

Day 1

BREAKFAST:

<u>The Cypress Room</u>, 6000 Ocean Blvd, Myrtle Beach, SC (at Island Vista Resort) The menus are passionately crafted and incorporate fresh, locally sourced ingredients. The portions are generous, and the prices are reasonable. Most of all, the service and our hospitality are genuine.

Morning Activity:

Visit <u>Brookgreen Gardens</u>, 1931 Brookgreen Gardens Drive, Murrells Inlet, SC *Considered the finest outdoor presentation of American figurative sculpture in the world*, Brookgreen Gardens was created in the early 1930s by Archer and Anna Hyatt Huntington on the site of four former rice plantations. As one of the most affordable attractions in Myrtle Beach offering admission that is good for seven consecutive days, Brookgreen Gardens is home to more than 1,400 works (550 currently displayed) by 300 of the greatest names in American



sculpture, past and present. In addition to the Archer and Anna Hyatt Huntington Sculpture Garden, visitors can explore several other fascinating exhibits.

LUNCH:

Enjoy a light meal at Brookgreen's full-service restaurant, Azalea, located by the Rainey Galleries. It's open every day from 11:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. with freshly prepared sandwiches, salads, soups, appetizers, and desserts. Located next to the sculpture galleries, it has lovely garden views and free WiFi.

Afternoon activity:

Enjoy more of Brookgreen Gardens

DINNER:

<u>Wicked Tuna</u> on the MarshWalk in Murrells Inlet (just a few minutes north of Brookgreen) 4123 US 17 Business, Murrells Inlet, SC 29576

Located in the heart of the "Seafood Capital of South Carolina," the Murrells Inlet MarshWalk is a beautiful way to enjoy the beauty, wildlife and spectacular scenery of the community of Murrells Inlet's saltwater estuary. Built along the marshes dotted with picturesque seafood dining establishments, the MarshWalk offers not only a freshly quaint environment, but also a chance to embark on seafaring adventures like boating/fishing excursions and watersports.

After dinner, walk the half-mile <u>MarshWalk boardwalk</u> and enjoy the sights and sounds of the inlet and one of the Grand Strand's most enjoyable areas.

Day 2

Wake up early and enjoy a spectacular east coast sunrise over the Atlantic!

BREAKFAST:

Sea Captain's House, 1410 Ocean Blvd, Myrtle Beach, SC 29577

Over the years many have crossed the portals of the Sea Captain's House, enjoyed the superb dining, ocean view and warm southern hospitality that the Sea Captain's House offers. To this day, it is still known as the place for seafood where friends meet year after year.

Morning activity:

Walk along the beach, sit and read a book, get a little bit of sun!

LUNCH:

<u>Croissants Bakery & Bistro</u>, 3751 Robert M Grissom Pkwy, Myrtle Beach Croissants offers Southern comfort food, baked goods and fresh coffee--all with a French bistro flare.

Afternoon activity:

Explore the Myrtle Beach Boardwalk and Promenade and ride the <u>SkyWheel</u>, 1110 N Ocean Blvd, Myrtle Beach

The 1.2-mile-long Boardwalk packed with family-friendly shops, restaurants and arcades, and is also home to the SkyWheel – a 187-foot observation wheel overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, offering 42 glass-enclosed, climate-controlled gondolas that seat up to six people.

DINNER:

Hook & Barrel, 8014 North Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC 29572

Hook & Barrel serves succulent seafood fresh from the South Carolina coast. They don't just want to provide you with an incredible meal. More than that, they want to give you a stand out experience that highlights the local ingredients and flavors and does so sustainably. The second restaurant helmed by Heidi Vukov, a 2018 South Carolina Chef Ambassador, Hook & Barrel is a marriage of culinary sophistication and a relaxed beach vibe.

Evening activity:

Attend a live show at <u>The Carolina Opry</u>, 8901 N Kings Hwy, Myrtle Beach, SC 29572 (Tickets must be purchased in advance.)

Day 3

Morning activity:

Explore The Market Common, 4017 Deville St, Myrtle Beach

From Pottery Barn to White House Black Market and all the unique boutiques in between, there's fun for everyone with cool restaurants, bowling, movies, a day spa and exciting family events all year round!

LUNCH:

Tupelo Honey, 3042 Howard Ave, Myrtle Beach

Tupelo Honey is a revival of Southern food and traditions rooted in the Carolina Mountains we call home. We craft brunches, lunches and suppers that bring family and friends around the table and allow for conversations and cocktails to linger longer than usual.

Afternoon activity:

Head to **Barefoot Landing** in North Myrtle Beach and explore shops and restaurants!

Start with some wine tasting at <u>Duplin Winery</u>, 4650 Hwy 17 S, North Myrtle Beach Duplin winery has a tank capacity of over 1.8 million gallons and sells over 500,000 cases of wine annually. All Duplin wines are cold fermented to preserve the natural sweetness that only muscadine grapes can produce.

DINNER:

Suggestions in Barefoot Landing near Alabama Theater, or choose from many fine restaurants: <u>House of Blues</u> - Within easy walking distance to theater. <u>LuLu's</u> - Walkable distance from the theater.

Evening activity:

Enjoy a show at <u>Alabama Theater</u> in Barefoot Landing, 4750 Hwy 17 S, North Myrtle Beach (Check their website for schedule. Tickets must be purchased in advance.) *The Alabama Theatre's exciting productions are the highlight of any vacation. Enjoy live shows, toestomping beats, breath-taking acrobatics, and side-splitting comedy. Founded in 1993, The Alabama Theatre has been entertaining millions of guests who visit the Myrtle Beach area.*

OR head to downtown North Myrtle Beach to check out all of the shagging clubs! Look for <u>Fat Harold's</u> <u>Beach Club</u> at 212 Main Street, North Myrtle Beach, and you'll find the rest. Enjoy beach music and dancing in the lovely downtown setting!
