



Colony House, Newport

- ★ As Newport pre-dates America itself and grew to be one of the country's largest Colonial-era port cities, it's no surprise that 25 presidents – more than half of America's commanders in chief – have visited the City by the Sea. Two presidents even made Newport the home of their "summer White House": Dwight D. Eisenhower and John F. Kennedy.
- ★ The new President's Tour of Newport will highlight sites and tell the stories of the various presidents and first ladies who have visited Newport over the past 229 years. This tour also includes a visit to either Marble House or The Breakers; former Gilded Age homes of the Vanderbilt family. Both are legendary Newport Mansions where the Kennedys visited or attended events.
- ★ Let your fun, knowledgeable guide show you more than two dozen places significant to many presidents including St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, where then-Senator John F. Kennedy married Jacqueline Bouvier; historic Fort Adams, named in honor of then-President John Adams; and Trinity Church, where George Washington worshipped and where President Gerald Ford visited with Queen Elizabeth to mark the dedication of Queen Anne Square.
