MOBILE ALABAMA CRUISE TERMINAL DIRECTIONS

BY CAR

201 South Water St.,
Mobile, AL 36602

FROM HOWEST

- Take Exit 26A to Water St.
- Right on Eslava St.

FROM I-10 EAST

- Take Exit 25A to Texas St.
- Turn left on Texas St.
- Turn left back onto I-10 East ramp.

- On I-10 East take Exit 26A to Water St.
- Right on Eslava St.

FROM I-65 NORTH

- Take Exit 9 to I-165 south until it ends at Water St.
- Bear right on Water St. avoiding I-10 ramp.
- Follow U-turn sign to terminal past Monroe St. to turn back to Eslava St.

BY AIR

BY BUS

Greyhound Bus Lines has a terminal located at 2545 Government Blvd, Mobile, AL 11 minutes and 4.2 miles from the terminal.

Megabus has service to and from Atlanta, Gainesville, Montgomery, Tallahassee, New Orleans, and Orlando. Their terminal is located at the GM&O Transit Center at 110 Beauregard St., Mobile, AL 36602 just four minutes from the terminal.

CRUISE TERMINAL PARKING



Pay in advance, no more lines, just drive in and park.

The Mobile Alabama Cruise Terminal has a state of the art parking payment system allowing for pre-payment online, text to pay while at the terminal on cruise days, payment via our parking provider's app, Premium Parking, or payment with a credit card or cash at one of the payment kiosks located on every garage floor near the elevators. Please note: online pre-payment of parking guarantees you a parking spot at the terminal or our offsite parking location. On days when our parking garage fills, parkers are directed to our offsite location at the Mobile Civic Center. A free shuttle will transport you to and from the terminal from our offsite location.

Rates: Parking is \$18 per day for regular size vehicle (1 parking spot), \$36 per day for RVs/Oversize vehicles, \$54 a day for buses (motor coaches).

Carnival Cruise passengers, got some time to kill? Waiting to board your cruise ship? There are nearly forty restaurants, bars, delis and cafes in downtown Mobile, and we've also compiled a suggested list of activities you can do in two, four and six hours in Mobile. Stop by the Visit Mobile Welcome Center at 111 S. Royal Street for more information.

TWO HOURS

MARITIME: About 230 steps from the Mobile Alabama Cruise Terminal (yes, we counted!) is the one-of-a-kind GulfQuest National Maritime Museum of the Gulf of Mexico. GulfQuest is the first and only museum dedicated to the Gulf Coast's rich maritime traditions from its discovery in the 1500s to the present day and one of the only interactive maritime museums in the country. So before you head out into the Gulf, learn all about the Gulf. It'll make your cruise that much more interesting, believe us! (Hours and days of operation vary, so be sure to call 251-436-8901.)

PORT & FORT: The downtown waterfront of Mobile, Alabama, is full of rich history, culture and economic importance to the region. This bustling port welcomes ships from all over the world along with tugboats and barges that roam the many rivers of North America. See them all up close from a United States Coast Guard Certified passenger vessel with WildNative Tours. The city skyline, maritime museum, Austal shipyards, cruise terminal and cruise ship are also seen on this tour. Courteous and knowledgeable guides will educate and entertain as you cruise these local waters. After your port tour, be sure to visit the Fort of Colonial Mobile, an immersive, interactive exhibit about the people who colonized early Mobile.

FOUR HOURS

HISTORY LOVERS: Take a historic city tour, starting at the Visit Mobile Welcome Center (located at 111 S. Royal St. downtown), by foot, Segway, car, van, trolley or duck boat. These usually last an hour to an hour and a half, which leaves plenty of time to explore historic downtown Mobile on foot. Discover the History Museum of Mobile and the Mobile Carnival Museum or hop across the Mobile River to board an authentic World War II battleship, the USS ALABAMA.

SHOPAHOLICS: Several new locally owned clothing boutiques, gift shops, vintage and antique stores and art galleries (some will ship your purchases home!) are located within blocks of each other in downtown Mobile. We know you'll be grabbing some souvenirs in the Caribbean, but hey, taking a little bit of Mobile home with you is pretty awesome, too.

FAMILY FUN: The Gulf Coast Exploreum Science Center offers rotating exhibits and permanent activities designed to bring the scientist out in all of us. You'll notice an oyster statue out in front of the Exploreum, which is a great starting point to walk The Oyster Trail throughout downtown Mobile (how many can you visit?) Mobile's newest addition to outdoor family fun is ArtGo, a self-guided free walking trail and outdoor art gallery that leads visitors to 33 public art pieces/installations. Pick up your map at the Mobile Arts Council at 318 Dauphin Street.

SIX HOURS

OUTDOORS: With a little more time on your hands, you can explore a little more of what the entire area has to offer. Bellingrath Gardens and Home is about 45 minutes west of the Mobile Alabama Cruise Terminal - plan to wander amongst the blooms for a few hours. Or head east, just a few minutes from downtown and take an airboat ride, sightseeing cruise or guided kayak/canoe tours of the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta (the views are a little different from the deck of the cruise ship but fascinating just the same!)

HISTORY AND CULTURE LOVERS: There are several historic homes in or near downtown, each offering guided tours. Pick up a Historic Homes brochure at the Visit Mobile Welcome Center (located at 111 S. Royal St. in downtown) and plan to visit all five. Before you hit the sea, stop by the Mobile Medical Museum, the Archaeology Museum at the University of South Alabama and make plans to see the largest art museum on the Gulf Coast, the Mobile Museum of Art.

Or, just come in the day before so you'll have plenty of time to play, explore, eat, drink, shop, paddle or simply relax before you head out to sea!
