The Dundee Dell has a rich history. The Dell is the oldest bar and restaurant in Omaha dating back to its humble beginnings as a Jewish deli in 1915. It all started in the Pine Room of this building that still stands today when the Dundee Delicatessen opened its doors. The deli soon moved to a one-car garage located at 112 N 50th Street, before settling into its 50th and Dodge location in 1934. The addition of a cocktail lounge and live music every night made it a popular spot in town. In 1940 the establishment began going by its nick name, "The Dundee Dell", and it became a hotspot for locals and visitors alike. By 1940, the Dell had transformed into a high-end steak house and cocktail lounge, famous for its delicious steaks & southern fried chicken. The Dell thrived in the 1940s and early 50s however, suburbanization had a very negative impact on the Dell's business.

Tragedy struck in 1962 when a fire destroyed the kitchen at the Dell. However the Dell rose from the ashes, and under new ownership, it began serving Fish & Chips and transitioning into a thriving neighborhood pub. In 1989, the Dell started building its famous scotch collection, which is still nurtured today in the Pine Room. The Dell relocated to its current location in 1999, which brought it full circle back to its original home in the adjoining Pine Room.

At first, business was strong at the new location, but over the next decade as Omaha evolved, business dwindled, and the Dell was on the verge of failing several times. By 2020, the tavern had deteriorated into a state of disrepair and was in need of a complete rehabilitation. But the Dell persevered, during renovations the business continued to offer takeout orders and after extensive renovations, it opened its doors to the public once again, setting the stage for the next generation of locals to enjoy the Dell's delicious food and drinks, welcoming atmosphere, and rich history. The Dundee Dell has come a long way since its days as a small deli in the Pine Room, its storied history lives on, a testament to the resilience of a beloved institution that has always evolved and
