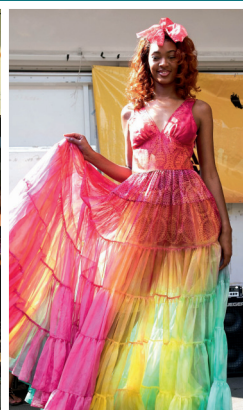
WELCOME TO HARLEM WEEK 2019

HARLEM WEEK runs from July 28 to August 31. With over 100 events, it celebrates the history and brilliance of all that is Harlem.

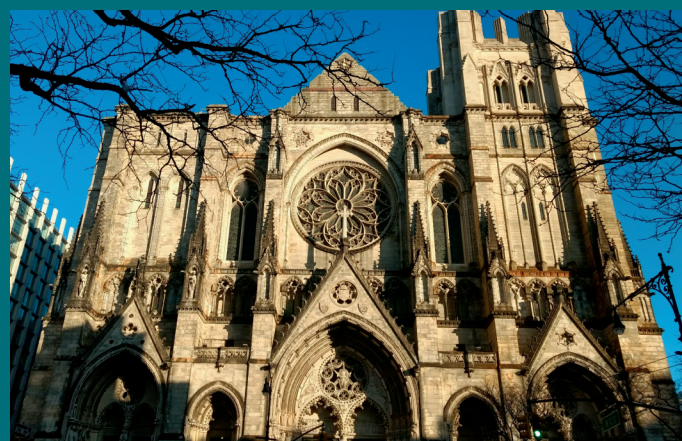

HARLEM WEEK is one of the biggest cultural celebrations in the nation with over 111 events featuring conferences, seminars, sports, music, food, dance, and more.



HARLEM DAY originally took place on Saturday, August 17, 1974, on West 138th Street & 7th Avenue. It was created by a group of Harlemites under the leadership of the Honorable Percy E. Sutton.



Harlem has been known as the arts, culture, political, sports, education, and religious capital of the African diaspora since the early 20th century.



Harlem is the home of jazz and bebop, the legendary Apollo Theater, the famed Cotton Club, the Savoy Ballroom, and Minton's Playhouse.



Harlem has world-famous houses of worship like the Abyssinian Baptist Church, The Riverside Church, Mother A.M.E. Zion Church, and many more.



Harlem has some of the best educational institutions in the community, including The City College of New York, Columbia University, Yeshiva University, Teachers College, and more.
