

Explore "The Valley"

The Matanuska-Susitna Valley encompasses 23,000 square miles of mountains, glaciers, rivers and lakes, and bursts with adventures at every turn in the road. Locals call this region several names – "the Mat-Su Valley" or simply "The Valley" for short. Mat-Su actually is a shortened version of the proper name of the region – Matanuska-Susitna, which represents the two major rivers and valleys that form the region. The Matanuska Valley stretches along the Glenn Highway National Scenic Byway (Highway 1) all the way to Lake Louise. The Parks Highway (Highway 3) takes you north to Denali State Park in the heart of the Susitna Valley. The Valley begins just 35 miles north of Anchorage, making it a convenient destination for a day trip. Better yet, use the Mat-Su as your hub for a Southcentral Alaska adventure. Plan to stay awhile and discover all there is to see and do – you'll definitely say "Yahoo, Mat-Su!"

Passport to Adventure

While the Mat-Su Valley isn't labeled as such on many state maps, you can't miss it. The region is large, diverse and boasts remote wilderness and classic Alaska communities such as Palmer, Wasilla, Big Lake, Houston, Willow, Talkeetna and Glacier View. Each town anchors a distinct region or "country" within the Mat-Su Valley, worth your visit. This guide is organized by those regions, each highlighting a unique geographic draw:

GLACIER COUNTRY – Lake Louise and Matanuska Glacier south to Palmer along the Glenn Highway National Scenic Byway (Hwy. 1), including Chickaloon and Sutton

GOLD RUSH COUNTRY – Includes Hatcher Pass and Independence Mine State Historical Park

LAKE COUNTRY – Wasilla north to Big Lake and Houston along the Parks Highway (Hwy. 3) **DENALI COUNTRY** – including Willow, Talkeetna and Denali State Park

Visitor Information in Every Direction

The Mat-Su Valley, much like Alaska in general, is a big area and can seem overwhelming to first-time visitors. Friendly and helpful resources in every community will help make your trip a success. Stop in and talk with the locals – they can steer you in the right direction.

Along the Glenn Highway, **Alpine Historical Park** at Mile 61.6 has information about the area's rich history, as well as visitor information for the Matanuska Valley. The open-air museum and historical park focuses on the early settlers and the Athabascan cultures in the Sutton and Chickaloon areas.

There's even a replica of a world-famous giant cabbage.

In the small community of Talkeetna, there isn't a visitor information center, but an unmanned kiosk at the corner of Spur Road and Main Street (the main intersection) has a wealth of information about area attractions and lodging opportunities. Also, visit

Glacier View has an informational kiosk located at Mile 99 Glenn Hwy., with information about the region near Matanuska Glacier. Learn more about rafting, glacier trekking and helicopter tours, as well as lodging opportunities.

Find Your Next Adventure

There are no interstate highways in Alaska, although three state highways frame the Mat-Su Valley: the Glenn (Highway 1), Parks (Highway 3) and Denali (Highway 8) highways. The Denali Highway is not paved, but the Glenn and Parks are major highways. If you're a do-it-yourself traveler, fly to Anchorage, rent a car or motorhome and drive to the Mat-Su Valley and let the area be your hub for your adventure. Or, if you prefer more guidance, let tour professionals arrange one-day and multi-day tours with transportation included. Find a list on www.alaskavisit.com.

Choose Mat-Su When You Cruise

The Mat-Su Valley may be miles from the nearest cruise port of call, but it can be a major part of your Alaska cruise vacation. Don't limit yourself to just the coastline when visiting Alaska via a cruise, and add on a land portion – you'll see a whole other side of Alaska! Set aside time before or after your ocean journey to explore Alaska beyond its coastlines. Many companies offer inclusive land tour options to add to your trip, either before you embark or after your cruise. It's also easy to do it yourself with some planning.

The Mat-Su Valley's location is ideal to add a day trip (complete with round-trip transportation), a three-day or even week-long excursion either before or after your Alaska cruise. Take some time and explore Southcentral Alaska, including spectacular views of Denali.

Step off the ship, and in just three days, you can:

- 1. Experience Denali stay in Talkeetna and marvel at the view. The town has a vibe all its own. From Talkeetna, you can flightsee around Denali, take a jet boat trip up the many rivers, raft and hike. The quaint town may be hundreds of miles from the nearest cruise port, but it's a destination you don't want to miss on your land portion.
- 2. Walk on a glacier you can drive up to Matanuska Glacier and trek on it yourself, or hire a guide for an even better experience. If you are short on time, consider a helicopter tour to Knik Glacier.
- Discover our history in the core area of Wasilla and Palmer, visit museums, the Musk Ox Farm and the Iditarod headquarters to learn about the region's rich history and culture.

Do It Yourself

Trail Mix— run, bike or hike

The Mat-Su Valley has more than 2,000 miles of trails, making it a hiker's paradise, regardless of your skill level. Pick a destination, distance and degree of difficulty - the possibilities are limitless in all regions of the Mat-Su Valley. Take the family on a gentle, historic railroad trail near Palmer, or hike a ridge surrounding the mining region of Hatcher Pass, with views of the Matanuska Valley below. Explore the alpine wilderness of the Talkeetna Mountains on foot or ATV, or by professional guide service for even more adventure. For amazing views in just an hour, try the Butte just outside of Palmer. Denali State Park has many trails with views of the Alaska Range, including an ADA-accessible trail at Kesugi Ken Campground. You can find trail maps at www.alaskavisit.com/trails.

Hit the water

The Mat-Su Valley is home to countless rivers, lakes, creeks and streams, so whether you like your water swift or still, the Mat-Su has something for everyone. You can rent a canoe or kayak for a serene afternoon on a lake, or help paddle a raft down a river with an expert guide. The Lynx Lake Canoe Trail in Nancy Lake State Recreation Area off the Parks Highway in Willow offers easy portages between lakes, campgrounds and cabins for rent. Farther north in Denali State Park, you can rent canoes at Byers Lake. Lake Louise (off the Glenn Highway) is also a premier destination for water activities. Lake fishing is one of the Mat-Su Valley's best-kept secrets.

Learn about the Locals

The Mat-Su Valley's history is diverse, from a rich Native Alaskan Athabascan culture to gold mining and agriculture. Find out about this diverse history at one of the many museums.

- The Wasilla Museum (formerly known as the Dorothy Page Museum) is a great place to start. Wander through historic buildings and see exhibits that tell stories of the area's past.
- The Museum of Transportation and Industry is filled with relics from Alaska's past, including air planes, railroad cars and vintage automobiles.
- Palmer's agricultural Colony roots are on display at the Palmer Museum of History and Art and the Colony House Museum.
- Take Talkeetna's 16-site historic town walking tour and learn for yourself how the miners and trappers lived. Don't forget the Talkeetna Historical Society Museum or the Walter Harper Talkeetna Ranger Station to learn about Alaska's mountain climbing legends.
- On the Glenn Highway, stop in at the Alpine Historical Park to learn about the Native Alaskan history of the region.

Marvel at North America's Highest Peak

20,310 ft. Denali is a spectacular sight to behold! Heading north on the Parks Highway (Hwy. 3), you'll get your first glimpse of the mountain in Willow. Farther north in Talkeetna, there are many activities focused on Denali. Walk the lakeside trail around Byers Lake or climb to Kesugi or Curry Ridge in Denali State Park for undisturbed vistas of the "High One." Parks Highway pullouts at mileposts 135 and 147 provide safe areas to capture Denali's grandeur. The K'esugi Ken Campground at Mile 135.4, which opened in 2017, offers amazing views of Denali as well. Dramatic aerial views of Denali's lofty summit, flanking glaciers and granite canyons highlight flightseeing trips from Talkeetna. The southern views of Denali are widely considered the best in Alaska.

Scenic Drives

The Mat-Su Valley is filled with gorgeous scenery – just head out on virtually any highway for a spectacular trip filled with mountains on every side.

Head north on the Glenn Highway National Scenic Byway (Hwy. 1) and enjoy the views of the Chugach and Talkeetna mountains, while the Matanuska River frames your drive. Trek on Matanuska Glacier or try an exciting raft trip through Lion's Head rapids, and stop at a local roadhouse for a tasty lunch or cozy overnight stay.

Drive over Hatcher Pass Road to Willow – it opens to traffic around the Fourth of July and stays open until mid-September, weather permitting. Check with Alaska State Parks to confirm the road is open if you are traveling in early summer or late fall. Visit Independence Mine and Willow Creek for a scenic loop of the Susitna Valley. Keep an eye out for the abundant wildlife in the area, including moose and bear.

Petersville Road runs through the rugged mining backcountry of Trapper Creek in Denali Country – watch for wildlife and have your camera ready! This is a rugged drive, so be sure your vehicle is capable of the drive.

Day Trips from Anchorage

Less than an hour's drive north from Anchorage, the Mat-Su Valley is perfectly situated for day trips.

Strike it Rich – head to Hatcher Pass, Independence Mine and the Willow area to see mining's historical influence on the area. Don't forget your gold pan. There are many hiking trails, and the views are spectacular as well.

Get Cultured - visit Wasilla and Palmer in an afternoon – you'll see the Iditarod Headquarters, a variety of museums, the Palmer Musk Ox Farm and the Reindeer Farm. Take a farm tour to see Palmer's historical roots, and stop at a local restaurant for an Alaska Grown lunch.

Go Big – as in Denali. North of Wasilla on the Parks Highway, you can visit Talkeetna for an afternoon spent flightseeing, dining, shopping, rafting or just photographing Denali. It's a great way to spend a leisurely afternoon.

Family Vacations

Bring the whole family to the Mat-Su Valley for an exciting, and educational, experience.

Go fossil hunting along the Glenn Highway, gold panning in Hatcher Pass, bird viewing on the Palmer Hay Flats State Game Refuge, camping and more.

There are endless hiking opportunities for people of all ages and abilities, or rent a canoe and take advantage of Nancy Lake State Recreation Area for exciting outdoor fun. Try Hatcher Pass for a great day trip with lots of views.

Fun for all ages, Friday Flings, Colony Days or the Alaska State Fair are fantastic community celebrations in downtown Palmer. Don't forget about Wasilla's annual Fourth of July parade and picnic.



Wildlife and Parks

Part of Our Nature

Alaskans flock to the Mat-Su Valley for its many outdoor recreation opportunities. There are several popular and well-established state parks, from Palmer to Denali. The Mat-Su Valley is where Alaskans come to play! Keep an eye out for wildlife and the scores of migrating birds that come here to nest and raise their young. Be safe, and remember to respect the wildlife.



Moose

Winter and spring are good times to spot these large creatures on the Palmer Hay Flats State Game Refuge. Keep an eye out along the highway, especially near rivers and ponds. Enjoy them from afar – don't try to feed the moose. They are also prominent along the Glenn Highway north to the Sheep Mountain area. Knik River Road off the Old Glenn Highway is another popular spot to view moose.



Caribou

Related to moose and elk, caribou live in the northern and eastern reaches of the Mat-Su Borough. Herds are frequently spotted along the Denali Highway and near Lake Louise, along Hwy. 1.



Bear

Both brown and black bears are found throughout the Mat-Su Valley. Spotting bears is easiest on a flightseeing tour or by hiking off the main road system. They're also found along creeks and streams when the salmon are spawning. Be "bear aware" and carry bear spray. When traveling in the backcountry, be sure to make noise to avoid any potential confrontations.



From bald eagles and red-tailed hawks to songbirds and swans, a wide variety of birds travel through or spend the year in the Mat-Su. Identify them by their calls or keep an eye to the sky. The Palmer Hay Flats and Rabbit Slough, as well as the University of Alaska agriculture fields on Trunk Road, attract many migratory birds such as cranes and geese in spring. Along the Glenn Highway north, watch for migrating hawks, falcons or other raptors. Download an Alaska Birders Checklist at www.alaskavisit.com.

Denali State Park

(2.5 hours north of Anchorage)

The best views of Denali in all of Alaska can be found in Denali State Park, the smaller and less-crowded area south of the national park entrance. The views from Denali State Park are actually better than in the national park! Stop at the Denali Overlook (MP135.2 Parks Hwy) or hike the trail to Kesugi Ridge for incredible views. The newest campground in Alaska, K'esugi Ken, opened in 2017 and is located at Mile 135.4 Parks Hwy. It features easy hiking trails – some are ADA compliant - that have overlooks with panoramic views of Denali and the Alaska Range. Guided or self-guided nature hikes are available around Byers Lake. There are numerous opportunities for tent and RV camping, as well as kayak rentals.

Palmer Hay Flats State Game Refuge

(35 minutes north of Anchorage)

The gateway to the Mat-Su Valley from Anchorage, this refuge has endless photography and recreation possibilities, including kayaking, canoeing and hiking. Birders, wildflower lovers and outdoor enthusiasts flock to the area. Access hiking trails from the Knik River exit (Reflections Lake) or Cottonwood Creek in Wasilla (Scout Ridge Trail). Reflections Lake also has fantastic recreational opportunities in the winter, with ice skating and cross-country skiing trails.


Nancy Lake State Recreation Area

(1.5 hours north of Anchorage)

Near Willow, this network of 130 lakes features camping areas, canoe rentals, and hiking and ski trails. Fish for rainbow trout, arctic char and northern pike. Reserve public-use cabins, available for rent on a nightly basis. Plan ahead and rent your cabin up to six months in advance through the Alaska State Parks' website.

Other State Recreation Areas include Big Lake (north and south), Finger Lake, Independence Mine and Hatcher Pass, Matanuska Lakes, King Mountain, Lake Louise, Matanuska Glacier, Willow Creek and Summit Lake.

The Mat-Su Valley encompasses an area roughly the size of West Virginia, so plan ahead and spend some time exploring. Take a couple days to explore everything there is to offer.

Talkeetna Winterfest

A month-long celebration that features various activities, including the internationally recognized Talkeetna Bachelor Society Auction & Ball and Wilderness Woman Competition, which is held the first Saturday of December. Community activities held throughout December. (907) 315-8012. www.talkeetnachamber.org

Colony Christmas in Palmer

A "Norman Rockwell"-style Christmas celebration, featuring a tree lighting ceremony, horse-drawn carriage rides, fireworks, a parade of lights and of course, Santa Claus. Held the second weekend in December. (907) 745-2880. www.palmerchamber.org

Willow Winter Carnival

A celebration of winter includes dog sled races, snowmobile racing, arts and crafts, and even outhouse races. Last weekend in January and first weekend in February. (907) 495-6800. www.waco-ak.org

Iron Dog

The world's longest snowmobile race begins on Big Lake on Feb. 16, 2020. Racers travel all the way to Nome, before turning around and finishing in Fairbanks, a race of more than 2,000 miles. www.irondog.org

Iditarod Trail Invitational

One of the most grueling events in the world, racers depart Knik Lake on March 1, 2020 and head out in the remote wilderness. Snowshoes, bikes or cross-country skis are their only modes of transportation, and the finish line is 350 miles away in McGrath, or 1,000 miles away in Nome. www.iditarodtrailinvitational.com

World Famous Iditarod Sled Dog Race

Known around the world, the Iditarod begins on Willow Lake on March 8, 2020. Racers and their teams of dogs traverse their way to Nome. The restart is family-friendly and a great chance to meet a famous musher. (907) 376-5155. www.iditarod.com

See a whole new side of Alaska by visiting in the winter. The Mat-Su Valley is an ideal winter destination. An exciting new development in 2019-2020 is the Mat-Su Valley's first-ever lift access ski area, Skeetawk, located in beautiful Hatcher Pass. The ski area is set to open around February 2020 and operate Fridays through Sundays, weather permitting. It features a triple chair lift based at Mile 10.6 Palmer Fishhook Road, on the way up Hatcher Pass. Visit www.skeetawk.com for current conditions, hours and more. The Hatcher Pass area gets some of Southcentral Alaska's best snow and has world-class Nordic skiing trails at Government Peak. Whether you prefer first tracks in fresh powder or groomed trails, the Mat-Su is the place to be.

Removed from city lights, our starry darkness sets the stage for the brilliant colors of the northern lights. From alpenglow sunsets on Denali to the fresh, deep snow covering our lakes and peaks, you'll find yourself inspired and invigorated by a winter visit. A guided snowmobile trip to a local glacier is an unforgettable experience. Plan a trip before it melts.

Where to go; What to do

Escape the city lights of Anchorage for a view of our spectacular *Northern Lights* in Hatcher Pass, Knik River Valley or Denali State Park. Clear nights, January through April, are best. Dress warm!

Follow the Iditarod - watch the restart on Willow Lake or plan a day trip to an official checkpoint such as Skwentna or Rainy Pass. Cheer on your favorite mushers and their dog teams. Packaged Iditarod tours are available.

Visit a working *sled dog kennel* and find out what it takes to lead a team of huskies. Several Iditarod mushers offer sled tours throughout the year. Enjoy an exhilarating ride in the basket of the sled of an Iditarod champion, or try your hand at leading a team.

Explore our endless fields of snow by renting a snowmobile and picking up a trail map, or for a grand adventure, take a guided snowmobile excursion into *Alaska's backcountry*. No experience necessary. Several guided tours go right up to glaciers.

Glide on the rails of the *Alaska Railroad* and stop in Talkeetna to see Denali's towering alpenglow peak. Rail service is available northbound on Saturdays and southbound on Sundays only during the winter, with some mid-week trains available later in the winter. Combine it with a pie-making class at the famous Talkeetna Roadhouse.

Ice-fish for land-locked salmon, rainbow trout, arctic char and northern pike. Many Mat-Su Valley lakes are stocked throughout the year. Guides have all the gear and the knowledge you need to get started.

Cruise the skies on a flightseeing adventure of Knik Glacier and Chugach State Park, or Denali and the Alaska Range. Many say winter is the best time to see these peaks.

Grab your skis and head to *Hatcher Pass*. Government Peak has a warming chalet to complement the five kilometers of *world-class groomed Nordic trails*. If downhill is your preference, visit Skeetawk, the Mat-Su Valley's first lift access ski area at mile 10.6 on Fishhook Road.

Glacier Country

Glaciers & Giant Veggies

The Matanuska Valley was carved by glaciers thousands of years ago, and their impact remains today. The fine, fertile silt left behind by these receding glaciers, combined with long daylight hours in the summer, makes the area perfect for growing lush hayfields and world-record veggies. The Palmer area is the agricultural hub of Alaska - look for Alaska Grown vegetables! You'll be able to taste the difference – carrots are typically sweeter than those grown in the "Lower 48," for example.

- In Sutton and Chickaloon, learn about the region's rich Athabascan culture at the Alpine Historical Park.
- In the Glacier View area, explore Matanuska Glacier on a trek or ice climb. Easy to get
 to, it's Alaska's largest road-accessible glacier. You can do it on your own, or go out
 with one of the many companies who guide on the glacier they know the
 best spots.
- Explore the northern region of Glacier Country by visiting Lake Louise, located halfway between Anchorage and Valdez, just 19 miles off the scenic Glenn Highway.
 The peaceful lake is a hub of recreational opportunities in both summer and winter. The Nelchina caribou herd migrates through this area each year. Lodges, campgrounds and a public boat launch are available.
- Closer to Palmer, boat, helicopter or take an ATV tour to Knik Glacier. This is only an hour from Anchorage. Stop at a roadside stand or farmers market for fresh organic vegetables, wild honey or dairy products.

Palmer

Just 45 minutes north of Anchorage, this small town takes pride in its agricultural roots while nurturing a contemporary, Alaska "chic." The downtown area is very walkable and features locally-owned shops and cafes. In 1935, President Franklin D. Roosevelt sanctioned a relocation program that brought 203 farming families to Palmer from the Midwest. Parcels of land were distributed to the "colonists" by lottery to farm and raise

dairy cattle. Celebrate the anniversary of this historic event in June at Colony Days. Start your stay at the Palmer Visitor Information Center, which has an amazing garden and replicas of those giant vegetables. Pick up a downtown walking map while you're there and tour the original Matanuska Colony. You can rent a headset for a narrated self-guided historical walking tour of the town, or take the guided tour every day at 1 p.m. On Fridays, an open-air market, featuring local artisans and growers, opens across from the center. Just up the street, tour a restored Colony home (circa 1935). And don't forget Palmer's most celebrated attraction, the Alaska State Fair, which takes place Aug. 27 to Sept. 7, 2020.

Farms & Culture

A rich Athabascan culture
The Chickaloon Native Village is a rich
Ahtna Athabascan tribe in Sutton, along
the Matanuska River on the Glenn
Highway. The tribe has occupied the
area for 10,000 years; their culture
and traditional way of life has been
unwavering. In the Ahtna language,
Chickaloon means "the river with the two
logs across it." Stop at Alpine Historical
Park to learn more about the history.




Where to go; What to do

Don't miss the Alaska State Fair

Alaska's largest event, the Alaska State Fair, takes place in Palmer every August to early September. It's 12 days of fun, food and excitement, and there is something for every visitor.

The fair runs Aug. 27-Sept. 7, 2020 and is the best place to see giant vegetables for which the Palmer area is so famous. There are "weigh-off" competitions for pumpkins and cabbages at the fair, and they bring them in on giant pallets to be weighed in an arena, in front of the audience. In 2019, a record 2,051 pound pumpkin was entered.

In addition to the giant vegetables, the Alaska State Fair features numerous exhibits, cultural celebrations, concerts, live performances and much more - you'll want to plan to stay an extra day to take it all in.

Hatcher Pass

Just 1.5 hours from Anchorage, Hatcher Pass is a locals' favorite. The area is home to Independence Mine State Historical Park, but also features a wealth of year-round multi-use trails and limitless alpine terrain. Hike, bike or snowmobile. Some hot spots include Reed Lakes, Craigie Creek, Gold Mint and Gold Cord trails. The area offers world-class hiking with breathtaking views of the valley below. With the headwaters of the Little Susitna River originating here, avid kayakers will find the excitement of Class V whitewater appealing.

Winter sports enthusiasts flock to Hatcher Pass. The winter of 2019-2020 features the inaugural season at Skeetawk, the Mat-Su Valley's first-ever lift access downhill skiing area. The Government Peak Recreation Area, at the base of Hatcher Pass, offers 6.5 kilometers of Nordic skiing trails designed by a former Olympian. Snowmobiling is permitted in designated areas and is very popular west of the pass.



Independence Mine

Once a bustling mining camp, Independence Mine is now on the National Register of Historic Places. You can wander amid the preserved ruins. Independence Mine covers 271 acres and includes restored structures and interpretive displays connected by easily accessible, paved walking paths. The visitor center museum (formerly the mine manager's home) is open and provides daily tours of the Park from mid-to late-June through early September.



Gold Fever!

Gold played a pivotal role in establishing many of Alaska's communities, including Hatcher Pass. One of the first discoveries in the Mat-Su happened in 1896 by Robert Lee Hatcher. In 1941, with 83 mining claims, the Alaska-Pacific Consolidated Mining Co. was the largest producer in the mining district, employing more than 200 workers, opening nearly a dozen miles of tunnels, and producing more than 34,000 ounces of gold. Today you can catch a glimpse of what mining was like at the Independence Mine State Historical Park located in Hatcher Pass. Grab your gold pan and see if you have the same luck.



Where to go; What to do

Pick blueberries in the alpine fields or photograph spectacular wildflowers. Berry picking is at its peak in late summer and early fall.

Deep snow and treeless slopes provide perfect terrain for backcountry winter enthusiasts on both sides of Hatcher Pass. The northern lights are best viewed here.

Explore abandoned buildings and machinery from a 200-worker camp and gold mining operation, one of Alaska's biggest gold producers until World War II.

Wasilla is the largest city in the Mat-Su Valley and is a hub of commerce, as a variety of national and local retailers can be found. Fresh produce is available weekly at a farmers market.

Wasilla was originally founded to be a supply crossroads for gold mines at Willow Creek Mining District. The Alaska Railroad built lines through the town to Fairbanks in 1917, providing an immediate "boom" to the area. Today, Wasilla remains one of the fastest-growing communities in Alaska.



Where to go; What to do

Learn about the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race and take a dog sled ride at Iditarod
Trail Headquarters.

Step back in time at the Wasilla Museum, where some of the original townsite has been restored.

The Museum of Alaska Transportation & Industry is filled with exhibits, planes, railroad cars and vintage automobiles.



Big Lake

With 67 miles of shoreline, the size of this lake is downright remarkable. Big Lake is a local favorite because of its many recreational opportunities, both in summer and winter. Boating, fishing and riding personal watercraft highlight summer activities. In the winter, the frozen lake allows for Alaska activities such as snowmobiling, dog mushing and cross-country skiing. Terrific views north, east and west toward the towering Alaska and Talkeetna ranges abound. Camp under the midnight sun or stay and dine at one of several area lodges and bed-and-breakfasts.




Houston

Located on the banks of the Little Susitna River along the Parks Highway, this colorful town offers a gentle river to float with great salmon fishing. In the winter, come back and give a snowmobile or sled dog tour a go to feel the crisp air as you zip through the countryside blanketed with pristine snow.





There are a number of public-use cabins available for rent through the Alaska State Parks. These remote cabins are rustic but offer a true Alaska experience in the outdoors. Mat-Su: Fish-On!

The Mat-Su Valley has several thousand miles of fishable rivers, streams and lakes. Best of all, our fishing is accessible - bank-side off the road, by air taxi to remote spots or contact one of our local expert fishing guides.

The Susitna River drainage has several small creeks and tributaries that are easily accessible via the Parks Highway (Hwy. 3) and feature salmon as well as rainbow trout, grayling and pike. At many of these places, you can walk right up to a fishing hole. Spirited silver salmon run strong in the drainage in mid- to late- summer. In the fall, rainbow trout fishing is exceptional. Make sure you check local regulations before heading out, and purchase a fishing license. Use the chart below to gauge when the fish will be running.





Denali Country

Towering Peaks, Abundant Wildlife, Iconic Towns

The first grand views of Denali are along the Parks Highway (Hwy. 3) on the way to Willow. While you're there, take advantage of the campgrounds, fishing streams, snowmobile trails and dog mushing tours (yes, even in the summer). Paddle the Nancy Lake State Recreation Area canoe trail and spend a night in a public-use cabin. This area is very popular among locals for the many outdoor recreational opportunities.



Talkeetna

Talkeetna has a unique vibe all its own. This small town is the staging area for the more than 1,000 climbers who attempt to climb Denali each spring. On average, only 50 percent of them make the summit. In May and June, you can spot climbers milling around town or having breakfast at Talkeetna Roadhouse. The first successful summit of Denali was June 7, 1913 by a party led by Hudson Stuck. Alaska Native Walter Harper became the first to reach the summit in that party, and the Walter Harper Talkeetna Ranger Station bears his name today. They ascended via the Muldrow Glacier route, which is still a popular route. Located at the confluence of three major rivers, Talkeetna keeps its mining history alive with renovated miners' cabins used as lodging,

shops and restaurants. Here you'll find one of Alaska's top breweries, a number of great restaurants and shops that sell goods made by local artists.

The rivers also lend to a multitude of activities such as guided river rafting, boat tours and sport fishing. The Alaska Railroad stops daily in the summer and weekly in winter. Spend a day perusing the many shops that feature local artisans. Flightseeing trips around Denali are spectacular, and depart from Talkeetna daily.

Trapper Creek/Petersville

Petersville Road extends nearly 35 miles from Trapper Creek into the Dutch Hills, offering spectacular views of Denali. The rugged, scenic gravel road is ideal for mountain biking or snowmobiling in the winter. (In the summer, 4-wheel drive vehicles are recommended after the first 10 miles.)

The Mat-Su Valley is a birder's paradise, with opportunities to see hundreds of species of birds throughout the year. Thousands of migratory birds come through the Mat-Su Valley each year, while

countless others call the Valley home full time. Keep your eyes to the skies, as you'll undoubtedly see eagles and Palmer Hay Flats State Game Refuge is one of the most popular birding spots in all of Alaska. Raptors such as the Northern Harrier, Rough-legged hawk and short-eared owl can be seen regularly during migration. Additionally, warblers, sparrows, thrushes and other songbirds frequent the area. This area has been designated as an Highway National Scenic Byway, the Sheep Mountain area is popular, particularly during late April when the annual Hawkwatch takes place. Some difficult to find species that White-winged Crossbill and the Northern Hawk Owl.


