

## SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

- 1) New Braunfels Manufacturing Association (NBMA) Scholarships will be offered for students in degreed or certificate programs in manufacturing disciplines offered at the Central Texas Technology Center (CTTC) or accredited college/university; other specific programs may be selected annually.
- 2) The NBMA goal is to offer a minimum of four scholarships each year (including any continuing scholarships); and more will be made available as funding permits; any additional Scholarships will be decided year-by-year after review of NBMA finances and objectives.
- 3) Scholarship recipients will receive up to \$1000 in funding on a reimbursement basis, within a 12-month period from the date of award. Scholarship funds unclaimed within the 12-month period will be considered forfeited by the student.
- 4) Scholarships will be offered on an annual basis; recipients are eligible to apply for a subsequent scholarship, with a limit of two approved applications to any one student.
- 5) To be eligible, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED, and must be Residents of Comal, Hays or Guadalupe counties at the time of application. Employees of NBMA member organizations, their spouses and children are eligible for scholarship support.
- To be eligible for continuing assistance, students must have made satisfactory progress towards the certificate or degree, including completion of one year of a full-time course load for the particular program, and grades of "C" or better in all classes.
- 7) Applications will be received and reviewed by the Scholarship Committee, which will make its recommendations to full membership for approval.
- 8) The approved applications and associated documents shall be given to the Secretary to keep with the official organizational records.
- 9) The Scholarship Committee will work with the appropriate school counselors to accept applications for scholarships in order to compile a list of prospects for the membership approval.
- 10) Scholarships will be awarded with consideration to: NBMA membership/affiliation, Discipline/area of study, previous scholarship recipient, past or current military service, availability of funds.
- 11) Receipts for tuition, fees, books and bona-fide supplies shall be submitted to the NBMA Treasurer to obtain the reimbursement.
