Take the unique opportunity to dine aboard the LST 393 Veterans Museum, one of our only two Landing Ship Tanks left in the United States. Here history jumps out at you from every deck and corner. This veteran of Omaha Beach earned 3 battle stars in World War II and pays homage to the men and women who served our country.

A sunset cruise on Muskegon Lake and Lake MI is the perfect way to end your day, and will help your group remember their trip for years to come.



Tour a restored WWII Submarine, a Prohibition-Era Coast Guard Cutter, and the exhibits at the USS Silversides Submarine Museum.

Muskegon South Pier Head Light located at beautiful Pere Marquette Beach, is open for tours during the summer season. Climb to the top of this lighthouse for a panoramic view of Lake Michigan!



Located on the shore of Lake Michigan, the White River Light Station was built in 1875 by Captain William Robinson, and now serves as a physical reminder of the rich nautical history of Michigan. While you're in the White Lake area, be sure to see the World's Largest Weathervane!



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
