

Check some holiday shopping off your list in downtown Newport. Unique shops throughout the city are fully stocked with local treasures, designer names and unique gifts.

Next, off to Bristol for a tour of Blithewold Mansion, Gardens & Arboretum. The Van Wickle family built this stunning 45-room English-style manor mansion on 33 acres with sweeping views of Narragansett Bay in the early 1900s and the home is preserved in the style in which they lived. Every year, the mansion is decorated in a holiday theme like no other. The creativity used throughout the house is an experience not to be missed. After the tour your group will enjoy hot cocoa, tea and cookies in the exquisite formal dining room.
