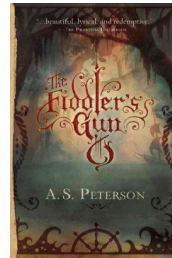
### THE SCENT OF DEATH

Edward Savill is sent from London to investigate the claims of dispossessed loyalists in New York, but soon finds himself dealing with a murder.



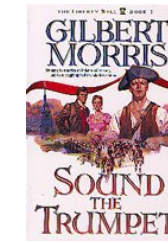
### MARTHA PEAKE

Fin, a young woman in search of her independence, finds more than she bargained for aboard a privateer ship caught up in the Revolutionary War.

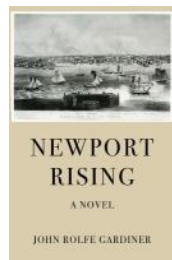


### SOUND THE TRUMPET

A young British man who comes to America as a bound servant serves his time, but after a tragic family loss, he moves to Boston, and becomes involved in the American Revolution.

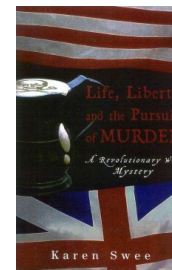
### NEWPORT RISING

In Newport, Rhode Island, Cotton Palmer, journeyman printer, cuts a dangerous path between colonists who might shoot him and the British who hope to hang him.



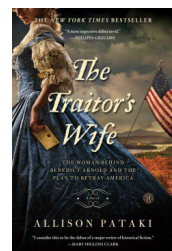
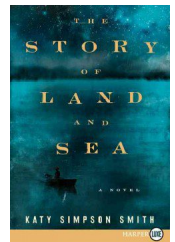
### LIFE, LIBERTY, AND THE PURSUIT OF MURDER

Follows fathers and daughters, mother and son, and master and slave as they search for redemption during a time of war.



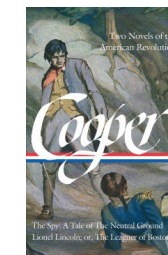
### THE TRAITOR'S WIFE
