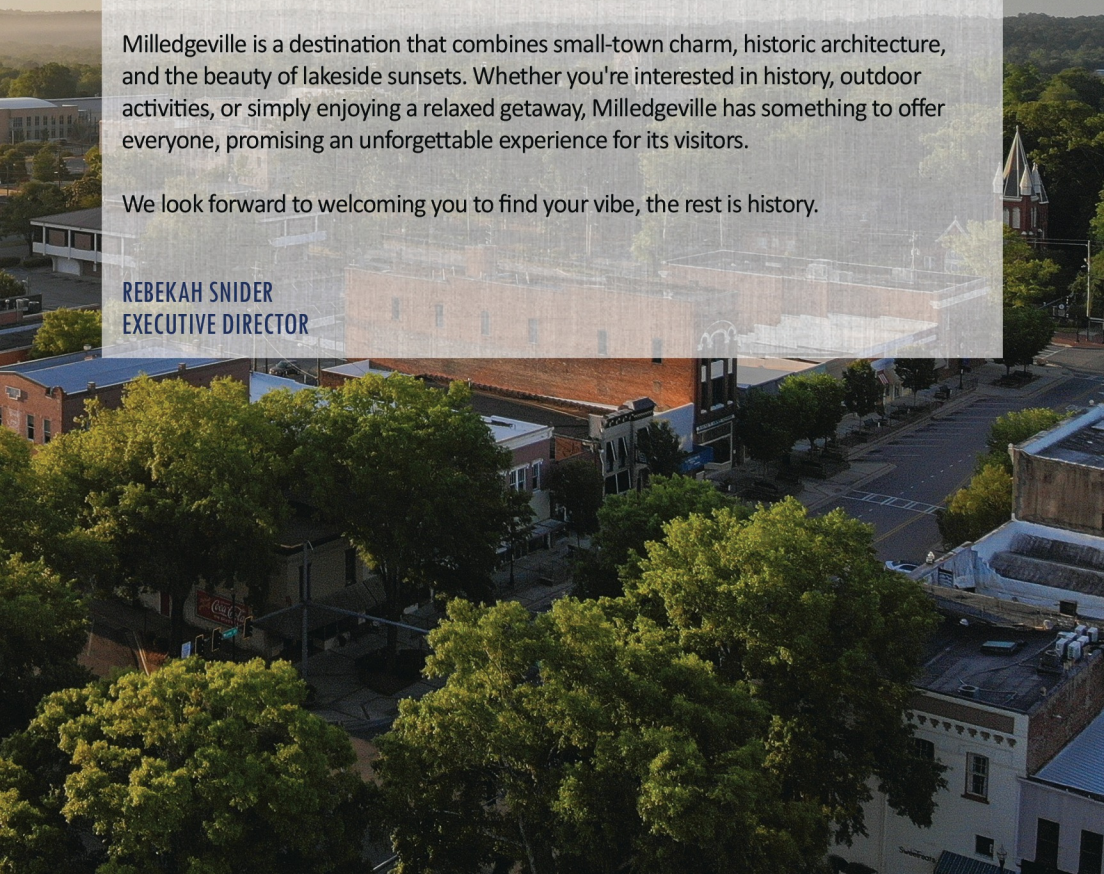

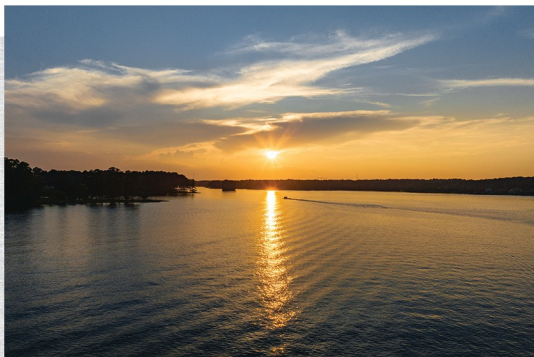

## ON THE COVER:

Lake Sinclair is a peaceful retreat that's home to refreshing waters, easy-to-use outfitters, plentiful small-town charm, and a fishermen's tall tale or two.

Encompassing 15,300 acres of winding coves and several vast stretches of open water, Lake Sinclair offers a variety of

experiences. Created by Georgia Power in 1953, Lake Sinclair is two hours southeast of Atlanta and minutes from downtown Milledgeville making it easy access for fishing, tournaments, swimming, boating, camping, and has several marinas for the convenience of visitors. If you don't have a boat, no problem, many area marinas rent them by the half or full day.







Renowned as one of America's greatest short-story authors, Flannery O'Connor completed the bulk of her literary work while living for 13 years at **ANDALUSIA**, the farm is open for public tours.

Outdoor enthusiasts are offered three looping trails at **BARTRAM FOREST** through pines, and meadows, across a creek, and alongside a pond.

Since its founding in 1842, the **CENTRAL STATE HOSPITAL CAMPUS** has been one of Milledgeville's most well-known and complex sites, for those interested in exploring the history of the former behavioral health institution, regular trolley tours are your perfect chance.

Each fall, the **DEEP ROOTS FESTIVAL** in downtown Milledgeville is the place to be with an antique car show, live entertainment ranging from magicians to rock-and-roll, an artist market, food trucks, and a KidZone.

Take a self-guided tour to learn the stories and heritage of the historic **EDDY NEIGHBORHOOD** which helped shape Milledgeville's African-American history for over a century.





The excitement of **FISHING** for a record-breaking catfish is accessible at the series of docks at T.D. Cheek Fishing Pier on Lake Sinclair, maintained by Georgia Power and open year-round.

Hear about Milledgeville's spooky and sinister past during the **GHOSTS OF MILLEDGEVILLE WALKING TOURS**.

Dive deeper into knowledge at **HERITAGE HALL**, home of Georgia College's special collections.

Join in a friendly game of **PICKLEBALL** on one of 8 courts at Walter B Williams Park.

**QUIRKY QUESADILLAS** are just one imaginative option at Bollywood Tacos where Mexican and Indian flavors fuse together.

Gaze at the stars as you drift off to sleep in one of Milledgeville's **RV CAMPSITES**.

Learn about the life and legacy of one of Baldwin County's most passionate and influential educators at the **SALLIE ELLIS DAVIS HOUSE**.

Hop aboard the town's most iconic resident "Milly" for a fully narrated **TROLLEY TOUR** of Milledgeville's historic district featuring grand architecture, beautiful squares, and historic neighborhoods.

#### IF YOU LIKE BLACKBIRD, TRY:

Specializing in coffee, including espresso creations, cold brew, hot coffee, and more, **Morning Grind** is the perfect place to stop in and grab a pick me up.



## KAI THAI

**Kai Thai**, a town favorite, transports you to an Asian-inspired meal with many great Thai offerings and an extensive sushi menu. The most popular dishes include pad thai, fried rice, and their Dynamite Roll made with crab, cream cheese, and avocado, topped with salmon and crunch flakes and baked.

### IF YOU LIKE KAI THAI, TRY:

Get ready for authentic Tonkotsu Ramen made with Chashu, pork broth with roasted pork belly, soft boiled egg and scallions at **Miso Hawngry**, a fun little place serving Ramen, Pokè, and Sushi Bowls.



## DOODLE'S BAKERY

A cupcake from **Doodle's Bakery** is a delicacy in Milledgeville. Their rich icing and moist cake will make you wonder how you've survived your whole life without trying a Doodle's cupcake. Doodle's does not stop at cupcakes, their menu offers everything from cakes, pies, and cookies to casseroles, quiches and chicken salad.

# Georgia's Capital HISTORY EXPERIENCES

Founded in 1803 around a series of beautiful squares and wide streets, Milledgeville was designed to be the new capital city of Georgia. For more than 60 years, she remained the capital. Our rich assortment of historic sites, houses, churches and museums provide visitors with a unique ambiance to learn about a fascinating time of our nation's history. Stroll oak lined streets to get lost in our historical grandeur.

## *Georgia's Old Capitol Building*

Once determined Milledgeville was the new Capital of Georgia, the highest point in the city was reserved for the Statehouse Square. In 1805 construction began and The Old Capitol Building became the first public building ever designed in the United States in the Gothic Revival style. Significant expansions were added to the building with north and south wings built c. 1828 and 1834. The work was directed by architect Henry Hamilton, who added the crenellations and a plaster skin. The beautiful east and west porticoes with their granite steps were added in 1835, completing the building to the appearance it maintains today. It served as the seat of government for the State of Georgia from 1807 to 1868.

## *Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion*

Completed in 1839, Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion is one of the finest examples of High Greek Revival architecture in the nation. Serving as the residence for Georgia's chief executives for over thirty years, the Mansion's history encompasses the antebellum, Civil War, and early Reconstruction phases of the state's history.

## Historic Trolley Tours

Hop aboard the town's most iconic resident "Milly the Trolley" for a sixty minute tour providing an overview of Milledgeville's history during its sixty-eight year period as the capital city of Georgia. During the course of the tour, guests will pass grand architecture, beautiful squares and historic neighborhoods, and will be escorted on a guided walk through the former statehouse square and St. Stephens Episcopal Church, consecrated in 1843.

## Memory Hill Cemetery

Originally designated as one of the four public squares of twenty acres each in the Milledgeville town plan of 1803, it later came to be known as Cemetery Square. Many people associated with Milledgeville and Georgia history, such as L.Q.C. Lamar, Congressman Carl Vinson, and Flannery O'Connor, as well as early Georgia governors, legislators, college presidents, enslaved people, and soldiers, are buried here.

## Rose Hill

This Greek Revival home, circa 1852, is the centerpiece of Lockerly Arboretum. In 1839 the original home was built on this property. In 1851, Daniel R. Tucker purchased the property and in February of that year the house was "entirely consumed" by fire. Tucker built a new home in 1852 on the site that still stands today.

## Did you know:

Built in 1838, the grand Rockwell House, once home to a Georgia governor, features handcrafted architectural details highlighted by a delightfully fresh interior design and is presently available for guests to stay overnight.

## *Lake Sinclair*

**BOATING AND JET SKIING:** Rent a boat or jet ski from one of the local marinas and set off on the sparkling waters of Lake Sinclair. Feel the cool breeze as you cruise along the lake, explore secluded coves, or anchor at the popular sandbar for swimming.

**FISHING:** Lake Sinclair is renowned for its excellent fishing opportunities. Cast your line and try your luck at catching largemouth bass, striped bass, crappie, and catfish. Whether you're a seasoned angler or a beginner, the lake's abundant fish population ensures an exciting day on the water.

**WATER SPORTS:** If you're seeking an adrenaline rush, indulge in water sports such as wakeboarding, water skiing, or tubing. With its vast expanse and calm waters, Lake Sinclair provides an ideal playground for these exhilarating activities. Bring your own gear or rent equipment from local outfitters.

**CANOEING AND KAYAKING:** For a more leisurely experience, explore Lake Sinclair's scenic shoreline and peaceful inlets by canoe or kayak. Enjoy the tranquil surroundings, observe wildlife, and immerse yourself in the serenity of nature.



# Oconee River

**KAYAKING AND CANOEING:** Embark on a river adventure by kayaking or canoeing along the beautiful Oconee River. Experience the river's gentle flow, navigate through lush greenery, and keep an eye out for wildlife along the banks. Bring your own equipment or rent from local outfitters.

**FISHING:** The Oconee River is a haven for anglers, offering a variety of fish species,

including bass, catfish, and bream. Find a quiet fishing spot along the riverbank, cast your line, and savor the tranquility as you wait for your next big catch.

**GUIDED RIVER TOURS:** If you prefer a guided experience, join one of the local outfitters that offer guided excursions along the Oconee River. On full-moon nights, book a paddle trip after dark to cruise in the moonlight.

## WHERE TO GET ON THE WATER

**T. D. Cheek Fishing Pier** is a great series of docks over the water of Lake Sinclair. This Georgia Power maintained public fishing pier is open year-round and free to the public.

A Georgia Power Park, **Rocky Creek** is a popular day-use access to Lake Sinclair with a boat ramp, picnic area, walking trail, and banks to fish from. There is a \$5 parking fee.

The **lower Oconee River** trip, from the Oconee River Greenway to the Central State Boat ramp, is recommended for a relaxing river day as the float takes about 2 ½ - 3 hours.

For a bit more of a challenge, the **upper Oconee River** trip starts at the Sinclair Dam for a 2 1/2 hour stretch through a few rapids to the Oconee River Greenway--advised for people with some kayak experience!

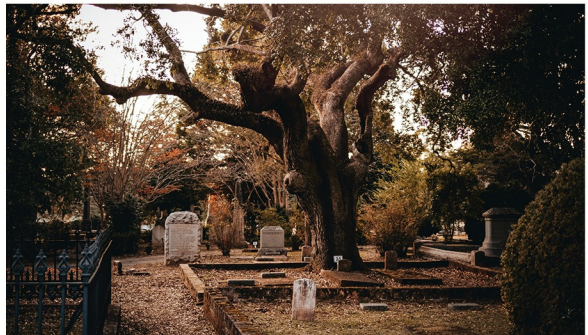

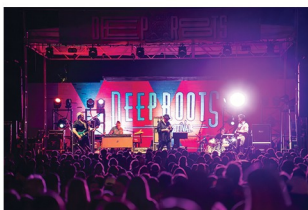
