This popular focal point is seen in TV shows and movies filmed here. and thanks to lights added to it in 2019, it is visible at night from multiple locations in the city.



You'll need to go just a few blocks east of the downtown square to find this marker and building. It closed in 1902 when Collin County voters supported prohibition.



You can find this Texas Highway Department marker in the center of the square, but on what side of the historic county courthouse is it located?



This fountain sits in the center of a park surrounded by benches in the shade of nearby trees as well as two statues. Many years ago, this park was the site of a hospital.



These clocks are located high above the square. This building was constructed in 1874 and remodeled in 1927. It is now an arts center hosting all kinds of art.




This little chicken has been a favorite sight on the downtown square for many years, welcoming visitors to the boutique it represents.

Built in 1914, this old flour mill is now a popular wedding and meeting venue as well as offices. The grain silos still hold grain and still function regularly.



This gold eagle watches over the square atop a landmark building that formerly housed a bank. The building's exterior looks just as it did when it was built in 1869.



This mixed-media mural covers the south wall of the Chestnut Commons parking garage and greets people as they come into the square from the east.
