PhotoQuest, where camaraderie, professional growth, and fun are guaranteed!

PhotoQuest is a popular tradition at Western Chapter meetings. Designed for photographers of all levels, PhotoQuest is a friendly competition, a discovery and a valuable professional development experience all rolled into one. Similar to a location photo shoot, PhotoQuest allows participants to sharpen their skills and capture photos in a compressed time frame with unpredictable weather and logistics while exploring a destination in depth.

Teaming up with a local guide/driver, participants are given approximately 24 hours to photograph Oklahoma City. Along with your guide, you will also be given a shot list of ideas and locations to explore.

Each participant will deliver a portfolio of ten images which will be judged by a panel of qualified local photo editors, photographers and advertising/PR professionals. Judges will select the winning portfolios and individual category photos based on their quality and ability to depict the destination.

Cash prizes and prestige go to the winners, and an AV presentation of the portfolios is presented toward the end of the meeting. Photographers of all skill levels are welcome.

PhotoQuest will begin on Saturday afternoon, July 8, and run through the afternoon of Sunday, July 9. Participants will edit and select their 10 photos, then submit them to the PhotoQuest Chair in time for judging and inclusion in the final presentation.

SATW member, photographer and Oklahoma City resident Matt Payne is your PhotoQuest Chair. He will contact participants prior to PhotoQuest with complete instructions and answers to questions. Participants will gather together in a kick-off meeting on Saturday afternoon, July 8, to meet their driver/guides and review the rules.



Lodging in Oklahoma City on Saturday night is included in this pre-trip. Cost is \$150. If you'd like to arrive on Friday, the pre-trip will cost \$250, and lodging will be included. But meals and activities will be on your own until the beginning of the PhotoQuest on Saturday.
