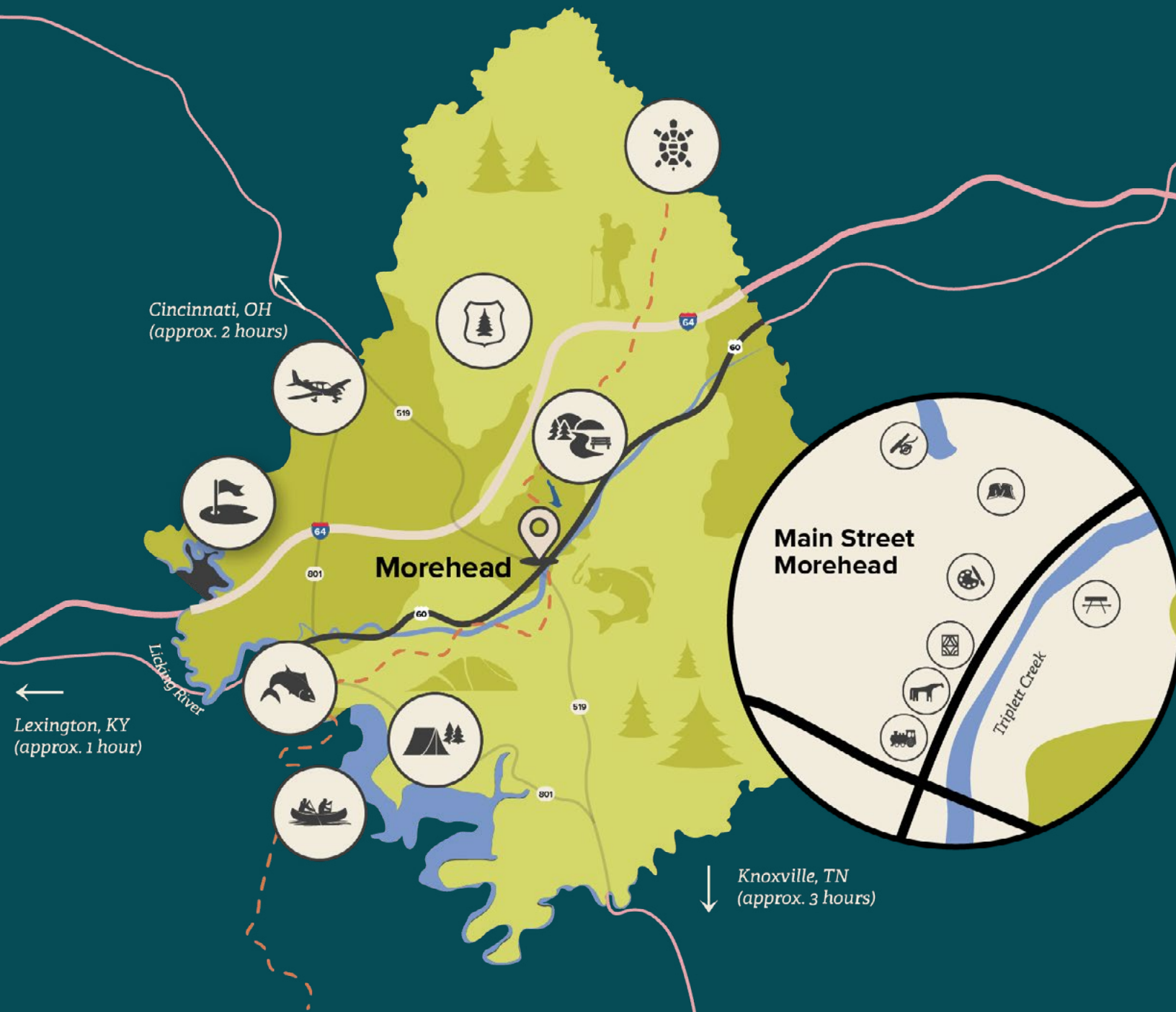

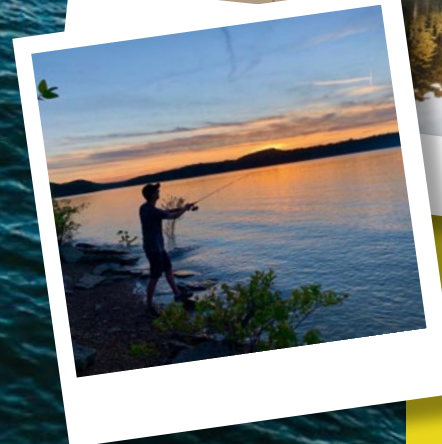
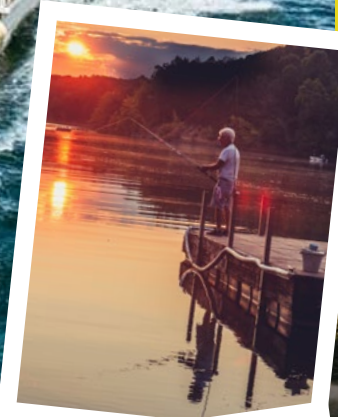

WHERE BIG STORIES AND EVEN BIGGER FISH ARE BORN.

Known as the "Musky Capital of the South," Morehead's Cave Run Lake has earned a legendary reputation for producing some of the biggest muskies in the country—including Kentucky's 54-inch, 47-pound state record caught here in 2008. These apex predators, often called the fish of

10,000 casts, test the patience and skill of even the most seasoned anglers. With torpedo-shaped bodies, lightning-fast strikes reaching up to 30 mph, and barred green-gold coloring that camouflages perfectly in the lake's submerged timber, muskies are born to ambush.

As one of Kentucky's top musky-stocking lakes, Cave Run continues to nurture these homegrown giants, some living nearly 30 years. A native of

the Ohio River basin, the muskellunge (*Esox masquinongy ohioensis*) thrives here, supported by a strong catch-and-release culture that keeps the legend alive. And when autumn cools the water, the muskies move shallow and feed heavy—making fall the perfect time to meet Morehead's most famous fish.

CLARK FISH HATCHERY —

THE QUIET HEARTBEAT OF KENTUCKY'S WATERS

Just downstream from the dam at Cave Run Lake, where mist hangs low over the Licking River and the air hums with the sound of running water, the **MINOR E. CLARK FISH HATCHERY** goes quietly about the business of keeping Kentucky's waters alive. Here, in long rows of raceways and circular tanks, the next generation of muskies, bass, and walleye flicker like liquid gold beneath the surface; proof that conservation in the Bluegrass isn't just a policy, it's a practice.

Every spring, biologists and technicians rise before dawn, checking oxygen levels, counting fry by the thousands, and gently coaxing fingerlings toward their future homes — lakes and rivers across the state. Among the stars of this operation are the muskellunge, Cave Run's claim to fame. From fertilized eggs to finger-long juveniles, these fish are raised with meticulous care until they're ready to meet the wild — the very same waters where, years later, they'll test the patience of an angler waiting on that one legendary strike.

What happens here is equal parts science and stewardship. It's measuring, monitoring, mending — but it's also love of place. The hatchery's work keeps the stories alive: the father teaching his kid to cast from the dock, the flash of silver in the morning sun, the quiet ripple of something ancient beneath the surface.

The next time you stand on the banks of Cave Run and feel that tug on the line, know this — that fish began its journey here, in a quiet corner of Morehead, where Kentucky's future swims in every tank.



Each spring, as redbuds blush along the banks of the Licking River, the muskies begin their annual migration into the tailwater below Cave Run Dam. The current hums with life — and the biologists from the Minor E. Clark Fish Hatchery are right there with it.

Out on flat-bottom boats fitted with long poles and humming electrodes, they drift through the cool water, sending a quick pulse that stuns the fish just long enough for capture. Massive muskies rise to the surface — living proof of the lake's wild strength. They're carefully lifted aboard, measured, and transported to the hatchery, where their eggs and milt are collected by hand in a process equal parts science and ritual.

Within days, the eggs hatch, and thousands of fry flash like silver needles in the raceways — the next generation of Cave Run's legends. Once the work is done, every adult musky is released back into the tailwater, free to swim another season.

For anglers, the spectacle marks the unofficial start of spring — when Kentucky's most elusive predator comes within arm's reach, if only for a moment.

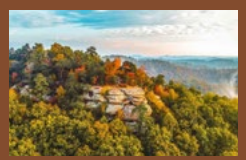

WINDING ROADS & TURNING LEAVES

The hills of Rowan County shift with the season—forests of oak and maple turn brilliant gold and amber. Here, every bend in the road feels like an invitation to linger, to wander, and to watch the year slow down.

There's a certain magic to fall in eastern Kentucky — when the ridges glow like embers and every curve in the road opens to a new wash of color. Around Morehead, those colors come alive along some of the most scenic drives in the state, where the journey is every bit as beautiful as the destination.

Begin your drive on **KY 801**, tracing the winding shoreline of Cave Run Lake. This route offers shimmering water views framed by maples and sweetgums that flare crimson in October light. Detour down **KY 1274** and **KY 519**, where rolling farmland meets the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest, and the trees crowd close to the pavement like a painted tunnel.

For a truly classic Kentucky drive, head out along **U.S. 60**. This scenic highway winds through peaceful valleys, where charming Mom-and-Pop shops dot the roadside, leading you towards open farmland.

As the season deepens, the light softens, the air sharpens, and even a short drive feels like a pilgrimage through color. Whether you're cruising toward a trailhead, chasing the horizon, or simply rolling the windows down to breathe it all in — this is the time of year when the roads in Morehead turn to gold.

In Morehead, craft is not just creation—it's storytelling. Each handmade piece carries a history of the hills, passed from one maker to the next.

ANCHORING THE TRADITION: THE KENTUCKY FOLK ART CENTER (KFAC)

Located in the historic Union Grocery building on First Street, the Kentucky Folk Art Center preserves and interprets the visual traditions of Appalachia. It houses a permanent collection of over 1,500 works of regional folk art, ranging from utilitarian pieces to richly expressive sculptures and paintings.

Rotating exhibits present folk & fine art, textiles, photography, and historical cultural content.

You'll also find a gift shop that supports local makers, and events such as the Appalachian Holiday Arts & Crafts Fair.

THE SPIRIT OF APPALACHIAN CRAFTS

A Morehead original whose carvings helped put Appalachian creativity on the map

Long before Kentucky's hills were known for bourbon trails and lake views, they were known for something quieter — a culture of making. No one embodies that more than Minnie Adkins, the beloved folk artist from Isonville, Kentucky, whose carved animals and storytelling figures have become icons of Appalachian art.

Minnie began whittling as a child, using her father's pocketknife and scraps of wood from the family farm. What started as a pastime turned into a lifetime of artistry — simple forms cut from poplar or maple, brought to life with a steady hand and a deep sense of place. Her foxes, roosters, and fanciful creatures aren't just carvings; they're small testaments to the beauty of rural imagination.

Visitors to Morehead can experience Minnie's legacy firsthand at the Kentucky Folk Art Center, where her work anchors a collection that celebrates self-taught artists from across the region. The center's galleries tell the story of creativity born from tradition — people who, like Minnie, shaped art not for fame, but for the joy of making.

Discovering Minnie Adkins isn't just about seeing her carvings, it's about stepping into a living story of Appalachian craftsmanship — one that began in a small farmhouse, found a home in Morehead, and continues to carve its way into hearts around the world.

In this beloved Appalachian children's book, Minnie's hand-carved characters come to life through her unmistakable shapes, bright colors, and playful spirit. Her iconic blue rooster—whimsical, proud, and carved with her signature rhythm—has become a symbol of the charm she brought to American folk art. These pieces aren't just carvings; they're storytellers, carrying the humor, heritage, and heart of eastern Kentucky into homes far beyond the hills.
