
featuring the Leesburg Flower and Garden Show

Day 3 - Sunday, April 2019

On the final morning, continue to Middleburg, VA, and tour the National Sporting Library and Museum, home to a collection of more than 20,000 literary works and 800 pieces of art. Literature and art come together in the library's collection of "fore-edge" books. Be sure to ask a librarian what a fore-edge book is!

Time to explore the quaint town of Middleburg with lunch on your own today. Named for being the half-way point between Winchester and Alexandria, Middleburg boasts a history heavily seated in the Civil War. Located along the John Mosby Highway, Middleburg is also well known as the Horse and Hunt Capital of the Nation.

Situated on a picturesque hillside overlooking the Bull Run and Blue Ridge Mountains, **Cana Vineyards** two floor tasting room, deck, porch, and patio are the perfect place to spend the afternoon sipping the wines and enjoying the views. Once a Middleburg hay farm, Cana Vineyards now grows and produces wines of several varietals.
