



MARY KAYASELCUK | PUBLIC HISTORIAN

ary Kayaselcuk, Public Historian with the City of Newport News, says she has the best job. "It allows me to engage with our city's history on many levels and at many sites." Currently, Kayaselcuk is involved with the recently restored 1881 Lee Hall Depot. Her duties there include collections management, graphic and exhibit design, and planning special events. Additionally, she serves as the liaison to the Lee Hall Train Station Foundation.

The best part of Kayaselcuk's job is being an ambassador of local history, she said. The Newport News native especially enjoys researching queries and offering programs that connect people with our community's legacy.

"I strive to make history fun and relevant to everyone," said Kayaselcuk, who also oversees the Warwick Courthouse complex, is active with the Warwick County Historical Society, and chairs the North End-Huntington Heights Architectural Review Board.

During her 46-year career in the Division of Museums & Historic Services, Kayaselcuk has worked on many diverse undertakings. When she began in 1978, the city operated one museum. Today its inventory includes four historic houses, a train station, two mills and hundreds of interpretive markers.

"It's been my privilege to be part of these in various fashions, ranging from preservation and development to interpretation," said Kayaselcuk, who has an undergraduate degree in History and Art from Longwood and a master's in Museum Studies from Hampton University. In 1986, the City published her thesis, Heroes Forever: The Story of the Newport News Victory Arch, which documents this important historical structure.

One of her favorite projects was the creation of a gallery documenting the visionary folk artist Anderson Johnson, located at the Downing-Gross Cultural Arts Center. In her spare time, Kayaselcuk does first-person living history interpretations as The History Missie.

ROBERT L. BROOKS, JR. | SENIOR PARK RANGER

or more than 29 of his 33-year career with the City of Newport News, Robert L. Brooks, Jr., has served as a Park Ranger.

"I consider this profession a new adventure each day I report to work," said Brooks, now a Senior Park Ranger.

A self-described "ambassador" for the city and the region, Brooks most enjoys the role he plays in being able to provide information to guests, conducting tours, and leading educational programs in the parks, at historic sites, and in schools.

"I love directing people to sites that interest them and highlighting those hidden gems off the beaten path for their consideration," he said.

Over the years, Brooks has led guided tours for travel writers and visiting dignitaries - including the wife of a scientist from Nepal who was attending a conference at Jefferson Lab and a princess from the royal family of Ada, Ghana.

Being a park ranger has been a dream-come-true for Brooks. A native of North Carolina, he has worked in the past as a restaurant manager and an insurance agent. He also served in the U.S. Army.

In his spare time, Brooks likes to research the history of our region and often participates in living-history re-enactments as an African American soldier in the Revolutionary War or as a member of the U.S. Colored Troops during the Civil War. He is also a volunteer with the Jazz Legacy Foundation, whose goal is to enhance the appreciation and preservation of this music genre.

Parks & Nature

Discover Newport News through its parks and green spaces. From trails to playgrounds, these parks offer a perfect mix of relaxation and outdoor fun. Explore the beauty of nature while enjoying activities ranging from hiking and fishing to picnicking and wildlife watching. Here are five of our most popular parks to enjoy!



Huntington Park: 9285 Warwick Blvd. – A 60-acre park with public beach and public boat ramp; rose garden; picnicking; ball fields; and Fort Fun, a 14,000 sq. ft. playground that overlooks the James River. Tennis Center offers pickleball and tennis courts, ball machine and backboard rentals. Fishing available at Lake Biggins.

King-Lincoln Park: 600 Jefferson Ave. – Overlooking the Hampton Roads waterfront at the southeast end of Newport News, King-Lincoln Park features tennis, basketball, picnicking, playgrounds, a saltwater fishing pier and an interpretive center (open summer weekends only).

Newport News Park: 13560 Jefferson Ave. – One of the largest municipal parks east of the Mississippi, spanning 7,711 acres, and offering hiking and biking trails, picnic shelters, boat rentals, golf*, archery and fishing. Visitors can camp year-round at 188 sites and explore lush woodlands, lakes, and wildlife. The park also features a Discovery Center, disc golf, and historical landmarks.

Riverview Farm Park: 100 City Farm Road – Home to Fido Field Dog Park and Fantasy Farm Playground, a 30,000 sq. ft. community playground; picnic shelters; soccer field; concession stand (open weekends, April through October); two miles of paved multi-use trails; and a trail leading to the shore of the Warwick River.

*In addition to Newport News Golf Club at Deer Run, located within Newport News Park (nngolfclub.com), the nearby Kiln Creek Golf Club (kilncreekgolf.com) offers golfers a challenging course.

Smith's Pharmacy

Listed in the National Register of Historic Places, Smith's Pharmacy was a fixture in the East End community for decades. Originally opened in 1946, it served as an after-work gathering place for shipyard workers in the Jim Crow era. Though no longer open, the building remains part of our city's history.



JOANNE PALMEIRA | SUPERINTENDENT OF CULTURAL ARTS

oanne Palmeira, Superintendent of Cultural Arts, is responsible for the citywide administration of cultural arts programming.

As part of her day-to-day duties, Palmeira oversees the Downing-Gross Cultural Arts Center, a multi-purpose space in the Southeast Community. She has been with the city's Department of Parks and Recreation since 2004 and was promoted to her current position in 2018.

In addition to the 276-seat Ella Fitzgerald Theater, the **Downing-Gross Cultural Arts Center has instructional spaces** that include dance and art studios, a music room, and other classroom spaces. This allows the facility to host programs dedicated to continuing arts education in the community.

"Engaging with art is essential to the human experience," Palmeira said. "Almost as soon as motor skills are developed, children communicate through artistic expression."

Watching the evolution of young artists is just one thing Palmeira loves most about her job.

"Newport News has an impressive creative community," Palmeira said, "and we want to help build on it."

According to Palmeira, the arts have a long history of bringing people together and allowing communities to create and share their stories.

"The arts challenge us with different points of view, compel us to empathize with others, and give us the opportunity to reflect on the human condition," she said.

A proud military wife and mom, Palmeira enjoys traveling and exploring other cultures and cuisines with her family.


