Omaha is home to two major research hospitals: **Creighton University Medical Center and University** of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), one of the world leaders in solid-organ transplants and the treatment of Ebola. UNMC is home to the largest bio-containment unit in the country and the Davis Global Center, a new state-of-the-art training

facility utilizing advanced simulation technology.
