

## The NYS Birding Trail offers opportunities for New Yorkers to enjoy birding all winter long.



Winter raptors including snowy owls, short-eared owls, barn owls, and hawks migrate south from Canada and can be observed near open bodies of water and

large grasslands, with snowy owls often spotted at Washington County Grasslands in Fort Edward and at Buffalo Harbor State Park. Some species of woodpeckers may be easier to hear or see in their winter homes, while black-capped chickadees remain in the north due to their ability to survive the cold weather.

Winter waterfowl including snow geese and northern harriers can be seen at places like Jamaica Bay Wildlife Refuge in Queens and Mount Loretto Unique Area on Staten Island. Winter is also a great time to observe bald eagles, whether you're at Onondaga Lake in Syracuse, Peebles Island State Park in Cohoes, or the Dr. Ted Kerpez Memorial Eagle Viewing Blind at Mongaup Valley WMA in Narrowsburg.
