Restaurants

- <u>Kicker's</u> is a recently-opened restaurant with a menu featuring fresh and locally caught seafood from the raw oyster bar, hot and delicious housemade creations, and a broad spectrum of craft beers and cocktails.
- Opened on May 1, <u>Rock Tacos</u> is serving up tacos, burritos and more with a perfect view of Morro Rock.
- Now open, <u>La Katrina Authentic Mexican Cocina</u> draws inspiration from the flavors of various Latin American regions.
- The bar at <u>Dorn's Breaks Cafe</u>, a Morro Bay community staple since the 1940s, underwent a full renovation, resulting in an additional 10 seats.

Hotels

- <u>Pacific Shores Inn's</u> newly refurbished rooms showcase the latest in elegant appointments and furnishings.
- Morro Bay will be welcoming a <u>Hampton Inn</u> in early June.
- HarborWalk Plaza will be opening in August, just in time to wrap up the summer months.

Events

The Morro Bay Maritime Museum will be showcasing their newest event as they invite visitors to experience history come alive with this full-scale replica of Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo's legendary ship, <u>San</u> <u>Salvador</u>.
