

# **FINGER LAKES**

#### **2026 DEVELOPMENTS**

2026 is shaping up to be a landmark year across the Finger Lakes region. <u>Seabreeze Amusement Park</u> in Irondequoit will debut a dual family racing slide in time for summer, the first of its kind in the Northeast, sending riders twisting and dropping to the finish line. In Ithaca, the new <u>Meinig Fieldhouse</u> at Cornell University opens in spring 2026, bringing a state-of-the-art venue for varsity athletics, community events and major tournaments. Nature lovers can soon explore the region from above on the <u>Tanglewood Nature Center Canopy Treetop Walkway</u>, opening late spring/early summer 2026. This ADA-accessible path climbs 70 feet into the forest canopy with sweeping views, designed in collaboration with world-renowned scientist "Canopy Meg" Lowman and only the second of its kind in New York State.

Several cultural institutions mark milestones in 2026: the Rockwell Museum will celebrate 50 years with special exhibitions, a September 19 Birthday Bash and the return of its gala on November 7; Corning Museum of Glass turns 75 alongside The Studio's 30th anniversary; and Genesee Country Village & Museum marks 50 years with costumed interpreters and working trades. Sports fans can join the Rochester Americans' 70th-anniversary season with era-specific jerseys beginning October 10, while Watkins Glen's iconic schooner True Love sails into its 100th year.

#### DESCRIPTION

Whether compelled by a love of natural beauty or a fondness for urban excitement, travelers will find the Finger Lakes region fits their longings like a glove. Covering 9,000 square miles, the destination directly south of Lake Ontario is named for 11 pristine lakes that spread like fingers, creating havens for outdoor fun including waterways connected to the Great Lakes for swimming, fishing and boating; and scenic wine trails that showcase some of the nation's premier vineyards through special events, tasting passports and more.

There are cultural and historical highlights at every turn around the region. The world's largest glass museum, the <u>Corning Museum of Glass</u>, is a destination for family day trips with hot glassblowing demonstrations, 3,500 years of glass art, and exhibits including Egyptian tombs, Tiffany vases and space shuttle windows. <u>The Strong National Museum of Play</u> in Rochester is the world's only museum dedicated to the exploration and discovery of play and features the World Video Game Hall of Fame and the National Toy Hall of Fame. It also boasts the world's largest playable Donkey Kong arcade machine.

The <u>Erie Canal Museum</u> in Syracuse is dedicated to preserving the history of the Erie Canal, a 363-mile long waterway that was built in the early 19th century to create a direct route from the

Hudson River to the Great Lakes. Visitors can learn about the Syracuse and Erie Canals that played crucial roles in commercial transportation in the state in the 1800s.

Seneca Falls, located in the northern Finger Lakes, was the site of the first Women's Rights Convention in 1848. This landmark gathering produced the Declaration of Sentiments, which boldly demanded equal rights for women, including the right to vote — laying the foundation for the national suffrage movement. In Auburn, travelers can visit the <a href="https://example.com/home of Harriet Tubman">home of Harriet Tubman</a>, where they can take a peek into this historic figure's life.

Rochester served as a key site in the fight for equality and social reform, bringing together leading voices of both the abolitionist and women's rights movements. Susan B. Anthony dedicated her life to the cause, working tirelessly alongside Stanton. Her home, now the National Susan B. Anthony Museum & House, served as a key headquarters for suffragist strategy meetings and activism leading up to the passage of the 19th Amendment. Frederick Douglass published his influential anti-slavery newspaper, The North Star, and worked closely with both Harriet Tubman and Anthony — uniting the movements for abolition and women's suffrage.

The Finger Lakes is also celebrated as one of the country's most acclaimed wine regions, where cool-climate conditions produce award-winning Rieslings, sparkling wines and other varieties. The region is home to over 140 wineries and tasting rooms along its scenic wine trails, where visitors can meet passionate vintners and enjoy vineyard-view patios, seasonal festivals and food pairings that showcase the area's rich agricultural heritage. Alongside its scenic wine trails, the region boasts a vibrant craft beverage scene of breweries, cideries and distilleries. Finger Lakes Distilling has opened a new tasting room in Newfield, inviting visitors to sample award-winning spirits along scenic backroads, adding to an ever-growing roster of unique places to sip and savor locally made drinks.

For winter adventure seekers, <u>Bristol Mountain</u> delivers thrilling skiing with its impressive 1,200-foot vertical rise, while Geneva's <u>Seneca Lake State Park</u> provides scenic cross-country skiing trails, perfect for a peaceful winter day. Those looking to sharpen their skills can take lessons at Cortland's <u>Greek Peak</u>, one of the region's premier ski resorts, which also features an indoor water park and spa. For a more relaxed winter adventure, <u>Oneida Lake</u> becomes a haven for ice fishing enthusiasts, with anglers casting their lines for perch, walleye, and northern pike. Ice fishing shanties dot the frozen landscape on <u>Skaneateles Lake</u> as well, making it a cozy retreat on the ice.

#### WHERE TO STAY

<u>La Tourelle Hotel, Bistro, and Spa</u> in Ithaca features a recently refreshed lobby and guest rooms, reinforcing its status as a wellness retreat steps from <u>Buttermilk Falls State Park</u>, <u>Firelight Camps</u> and the <u>Namgyal Monastery Institute of Buddhist Studies</u>, also known as the Dalai Lama Library. Guests can settle into one of a host of unique accommodations in the Finger Lakes, from the four historic properties that make up <u>Inns of Aurora</u> along Cayuga Lake to a historic octagonal home transformed into the elegant, <u>Black Sheep Inn and Spa</u> in Hammondsport.

For a storybook getaway, <u>Belhurst Castle</u> sits on the picturesque Seneca Lake in the Finger Lakes wine region. The enchanting 1880s stone castle and winery hosts elegant rooms featuring four-poster beds, stained-glass windows, marble fireplaces and stunning lake views. Its real-life fairy tale amenities include complimentary wine from the spigot for castle guests, spa

treatments or a special six-course food and wine pairing for two. <u>Ellwanger Estate B&B</u> sets itself apart with its elegant decor, warm natural woodwork, soft lighting and fresh outdoor aromas that create a serene atmosphere, enhanced by sunlight streaming through skylights. Located in Rochester's Mount Hope Cultural District, the historic estate offers four eco-friendly, smoke-free rooms and access to the stunning Ellwanger Garden, ensuring a memorable stay in a beautiful setting.
