Oz-Stravaganza

an annual festival celebrating the work of Chittenango's native son L. Frank Baum, author of The Wonderful Wizard of Oz

The Hamilton International **Film Festival**

bringing together award-winning filmmakers and film fans from across the globe for premieres, panel discussions, a red carpet walk and more each July

Tuesdays on the Towpath

a series of recreational bike rides on the Towpath of the Old Erie Canal State Historic Park

Peterboro Civil War Weekend

an annual two-day encampment recreating life during this most extraordinary time in America's history

Madison-Bouckville Antique Week

drawing 2,000 vendors and 50,000 visitors annually - it's the largest outdoor antique event in New York State

The Oneida Community Mansion House National Historic Landmark

a 93,000 square foot mansion that was home to the 19th century utopian Oneida Community





Cazenovia has been featured as one of the "Coolest Small Towns" in America by Budget Travel Magazine.

In the 1880s, New York State produced 80 percent of the nation's hops, most of which were grown in Madison and neighboring counties. Hop farms are returning to the county, fueled by our craft beverage resurgence.

The New York State Anti-Slavery Society held its inaugural meeting in Peterboro in 1835, at the invitation of famed abolitionist and Peterboro resident Gerrit Smith.

Chittenango Falls State Park features a 167-foot waterfall formed 10,000 years ago. It rivals Niagara Falls in height!

Madison County is home to three world-class colleges: Cazenovia College, Colgate University and Morrisville State College.

Muller Hill State Forest in Georgetown is the historical site of the home of Louis A. Muller, a French nobleman who is believed to have returned to France and ascended to the throne as **King Charles X.**
