Historic General Crook House Museum and Heirloom Garden



The Garden contains nearly 100 varieties of heirloom flowers, trees and shrubs.

Victorian plants brought to Nebraska were originally carried here on wagon trains or were available by mail order catalog in the 1880s.

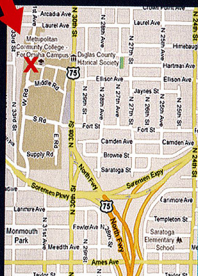
On the lower level of the General Crook House, guests can engage with annual interactive historical exhibits featuring various topics and time periods throughout Douglas County history.

Directions:

Historic Fort Omaha is just north of 30th Street and Sorenson Parkway. Take I-80 to I-480 and follow to North Freeway. Turn left onto Sorenson Parkway and head west to 32nd Street.

Enter Fort Omaha at the 32nd and Sorenson entrance. Continue to follow on the entrance road.

The General Crook House is on the left, with a historic marker in front of the house and a large American flag on the porch.

Constructed in 1879, the Museum is the authentically restored home of General George Crook. The Italianate style house, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, places you in the rooms and life of a Commanding Officer living on the edge of the Frontier in the 1880s.
