Baltimore Avenue Redevelopment Project Gains Momentum Toward 2027 Groundbreaking

The Baltimore Avenue redevelopment project has finally gotten traction and is full speed ahead to become a reality. The project, now spanning from North Division Street north to 9th Street inclusive of all ocean block side streets from Baltimore Avenue to the Boardwalk, is slated to break ground on or about late October of 2027. Projected to cost \$25 million dollars, the project is being funded by a \$20 million Federal Grant with a \$5 million local match. Starting back in the Fall of 1991, the Town chose to commence the undergrounding of all the overhead utility lines (power, cable and phone) along the Baltimore Avenue corridor. The first Phase, completed between South 2nd Street and North Division Street, commenced in the Fall of 1991 and was completed just prior to the Summer Season of 1992. Years later, commencing in 1997, the Town completed the section of Baltimore Avenue from 15th to 33rd Streets. That effort, due to its size, took two years to complete and was finished just prior to the Summer Season of 1999.

With those two initial efforts complete, the section from North Division to 15th Streets remains “as is” with all the wooden utility poles and “visual pollution” of the aerial cables. Though it was the goal and intention of

the Town to complete this decades-long goal to reconstruct all of North Division to 15th Streets, the estimates of construction costs became cost prohibitive and the scope had to be scaled back.

In general, the scope of the forthcoming project will be inclusive of:

- Undergrounding all the overhead lines along the Baltimore Avenue corridor and east to the Boardwalk;
- Replacement of all sidewalks that flank both the east and west sides of Baltimore Avenue;
- Relocation of the traffic signal from 7th St. down to 5th St.; and
- Elevating the east end of numerous streets to “boardwalk elevation”.

Assuming all the design and permitting efforts go as planned, the project will commence in the Fall of 2027. The project will be constructed in Two Phases with spanning October 2027 to April of 2028 and then October 2028 to April of 2029.

The outcome of the effort will enhance storm resiliency, firefighting access to buildings without the concern of aerial interference, and drastically enhance the “view” of the overall Gateway/Corridor for Ocean City.

IMPORTANT! 2026 Election Information

The Town of Ocean City is holding the municipal election on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Registered Ocean City voters are able to vote at the Roland E. Powell Convention Center, 4001 Coastal Highway, Hall A.

The Town is offering free bus service for all users on Election Day. The “no-fare” policy for buses and ADA service will be in effect from 6:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. The Coastal Highway “Beach Bus” will run every 30 minutes. ADA service is available to qualified individuals during the same days and hours that the “Beach Bus” service is in operation, but 24-hour advanced trip reservations are required. Bus stops closest to the Ocean

Offshore Wind Opposition

The Town of Ocean City remains steadfast in its opposition to the proposed offshore wind project by US Wind and continues to take decisive action to protect our coastal environment, tourism economy, and recreational and commercial fishing industry.

In October 2024, The Town took a significant step and retained Marzulla Law, LLC, a nationally recognized firm specializing in environmental and property rights litigation, to file suit against the federal government over its fast-tracked approval of the US Wind project. The lawsuit includes over 20 co-plaintiffs including Worcester County Commissioners, Fenwick Island Delaware, HMRA, ODCD, Ocean City Chamber of Commerce, Coastal Association of Realtors, the recreational and commercial fishing industry, and more. US Wind attempted to dismiss our suit and to prevent the Federal Government from remanding their approvals. Thankfully the court ruled against them on both occasions, our suit remains active and we hope for a successful outcome later this summer.

US Wind is also trying to purchase the last two seafood offloading properties at the West Ocean City Harbor and convert them into their maintenance facilities. The West Ocean City Harbor is the only Atlantic fishing port in the State of Maryland. US Wind’s actions would essentially end commercial fishing in Ocean City, destroying the livelihoods of the men and women who work on the ocean. Thankfully, Worcester County is taking strong steps to stop this, the County is looking to purchase the property and preserve the fishing docks.

Although President Trump has halted a number of offshore wind projects, the US Wind Project has not been addressed and currently our lawsuit remains the only obstacle standing in the way of US Wind beginning construction.

The fight to save our coastline is not over! We still need your help.

Summer in Ocean City means sunshine, salty breezes, and long, relaxing days on the sand. To help everyone enjoy a safe and spacious beach experience, the Town has clear, easy-to-follow guidelines for shade structures.

Traditional tents, any structure with sides, are no longer permitted on Ocean City beaches. These enclosed setups can block sightlines for lifeguards and create crowded conditions. However, open-sided canopies remain allowed as long as they meet the following requirements:

Canopy Basics Made Easy

- Must be open on all four sides
- Canopy footprint area may not be larger than 15ft x 15ft
- Leave at least 3 feet of space between your canopy and your neighbor’s
- Anchoring must stay within the canopy’s footprint
- No canopies left unattended before 10:00 a.m.
- Canopies must be placed behind the lifeguard stand
- Baby tents are permitted but no larger than 3ft x 3ft x 3ft

These guidelines are designed to improve safety, maintain clear sightlines for lifeguards, and ensure every beachgoer has room to relax comfortably. With a little planning and cooperation, we can keep the beach safe, beautiful, and enjoyable for all.

Eagle’s Landing Flood Remediation Project



Eagle’s Landing Golf Course, located off Route 611 in West Ocean City, will begin a project this fall that will affect play from approximately November 2026 to Spring 2027. Six holes will

be closed during the project. Attention will be given to address tidal flooding that impacts four holes on the course. There will be some modifications made to holes 7, 10, 17 & 18. The course will remain open during the project with modified play. Ocean City Recreation and Parks and Eagle’s Landing Golf Course is looking forward to the public enjoying these improvements as well as the recent upgrades to the Clubhouse (Spring 2025) and the practice area (March 2026). Updated Boardwalk Comfort Stations to Open

The project included interior and exterior improvements, plumbing upgrades, and structural enhancements to extend the life of the buildings. At the Caroline Street location, the former towers were removed to create a refreshed appearance.

This system matches its data with the information you provide in the ParkMobile® app. If you provide incomplete or inaccurate data, the system will automatically generate and mail an invoice to the vehicle's registered owner with charges equal to the time spent in the lot times the hourly rate plus a non-negotiable \$25.00 processing fee.

OCEAN CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT Ordinance Reminders

The Ocean City Police Department is reminding residents and visitors that safety in our resort town is our number one priority. Our ordinances are designed to provide a pleasurable, safe & fun vacation, along with a livable community for our residents.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed in public. This includes any street, avenue, alley, sidewalk, Boardwalk, parking lot, on the beach or in any vehicle. Possessing an open container of any alcoholic beverage in public is prohibited.

Bikes, Skateboards, & Electric Bikes on the Boardwalk: Bikes, skateboards, & class 1 electric bikes are permitted on the Boardwalk from Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend - Labor Day, between 2 a.m. to 2 p.m. Class 2 & 3 electric bikes and hoverboards are not allowed on the Boardwalk at any time.

Fresh Air, Clean Beach: To help keep our beaches clean & our air fresh, OC is proud to offer a smoke-free Boardwalk and designated smoking areas

on the beach. Designed to accommodate both smokers & non-smokers, OC's restricted smoking policy provides designated smoking areas on the beach; however, prohibits smoking & vaping on the Boardwalk & beach access ways, beach & dune crossings, parks & covered bus shelters. Voluntary compliance is expected; however, citations for violations may be issued by officers if necessary.

Pets on the Beach & Boardwalk: Pets are not permitted on the beach or Boardwalk May 1 - September 30.

Grilling & Open Fires: Grilling is prohibited on public property except at designated park grill locations leased for private usage. Open fires are prohibited on public property, except in limited beach locations with a permit from the Fire Marshal's Office. More information can be found at ocbonfires.com.

Due to the large crowds that visit OC during the summer months, surfing is not permitted between 10am-5:30pm. However, Ocean City has two blocks each day that are set apart as daily surfing beaches. There is also a surfing beach located at the Inlet Mon-Fri. No swimming or wading is permitted at the surfing beaches & all surfers must wear ankle leashes. Surfing beach limits are established using the yellow stands. In addition, signs & flags are used to highlight the area.

This free service is monitored by the Town's Beach Patrol staff. Please remember that our Beach Patrol is here primarily to provide safety services to our beach-goers; therefore, other beach-related responsibilities may cause a delay in staff attending to the distribution and collection of beach wheelchairs.

- For access to a chair, to get a wheelchair box unlocked or to report damage or problems with a chair, see a lifeguard or call 410.520.5231, 10am–4pm.
- Be prepared to show your driver's license & complete wheelchair permit & waiver.
- Use chair only on beach/sand & within 1 block of the wheelchair box.
- Use at your own risk. Do not put chair in water. Do not inflate or deflate tire air pressure.
- Return beach wheelchair to lifeguard after transferring to another chair so that it may be available to others.

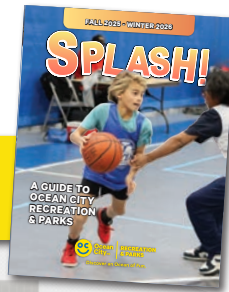

License Requirements

RENTAL LICENSE: If you rent your property to anyone or advertise your property for rent, for any length of time, the law requires you to first obtain an annual Ocean City rental license, and an Ocean City noise control permit. **Online rentals must also comply.** Rental applications may be obtained at City Hall, on the website or by contacting 410.289.8861 (<https://oceancitymd.gov/oc/departments/finance/new-licenses/>)

For dwellings in the R-1 Single Family Residential and MH Mobile Home Residential districts used as rental housing:

- Occupancy is limited to 2 persons per bedroom, plus 2 additional persons, except for children 10 years old or younger.
- Between midnight and 7:00 AM, occupancy must adhere to these limits.

For all other zoning districts used as rental housing, occupancy is based on square footage requirements:

- Minimum bedroom size: 70 square feet.
- 40 square feet per person in the bedroom, with an additional 10 square feet credit for closet space.

REMINDER: Properties that may be in violation of rental licenses or a safety, building or health code should be reported to the Ocean City Citizen Reporter.

FOR PROPERTY OWNERS APPLYING FOR A RENTAL LICENSE:
Provide Contact Information: You must provide the Town

with the name, address, and phone number of a person who is:

- Legally authorized to accept legal notices and address property issues (such as repairs).
- Able to respond to property issues within 60 minutes.
- Authorized to handle code violations.

Rental License Requirements:

- By applying for a rental license, property owners consent to inspections during reasonable hours.
- You must also declare the number of bedrooms and available parking on the property.

Bedroom and Advertising Limits:

- Rental properties cannot advertise more bedrooms than are approved in the building permit plans for the property.

No Unauthorized Conversions:

- Rooms, attics, or garages cannot be converted into bedrooms without following Town ordinances and obtaining the necessary permits.

BUSINESS LICENSE: The Town of Ocean City is an exciting place to do business, with its strong tourism, stunning location and family-friendly atmosphere. **If you operate or plan on operating a business or providing a service within Ocean City's town limits, the law requires you to obtain a Town of Ocean City business license.** To apply for a new license, please visit City Hall. Flood Hazard Protection

April is Maryland Flood Awareness Month

All property in Ocean City is in a flood hazard area & subject to flooding from the ocean, coastal bays & heavy rainfall. Minor flooding is not uncommon & major flooding happens occasionally. FEMA places properties in flood zones based on their chance of flooding. Property owners can find their property's flood hazard designation by contacting the Department of Planning & Community Development, 410.289.8855 or bneville@oceancitymd.gov.

Natural & Beneficial Functions of Floodplains

Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in OC are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking on them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function.

Flood Warning System: OC has developed a flood warning system as part of our Comprehensive Operations Plan. Establish a family rendezvous location when the warning is issued.

Flood Insurance: Flood insurance is available to all property owners & renters. For more information on flooding & insurance, visit <https://www.floodsmart.gov>.

Floodplain Development Permit Requirements: Build responsibly. OC Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction & structural repair work, & for any development within the Special Flood Hazard Area mapped on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps.

Drainage System Maintenance: It is important our drainage system be kept clear of obstructions & debris. Learn more at: oceancity.green.

Property Protection Measures: Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc. For more flood mitigation ideas, visit ReduceFloodRisk.org.
