EXPERIENCE AMERICA'S TOP ROAD TRIP

Monterey County is committed to promoting responsible travel. As you make your way down scenic Highway 1, make sure to respect the natural beauty that makes the central coast so unique.

Traveling responsibly minimizes negative impacts on the environment and natural resources, and plays an integral role in the protection and preservation of the destination. Please follow these simple dos and don'ts as you visit Monterey County, responsibly.

DO:

Be Prepared – Highway 1 is big on beauty and small on cell phone service. Discuss meeting locations and stops prior to your trip and bring hard copies of travel material such as maps, itineraries and booking confirmations.

Plan Ahead - Restrooms are scarce along Highway 1. Check out the map on the back for public restroom locations.

Pick Up Your Trash and Recycle – Trash cans are scarce on Highway 1. Pack up your garbage to dispose in the appropriate bins. Always recycle.

Be Mindful of Private Property & Trails – Much of Big Sur land is privately owned. Please be sure to stay on public land and on designated trails.

DON'T:

Start Fires – Please extinguish cigarettes in ashtrays and always be extra careful. Do not start fires unless specifically permitted and deemed safe by authorities.

Collect – Plants, animals, rocks and artifacts of Highway 1 are protected by law and should be left in their natural place.

Set Up Camp on the Roadside – Roadside camping is prohibited along Highway 1 from Carmel River to the Monterey-San Luis Obispo County line. If parking at the first scenic lookout is full, don't crowd it. There will be another in just a mile or two!

Let Pets Run Wild – In state parks and on U.S. Forest Service lands, pets must be leashed at all times in developed campgrounds, picnic and day use areas. This is not only for their safety, but also for the safety of visitors and other local wildlife.
