



Celebrate Your Pride Year-round in New York

From historically significant sites to funky neighborhoods, there are countless places to learn about New York's unparalleled history and role in advancing LGBTQ rights.

New York City

The Big Apple is considered the birthplace of the modern LGBTQ rights movement by virtue of being home to the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Greenwich Village. Today, the **Stonewall Inn** operates both as a neighborhood gay bar and a national gathering place for the LGBTQ community. The building and surrounding area—including the **Gay Liberation Monument** across the street in **Christopher Park**—comprise the **Stonewall National Monument**, the first national park dedicated to LGBTQ history.

In the summer of 2024, the **Stonewall National Monument & Visitor Center** opened in partnership with the National Park Service, becoming the first LGBTQ visitor center within the National Park System. This center serves as an educational hub, offering immersive experiences, tours, lectures, exhibitions and art displays.

Also in the neighborhood is **The Center**, where ACT UP brought public attention to the AIDS epidemic. Many pieces of LGBTQ art from the 1980s cover the center's walls including the provocative mural hand-painted in 1989 by artist Keith Haring.

With iconic neighborhoods like **Chelsea** and **Hell's Kitchen**, there are many options for LGBTQ-friendly shopping, restaurants for every taste and some of the best nightlife in the city. The LGBTQ legacy extends beyond Manhattan. Venture over to **Marsha P. Johnson State Park** in Brooklyn, dedicated to the LGBTQ icon for her role at the Stonewall Uprising. You can also visit the **Alice Austen House** on Staten Island, home to the

pioneering photographer and her female partner of 56 years.

Hudson Valley

The charming riverfront city of **Hudson** has built up a reputation for being one of the most LGBTQ-friendly communities in the region and plays host to a vibrant Pride festival, which features a parade, performances and more. It's also an antique hunter's dream with dozens of shops on and around **Warren Street**. Those with an eye for architecture will be delighted by the century-old buildings, including seasonal tours of the **Hudson-Athens Lighthouse**.

Explore the 250-acre estate of Hudson River School painter Frederic Church at the **Olana State Historic Site**, and Washington Irving's **Sunnyside**, the historic river home of *The Legend of Sleepy Hollow* author.

Take a short drive to the **Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site**, **Storm King Art Center** and **Woodbury Common Premium Outlets**, all about an hour away.

Catskills

The Catskills are a unique natural landscape where the arts come alive, from the **Thomas Cole National Historic Site**, home and studios of the founder of the Hudson River School of American paintings, to **Bethel Woods Center**, site of 1969 Woodstock festival.

It's also home to the **Roxbury Motel**, where owners have redefined the meaning of themed rooms with their over-the-top creations. When you manage to tear yourself away from inspecting every detail, take a drive to see the world's largest kaleidoscope located at the **Emerson Resort & Spa**, a contemporary inn featuring shops and a restaurant with a menu that captures local flavors.

Finish off this breathtaking region with a unique tour of the Catskill Mountains with **Rail Explorers**. Pedal your way across long-abandoned railroad tracks alongside Esopus Creek.

Capital-Saratoga

As the capital of New York State, Albany is the place where the fights for marriage equality, the Sexual Orientation and Gender Expression Non-Discrimination Acts and many other LGBTQ laws came to their culmination. Tours of the **Capitol building** show the legislative chambers where those debates and votes took place, as well as the **Hall of Governors**, where the nationally significant passage of the state's marriage equality law was finalized.

Albany is the city where Harvey Milk attended the New York State College for Teachers—what is now the University at Albany. The city is home of the longest continually operating LGBTQ community center in the United States: the **Pride Center of the Capital Region**. It is located in Center Square just steps from **Lark Street**, a neighborhood popular with the LGBTQ community.

Adirondacks

Escape into the majestic mountains of the Adirondack State Park, and revel in a rustic retreat at **Adirondak Loj** that sits at the gateway to the 46 High Peaks.

Sports history comes alive at the **Lake Placid Olympic Center and Museum**. Skate on the site of the dramatic "Miracle on Ice" game or zipline at the **Olympic Jumping Complex**. Relax at **Mirror Lake Inn Resort & Spa**, a finalist in the 2020 Gay Travel Awards, featuring two unique culinary experiences, private beach, salt therapy and spa services.

Beyond Lake Placid, Tupper Lake's **Wild Center** takes you up over the treetops for a rare view of the Adirondacks forest. Located at the southeast base of the Adirondacks, **Lake George** is best showcased aboard a dining or sightseeing steamboat cruise offered by the **Lake George Steamboat Company's Lac du Saint Sacrement, Mohican or Minnie Ha Ha**.

1000 Islands-Seaway

Discover a freshwater paradise for sightseeing and outdoor recreation on and along the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario. Take a sightseeing cruise on **Clayton Island** and **Uncle Sam Boat Tours** to view the wildlife or famed **Singer** and **Boldt Castles**, or take a vintage-wooden speedboat ride at Clayton's **Antique Boat Museum**. Paddlers craving high adventure can whitewater raft in the **Black River Canyon**, near Watertown.

Landlovers can cruise the **Great Lakes Seaway Trail** to discover lighthouses, wineries, amusement parks and more. Attractions along the route include the **Frederic Remington Art Museum** in Ogdensburg, **Safe Haven Museum** in Oswego and Watertown's expansive 355-acre **Thompson Park**, home to **Zoo New York**, an 18-hole golf course, a creative children's playground, overlook and picnic area.

Central New York

Amid the region, **Sharon Springs** was once a bustling spa resort that hosted Oscar Wilde in the late 19th Century. Today, the charming town has seen a renaissance thanks to local LGBTQ businesspeople like the Fabulous Beekman Boys who came to fame as winners on *The Amazing Race*, then their own reality show and finally as owners of the **Beekman 1802 Kindness Shop**. The shop specializes in goat milk skincare, artisan offerings and events at their Main Street flagship.

Just a short ride to **Cooperstown**, world-class opera and musical theater lovers enjoy **Glimmerglass Festival**. The **Fenimore Art Museum** shows off historical artifacts that would make Hamilton fans drool.

Follow the Yellow Brick Road to **Chittenango**, birthplace of L. Frank Baum's *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*. The whimsical village honors the Oz universe with the **All Things Oz Museum** and longest-running, annual **Oz-Stravaganza Festival** in the world.

Finger Lakes

Home to a vibrant LGBTQ community, Rochester was named America's 11th Gayest City by Advocate.com.

The **Rochester Rainbow Union** has the largest collection of LGBTQ materials in New York including an entire run of the nation's oldest LGBTQ newspaper.

Its annual **ImageOut Festival** is the second-largest LGBTQ film and video festival in New York.

Many honor social justice by visiting the **National Susan B. Anthony Museum & House** and famed abolitionist **Frederick Douglass'** gravesites in **Mount Hope Cemetery**.

Tucked in the Finger Lakes wine region, **Seneca Falls** is home to the **Women's Rights National Historical Park**, site of the Women's Rights Convention and **The Seneca Falls It's a Wonderful Life Museum**.

Ithaca, one of the first cities in nation to ban sexual-orientation discrimination, offers a thriving center with shops, restaurants and more in **Downtown Ithaca Commons**.

Greater Niagara

Niagara Falls' reputation as the honeymoon capital of the world was furthered when marriage equality came to New York. One of the first same-sex marriages was held in **Niagara Falls State Park** overlooking the majestic falls. The flowing water is often lit in rainbow colors in commemoration of special events like Pride Month.

New York's second-largest city, **Buffalo**, is rich with history, great food and a thriving LGBTQ community. LGBTQ icon and musical legend Ani DiFranco hails from Buffalo, where her influence as a social activist has left an indelible mark with her creation of **Babeville**, a multi-use facility devoted to the arts, in the heart of the city's theater district.

Buffalo's **Allentown** neighborhood showcases many great shops, restaurants and bars. Some of the dining establishments are believed to have the best Buffalo wings in the city that invented them.

Chautauqua-Allegheny

Tucked into timeless landscapes --enchanted mountains and tranquil lakes--gracious hospitality and adventure thrives. Paddlers find thrills with **Zoar Valley Rafting**. Hike amid rock formations at **Panama Rocks Park**. Nature trails meander around monumental statues at **Griffis Sculpture Park**.

Chautauqua Institution, a haven for the arts, presents iconic speakers and performers. Founded in 1879, **Lily Dale Assembly** is considered the world's largest center for Spiritualism. The **Lucille Ball-Desi Arnaz Museum & National Comedy Center** in Jamestown celebrates America's First Couple of Comedy and features more than 50 interactive exhibits on the art of comedy.

Lake Erie Wine Country trail includes 21 wineries. **Southern Tier** and **Ellicottville Brewing** present tours and award-winning craft brews. Follow New York's **Amish Trail** to shop farmstands and hand-crafted specialties.

Long Island

World famous **Jones Beach State Park** provides a refreshing break with 6.5 miles of white sand beach, boardwalk, park and amphitheater has something for everyone.

Nestled on **Fire Island National Seashore**, the **Pines and Cherry Grove** neighborhoods have been a haven for LGBTQ visitors long before Stonewall. From Oscar Wilde's visit in 1882 and Truman Capote's in the summer of 1957, where it is said he completed *Breakfast at Tiffany's*, to the development of **Cherry Grove** as "America's First Gay and Lesbian Town," the island served as a refuge to revel openly. Its annual **Invasion of the Pines** celebrates and reenacts a 1970s incident when a Cherry Grove drag queen was denied service at a conservative Pines restaurant, only to return with an army of drag queens.

The famed resort areas of the **Hamptons** is a vibrant LGBTQ haven showcasing pristine beaches, historic **Montauk Point Lighthouse** and a host of glamorous boutiques, restaurants and nightclubs.
