Hot Shops Art Center - Where 80 artists create in a unique warehouse setting.

Boys Town - Historic landmark and world-famous Village established by Father Flanagan.

Holland Performing Arts Center - Attracts a variety of nationally and internationally acclaimed performers.

Omaha Children's Museum - Hands-on exhibits the whole family will enjoy.

HEADQUARTERS TO 9 FORTUNE 500 AND 1,000 COMPANIES

Home to billionaire Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway, Union Pacific Railroad, Mutual of Omaha, Kiewit Corporation construction company, and leading telecommunications and information services companies.

Gallup, Inc., the American research-based company best known for its public opinion polls, has a global riverfront campus in Omaha.

HDR, a leading engineering architecture, environmental, and construction firm, is headquartered in Omaha with 225 locations around the world.

Omaha is home to two major research hospitals: Creighton University Medical Center and University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), one of the world leaders in solid-organ transplants and the treatment of Ebola. UNMC is home to the largest bio-containment unit in the country and the Davis Global Center, a new state-of-the-art training



facility utilizing advanced simulation technology.

Bob Kerrey Pedestrian Bridge

The bridge, known as "Bob," is one of the longest pedestrian bridges to connect two states (Nebraska and Iowa). He displays colors at night, has a splash pad, and is home to OMAR the Troll. His handle on Twitter and Instagram is @BobTBridge.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

More than \$8 billion is being spent developing, enhancing and modernizing Omaha's downtown convention district, riverfront and more.

NON PLAYING TOFY LOVES ZEUS

Steelhouse Omaha: \$109 million downtown music venue with capacity for 3,000.

Downtown Riverfront: \$325 million transformational development which includes cascading waterfalls, a boardwalk, an urban beach, park-side cafes, and a new science center with riverfront views.

Downtown Streetcar: Downtown Omaha is set to welcome a \$306 million streetcar in 2026. The streetcar will run on a three-mile route from Cass to Farnam on South 10th Street, Farnam west to 42nd Street, and back to 10th Street on Harney.

The Capitol District: Directly across from the downtown convention center, this new \$200 million development includes a town square surrounded by pubs, restaurants, and a 333-room Marriott hotel.



The Mercantile: This \$500 million project will bring a 20-acre mixed-use development to downtown.





Kiewit Luminarium: This \$101 million center is dedicated to science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).




The Farnam Hotel, Autograph Collection: An upscale, boutique property in downtown Omaha.



Mutual of Omaha Tower: The Fortune 300 insurance company is building a 44-story skyscraper. The stunning \$433 million glass tower is expected to be completed in 2026.

The Crossroads: A \$500 million entertainment district with restaurants, shops, a hotel, and a pavilion.

Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium: Ranked as one of the world's best. Home to the world's largest indoor desert and North America's largest indoor rainforest. 2.7 miles from downtown

Old Market Entertainment District: Cobblestone streets lined with unique boutiques, locally owned restaurants, pubs and sweet shops. 0.9 miles from downtown

Joslyn Art Museum: A pink marble masterpiece filled with more than 11,000 works of art.

North 24th Street: Historic neighborhood that celebrates music and African American arts. 1.8 miles from downtown

0.6 miles from downtown

Midtown Crossing: Relaxing entertainment district with shops and restaurants surrounding an amphitheater and park.

1.9 miles from downtown

The Reuben Sandwich: Invented in Omaha back in the 1900s (we don't care what those New Yorkers say).

Fiery Nightlife: Tiki bars, wine bars and Omaha's Indie music scene light up the night.

Craft Breweries: Unique recipes from craftsmen who have made beer their life and Omaha their home.



Farm to Fork: Omaha's agriculture background puts the city on the forefront of the fresh food movement.

Craft Cocktails: Concoctions created from the wildest imaginations.



Omaha Steaks: Legendary steaks cooked to perfection in classic and modern steakhouses throughout the city.

CONVENTION CENTER

The 346,000 sq. ft. CHI Health Center Omaha is a non-union facility offering freedom and flexibility. Within walking distance of three entertainment districts and ten hotel properties. A glass-enclosed skywalk links the convention center to the 600-room Hilton Omaha, and the full-service 333-room Marriott Capitol District is located directly across the street.

Arena: 18,300 seats and easily converted to basketball, hockey or swimming facility.



CHI Health Center Omaha features 194,000 square feet of contiguous exhibition space divisible into three halls. Twenty-three loading docks and three drive-in ramps provide easy access to the exhibition hall. The convention center offers more than 63,000 square feet of flexible meeting space. The grand ballroom has 30,996 elegant square feet and seats more than 2,000 guests. An additional 79,400 square feet of pre-function space complements 16 meeting rooms with an additional 16 meeting rooms available via a quick skywalk away at Hilton Omaha.


