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

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LAURITZEN GARDENS

The territory that would become the City of Omaha was acquired as part of the Louisiana Purchase by Thomas Jefferson in **1803**.

Native Americans were the first residents of the region. The word "Omaha" means "against the current." It is speculated that the Omaha Indians were referred to as such due to their earlier, northward movements against the current of the Mississippi River.

In 1804, William Clark and Meriwether Lewis landed on the shores of the Missouri River, noting it would be a good place for a trading outpost.

During their trek west, Mormons settled in and around what's now the Florence neighborhood of Omaha, setting up temporary quarters from 1846-1848.

After the passage of the Kansas-Nebraska Act, Omaha was officially incorporated on February 2, **1857**.

On November 17, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln declared that Omaha would be the eastern terminus of the new transcontinental railroad.

In 1879, Omaha lawyers John Lee Webster and A.J. Poppleton took on the case of Chief Standing Bear, the landmark court ruling gave Native Americans rights as citizens. The lawyer's office building still stands and is home to the Omaha Visitors Center.

Omaha appears on the balloon in The Wizard of Oz, some believe it was a reference to a Populist political movement that began in Omaha back in 1892. (We believe there's no place like home.)

Attracting more than 2.6 million visitors over six months, the 1898 Trans-Mississippi Exposition world's fair was held in Omaha and the city has been welcoming visitors ever since.

GETTING AROUND OMAHA

Omaha city streets are set up on a grid system and easy to navigate. Dodge Street divides the city between north and south, and numbered streets start at the Missouri River and increase as you drive west. Taxis, Ubers and Lyfts are available throughout the city. The majority of Omaha hotels offer complimentary direct shuttle service to and from the airport and within a specific mile radius of their property.

OMA (OMAHA'S AIRPORT)

Omaha's airport serves more than 5 million passengers a year and offers non-stop service to 34 of the nation's largest airports. Ranked No. 1 in customer service, you'll find getting in and out of the airport is quick and easy. The airport is conveniently located 4 miles from downtown, so if you're renting a car, taking a cab, or hopping in an Uber, it will take you less than 10 minutes to arrive at the hub of the city. If you're departing from OMA, plan on arriving at least 90 minutes before your departure time. This will ensure you have sufficient time to check-in at the airline ticket counter and proceed through the security checkpoint. Food service is available beyond the checkpoints.

Use this map to explore your options, then look for the giant blue map pins located at top Omaha attractions.

- Bemis/Kaneko: Ever-changing, always-impressive art exhibitions are the foundation of this edgy, urban corner in downtown Omaha.
- 2 Bob Kerrey Pedestrian Bridge: Meet Bob, a 3,000 ft. long pedestrian bridge with personality. Bob offers a spectacular view of Omaha's skyline and a chance to stand in two states at the same time.
- 3 Boys Town: This well-known landmark is a national treasure, featuring an expansive campus with a museum, historic chapel, gardens and a world-renowned youth care program.
- 4 The Durham Museum: Both a museum and meticulously preserved Art Deco train station, explore passenger train cars, visit an old-time schoolhouse, or grab a soda at the oldfashioned phosphate bar.
- 5 El Museo Latino: The first Latino art and history museum in the Midwest. This cozy, culturally intensive establishment is as authentic as the restaurants and shops surrounding it.
- Film Streams: An intimate art house cinema experience. Enjoy film as an art form seven days a week at this distinctive theater located in the emerging North Downtown entertainment district.
- 7 Heartland of America Park: Currently under construction as part of Omaha's \$300 million riverfront revitalization project, offering visitors a dazzling waterfront experience. (Scheduled to reopen in 2024.)
- 8 Hot Shops Art Center: Witness cutting-edge art in a unique warehouse atmosphere. More than 80 art studios are open to the public to watch, learn and buy distinctive works of art.
- 9 Joslyn Art Museum: Enjoy free admission to this pink marble masterpiece filled with rare works of art from Monet, Chihuly, Rembrandt and more. Inside, kids will enjoy Art Works, a space designed especially for them.
- 10 Lauritzen Gardens: Discover 100 acres of botanical beauty at this living museum nestled in the riverfront hills. More than 20 themed gardens and an indoor conservatory make this a year-round experience.
- 11 Love's Jazz and Art Center: Catch the heritage of jazz in a district where Ellington, Basie and others once played. An art and jazz powerhouse committed to the preservation, funding and advancement of the African American arts.
- Mormon Trail Center: Experience firsthand the great Mormon Migration of 1846-47. Explore a pioneer cabin, pull a handcart, and see a full-sized covered wagon drawn by an oven team.
- 13 Old Market Entertainment District: Unique boutiques, antique emporiums, sweet shops and more than 30 restaurants and pubs line the cobblestone streets of this lively historic area.
- 14 Omaha Children's Museum: Specially designed with kids in mind, the museum features hands-on exhibits the whole family can enjoy, including the Super Gravitron ball machine, science center and more.
- 15 Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium: Consistently ranked as one of the "world's best," this is a can't-miss experience filled with animal encounters, an indoor rainforest, and the largest indoor desert in the world.







WORLD'S BEST ZOO

Explore 160 acres of plants, animals and unique habitats from around the world, right here in Omaha.



AFRICAN GRASSLANDS

Take a trip to Africa through this 28-acre outdoor experience featuring breathtaking panoramic views and long vistas teeming with African wildlife like white rhinos, cheetahs, lions and elephants. It includes North America's largest herd room featuring interactive guest and keeper areas. TIP: Ride the Skyfari for a spectacular unobstructed view of this exhibit.



ASIAN HIGHLANDS

Journey from the grasslands of Northern India through the Himalayan Mountains to the forests of northeastern China. Encounter red pandas, sloth bears, Amur tigers, snow leopards and Indian rhinos living among ancient ruins and canopy trees. Foggy Forest is a natural valley with mist blanketing the forest floor and includes a series of foot paths with several nature based play opportunities, including boulders to climb and logs to cross. Most of the animals in Asian Highlands are cold tolerant, making it a year-round experience.



SCOTT AQUARIUM

Transverse the ocean floor and come nose-to-nose with sea turtles as large sand tiger, zebra and stingray sharks circle above. The 70-foot shark tunnel inside the Scott Aquarium provides a mesmerizing underwater experience. From the ocean depths to the frigid cold, the aquarium also features ocean birds, including more than 85 penguins. Up to 20 tons of man-made snow can be churned out in one day from four snow machines.



LIED JUNGLE

Hike through North America's largest indoor rainforest with roaring waterfalls and swinging gibbons in a tropical environment that will transport you to the jungles of South America, Asia and Africa. See more than 90 animal species in their natural habitats, from the forest floor to the highest jungle canopy. Don't miss the swinging rope bridge, and take a picture from lookout peak with a full view of silvered leaf monkeys, ebony langurs, spotted-neck otters and pygmy hippos.



DESERT DOME

Explore the world's largest indoor desert under the world's largest glazed geodesic dome, an Omaha landmark. The Desert Dome stands 13 stories tall and features a 30-foot tall sand dune containing 300 tons of red sand. Climbing in and around the cliffs are klipspringers, rock wallabies, bobcats and meerkats. Inside, enter Rattlesnake Canyon and encounter the world's largest indoor rattlesnake exhibit with 14 reptile species, including venomous snakes.



KINGDOMS OF THE NIGHT

Underneath the Desert Dome, navigate nighttime in the world's largest nocturnal exhibit filled with creatures that surface only after dark. Travel through a canyon, wind through a bat cave, and see the world's largest indoor swamp.



OWEN SEA LION SHORES

Opening in fall 2020 is the new 275-thousand gallon playground for sea lions, which includes a three-story waterfall and 40-foot long underwater viewing window perfect for nose-to-nose experiences. A natural beach area and rocks will provide sunning sites for the animals. A pupping beach will allow females to give birth on land and gradually introduce their pups to the water. There will be hidden spaces just for children to crawl through to view the sea lions swimming and a sandy beach area with four small streams for kids to mix sand and water for playtime.



HOP ABOARD HISTORY AT AN ART DECO TRAIN STATION-TURNED-MUSEUM. esignated as a National Historic Landmark in 2017, this treasured Omaha attraction is filled with an extraordinary array of permanent exhibits showcasing the region's history including restored train cars, 1940s store fronts, informational displays, and historical artifacts of the region. Train enthusiasts and history buffs alike will delight in **The Durham Museum's** offerings.



Step into a bygone era as you enter the museum's Great Hall. Enjoy the same grandeur that millions of rail travelers experienced during the train station's heyday from 1931-1971. From its terrazzo tile flooring to the ceiling's \$10,000 gold leaf decoration, the lobby is a sight to behold. Life-like bronze statues of couples, military men and children placed throughout come alive with travel stories of people who once passed through the station.

Downstairs, experience Omaha's history through a variety of permanent exhibits. Climb aboard and stroll through historic passenger trains from the 1940s and '50s, learn about the fascinating culture of the Omaha Native American Tribe by stepping into a rawhide tepee or sitting by the fire in a replica earth lodge and peek into the home of blue collar workers to experience the way families lived over a 100 years ago. View some of the rarest coins and documents in the world in the Byron Reed Collection, and walk through the Buffett Grocery Store-a replica of the original store operated by three generations of the storied Buffett family from 1869 to 1969.



THE HOLIDAYS

Christmas at Union Station is a magical way to celebrate the holiday season in Omaha. Marvel at the region's largest indoor tree, and enjoy special events like the annual tree lighting ceremony, Ethnic Holiday Festival, a holiday concert series, family nights with Santa and Noon Year's Eve.







Little ones will especially enjoy the model trains with interactive features and the new STEAM-based (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) space.

Temporary exhibits rotate in and out of the Museum, with 2020 exhibitions including Pulitzer Prize Photographs (February 22–May 3), 'Guitar: The Instrument That Rocked the World' (May 30–September 6) and 'The Jim Henson Exhibition: Imagination Unlimited' (October 3–January 10, 2021).



On the main floor, satisfy your hunger for both food and nostalgia at the train station's original 1930s soda fountain. Enjoy a sandwich and an old-fashioned phosphate made with your favorite flavoring and soda water straight out of the fountain dispenser; add some hand-scooped ice cream to make a luscious ice cream float. Malts, shakes and sundaes are also among favorites. The adjoining retro candy shop offers a variety of nostalgic, hard-to-find candies along with fresh popped popcorn.

DISCOVER OMAHA'S RICH AND DIVERSE HISTORY THROUGH A ONE-OF-A-KIND BLEND OF MUSEUMS AND HISTORIC SITES.

At Mormon Trail Center at Historic Winter Quarters, experience what it was like to live in a makeshift cabin, pull a handcart, and "travel" by covered wagon like families did during the great Mormon exodus of the 1800s. Optional guided tours; free admission.

World-renowned **Boys Town**, a National Historic Landmark District, features chapels, statues and gardens, Hall of History museum, Father Flanagan's House* and the visitors center – home to the world's largest ball of stamps. Take the QR code tour using your smartphone for instant access to info and media of top attractions throughout the campus. Free admission.


The **Strategic Air Command & Aerospace Museum**, a Smithsonian affiliate, is home to the nation's largest collection of Cold War aircraft and artifacts. The 300,000 square foot attraction houses an impressive collection of prized and rarely displayed military aircraft, like the SR-71 Blackbird and nine bombers, like the B-36J "Peacemaker," B-17 'Flying Fortress' and B-1A "Lancer." Kids especially will enjoy the flight simulator and Children's Learning Center.

Soak up Omaha's rich jazz heritage at **Love's Jazz & Art Center**, the region's only African-American-based art center.
Their calendar features live performances and special exhibits throughout the year.













Get a glimpse into 19th century life at **General Crook House Museum***.

View period costumes, furnishings and decorative arts and stroll the heirloom garden with more than 110 varieties of flowers and plants. Visit in November and December when this living history museum is decked out for the holidays. Audio tours available.

Located in history-rich, culturally diverse South Omaha, **El Museo Latino*** is one of only 18 Latino museums in the country. This intimate museum offers temporary and permanent exhibits along with educational programming and a lively events calendar.








Another notable Omaha birthsite is that of human rights activist **Malcolm X***. The 14-acre developing memorial features an educational site and plaza with a historical marker commemorating where Malcolm X first lived with his family.



Head to nearby Council Bluffs for hands-on fun at the **Union Pacific Railroad Museum***. Learn about the development of the transcontinental railroad, enjoy a passenger train experience, ride in a locomotive simulator and more. Free admission.

he **Joslyn Art Museum** is a masterpiece serving as one of the finest examples of Art Deco architecture. The pink marble exterior is constructed of Etowah Pink (Georgia Pink) marble while the interior is comprised of 38 different marbles from around the world.

Inside, admire Dale Chihuly's monumental glass sculpture on your way to the permanent collections of art ranging from ancient times to the present. View works by iconic artists Rembrandt, Monet, Degas, Pollock, Renoir and more. Major temporary exhibitions are displayed throughout the year.

Unleash your little (and inner) artist at ART WORKS, 1,500 square feet of interactive space complete with nine activity stations so you may create your own masterpieces, like stop-motion animation and high-tech paintings. Make your way outdoors to the garden galleries, notably the colorful Discovery Garden, complete with 20 artworks.

Joslyn offers free admission year-round, as well as mobile and guided tours. First, satisfy your appetite for art, then your hunger with lunch or a snack at Café Durham, located in the Joslyn's atrium. Before leaving, stop in the Hitchcock Museum Shop and select from an array of distinctive gifts and souvenirs.

The **Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts** is another art heavy hitter. Founded by artists for artists, Bemis provides residency for creatives from around the globe. Visitors will find inspiration in the ever-changing art exhibitions featuring work from both new and seasoned artists and innovative public programs.

For a memorable art experience, check out **Hot Shops Art Center** – named for "hot shops" featuring glass blowing, pottery and bronze casting. Over 80 studio artists welcome you to visit, explore and view this massive 92,000 square feet warehouse with displays that run the art form gamut. View evolving exhibitions at its four art galleries, create your own masterpiece at an ongoing class or workshop, and attend one of the can't-miss biannual open houses.

Discover some of Omaha's most interactive public art. Pioneer Courage Park and Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness Park, one of the world's largest collections of bronze and stainless steel sculptures, spans five city blocks downtown and features installations depicting Omaha's pioneer history. In front of Omaha's downtown convention center and arena is Illumina, a collection of six bronze, larger-than-life circus performers.

Colorful murals painted by local artists span the city, especially in Omaha's historic neighborhoods. The 32,000-square feet **Fertile Ground** downtown is one of the largest community murals in the country. The **South Omaha Mural Project** has spurred the creation of several colorful building-wide murals depicting the diversity of the area, with more murals in the works. In North Omaha, **Black Skies** is a tribute to the Omaha Tuskegee Airmen.

Omaha artists pay special tribute to military veterans at **Memorial Park**. The 67-acre memorial, dedicated by President Harry S. Truman in 1948, honors men and women who have served in the armed forces through the years. American flags line the entrance to the park's iconic white stone structure that prominently sits atop the hill near 60th and Underwood Avenue. Visitors can view numerous bronze statues honoring World War II, Korean and Vietnam veterans. The park also includes a garden filled with 1,000 rose bushes.





Open year-round with a variety of permanent and temporary exhibits, kids are invited to explore, play and learn.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Geared toward kids from 3-10 years old, but all ages will be thoroughly entertained.
- See something new each visit thanks to two temporary exhibit spaces, one on each floor.
- A family resting room with tables, chairs and couches is available for quiet resting time.
- The Rainbow Café offers kid-friendly snacks on the second floor, and there's an accessible microwave in the dining area.
- The museum store offers science kits, games, books and more to keep learning at home.

A museum highlight is the mega Super Gravitron ball machine. Families love to drop in a ball, guess where it will land, and track its path ... leading up to a massive ball drop! Hurry to add more balls to the center before it dumps them out all over again. 



100 ACRES OF BOTANICAL BEAUTY IN THE CITY.

e inspired as you stroll through an urban oasis nestled in Omaha's riverfront hills. Experience a living museum of four-season plant displays in this hidden sanctuary where nature is its brilliant, colorful star. Twenty themed gardens will rejuvenate and captivate, and extras like a conservatory, model trains and a guided tram ride will enhance your visit. Lauritzen Gardens also offers annual events like the Sweet Corn Festival, Antiques Show, and the Holiday Poinsettia Show complete with a 20 feet tall poinsettia tree.

MARJORIE K. DAUGHERTY CONSERVATORY

Explore 17,500 square feet of gardens under glass in this all-seasons conservatory featuring panoramic views with flowers, unique plant life and water features. One moment you're in the tropical gardens filled with tall palms and colorful flowers, the next you're in temperate gardens with moss-covered oak trees and azaleas. Thanks to a gradual 20-feet rise in elevation as you head north indoors, surprises await at every corner - such as a 10-feet high waterfall, a spectacular overlook of the conservatory, and a pool with water lilies. At the end, a sweet reward: an overlook of the Missouri River Valley, and entrance to the garden's century-old bur oak forest.

LARGER THAN LIFE

Union Pacific Railroad's Centennial No. 6900 and Big Boy 4023, two of the most powerful locomotives ever built, greet visitors to Omaha at nearby **Kenefick Park**, perched on a hill overlooking Interstate 80.

MODEL RAILROAD GARDEN

Listen closely while in the gardens to hear the clickety-clack of tiny trains traveling twiggy trestles. This handcrafted garden is made of all natural materials like twigs, berries, pinecones and cinnamon sticks. It is punctuated with reproductions of landmarks and countrysides.

DITCH HD FOR THE REAL THING AND EXPLORE THE **GREAT OUTDOORS AT** FONTENELLE FOREST. NO FAKE TWEETS HERE.

ne of the largest private nature centers in the nation, the forest covers 1,400 acres and includes 28 trails of different lengths and climbs. The most popular trail is the one-mile long Riverview Boardwalk, a wooden walkway that loops through the forest allowing easy access for wheelchairs and strollers.

Discover a wide range of vastly different ecosystems, from deciduous forest to oak savanna, prairie and wetlands. See who can identify the most animal and plant life - Fontenelle is home to more than 600 different species. Don't miss the "Constitution Tree" a bur oak that dates back to 1751 and was alive in 1787 when the Constitution of the United States was signed. The tree was given its Constitutional designation in 1976 when the nation celebrated its bicentennial.

If you want to get up close with hawks, owls, falcons and eagles, and learn why the turkey vulture is grossly underappreciated, make sure to check out the Raptor Wildlife Refuge. Thirty feet above the forest floor, it's a chance to get a bird's eye view of the forest. Walk across a suspension bridge, wink at an owl, and see these amazing birds of prey in 22 customized mini raptor resorts.

LOCALS For a secluded outdoor **IOW** experience, Chad recommends snowshoeing on the trails in the winter.










TreeRush Adventure Park at Fontenelle Forest is a brand-new way to experience the forest. It's an aerial amusement park suspended over 6 acres, where visitors ages 4 to 94 can explore the forest from the treetops.

After expert instruction, you will navigate ziplines, suspended obstacles, bridges, rope ladders, tunnels and other surprises at your own pace on multiple trails at multiple heights. The seven different trails are color-coded according to level of difficulty. Trails are marked beginner to expert. They consist of 100 challenging elements and include more than 10 zip lines. The most challenging trails are up to 55 feet above the ground.

For pint-sized thrill seekers, there's KidRush. Ideal for kids ages 4 to 6 but fun for ages 7 and 8 too, this area is specially designed with smaller bodies in mind. The obstacles are only a few feet off the ground, which allows a parent or guardian to walk alongside.

Tip: Plan for three hours. This includes instruction, getting in and out of your safety gear, and two hours of climbing. Wear sneakers or hiking shoes and well-fitting clothing that won't hang loose or get tangled in cables and ropes.

Omaha campgrounds and RV parks are conveniently located close to major interstates, highways, and on the outskirts of the city near rivers and lakes. Each one promises a peaceful and picturesque place to spend the night and create lasting memories.




HIKING & BIKING

Omaha's trail system is called **Paths of Discovery** - each twist and turn winds through a different part of the city. More than 85 miles of paved interconnected trails invite walkers, joggers, bicyclists, skaters and cross-country skiers. The system is also accessible to people with disabilities.

DRIVING SAFARI

Just west of Omaha, you'll find the **Lee G. Simmons Conservation Park & Wildlife Safari**, a four mile drive-through wildlife adventure. Drive, hike and see animals in their natural habitat. A new 600-square foot viewing deck overlooks 40 acres of land where a herd of American Bison roam.







LAKE & RIVER ADVENTURES

Located in various parts of the metro area, **Zorinsky**, **Glenn Cunningham**, **Standing Bear**, **Manawa**, **Flanagan**, **Youngman**, **Wehrspann** and **Walnut Creek** lakes each offer their own unique outdoor experience and are typically stocked with largemouth bass, bluegill, crappie and channel catfish.

Get active in and on the water with paddleboard tours offered by **Driftwood Paddleboard Adventures**, or a kayak or standup paddleboard rental from **Neighborhood Offshore**. For a more leisurely experience, try tanking or tubing down the Elkhorn River; **Tank Down the Elkhorn** and **Tubing & Adventures** both offer fun river experiences. To figure out which method to try, just determine how wet you're willing to get. Tanking entails riding in an 8-foot diameter stock tank complete with custom-made picnic tables, while tubing involves sitting in a commercial grade inner tube. If you need a little speed, hop aboard one of the **Bryson Airboat Tours** and take off on a 60mph wind-in-your-hair ride down the river.

YEAR-ROUND OUTDOOR FUN

Thrill seekers should head to **Mt. Crescent Ski Area**, located 15 miles northeast of Omaha. In the winter, Mt. Crescent offers a variety of slopes with ski runs that reach up to 2,400 feet in length; sledders, snowboarders and spectators are welcome. In summer and fall, zip down one of the country's longest ziplines. Find fun for the entire family in a lush setting at **Eugene T. Mahoney State Park**. Nestled along the Platte River, the 700-acre park offers warm weather activities like miniature golf and a driving range, tennis, horseback riding, hiking, paddle boating and fishing, along with cold weather fun like cross-country skiing, sledding, tobogganing, ice skating and ice fishing. **TreeRush Adventures at Fontenelle Forest** offers all-ages options for traversing the forest on zip lines, suspended bridges, rope ladders and other exhilarating aerial features.

OMAHA GOLF

Rolling hills and tree-lined fairways complete with water hazards and sand traps ensure each golf course has its own character and competitive challenges. From executive-style to championship courses, swing your way through Omaha's unique golf landscapes. Go to VisitOmaha.com/golf for a complete list of golf courses in Omaha.

Projected to open spring 2020, **Topgolf** brings the outdoor fun of golf indoors. The multi-level facility features high-tech golf balls and gaming, climate-controlled hitting bays, music and more in a lively, laid-back atmosphere fit for serious and casual golfers alike.

What do you get when you mix Caribbean, African, Southeast Asian, rockabilly, Hollywood, funk and surfer cultures? Laka Lono Rum Club, a colorful tiki bar ripped right out of the quirkiest corner of your imagination. Speak easy as you enter into some of Omaha's trendiest craft cocktail bars. The Wicked Rabbit takes quests through the looking glass into a wonderland-themed lounge, shaking and serving extravagant drinks for the mad at heart. An oasis inspired by Japanese street-art, Kaitei mixes cocktails made with traditional whisky, unfiltered sake and popping lychee Boba. Osteria Segreto is a hidden bar in the Blackstone District. A candle burning in the window means you're welcome to come in and enjoy the Italian themed cocktails. Inspired by the pre-Prohibition era, Berry & Rye puts an experimental and contemporary perspective on drinks made with a reverse osmosis water system that ensures the purest water possible for its craft ice program, alongside the sodas, syrups and bitters made in-house. Other popular spots for craft cocktails are Wilson & Washburn, The Boiler Room and Nite Owl.

Wine down at one of Omaha's vino-specific lounges. Visit La Buvette, Corkscrew Wine & Cheese and Vino Mas for hundreds of wine options from around the world perfect for avid wine connoisseurs, novice vino drinkers and everyone in between. If sipping a good drink and smoking a stogie is more your style, Havana Garage in the Old Market Entertainment District offers a cool, casual place fitting of its name, complete with a walk-in humidor. Jake's Cigars and Spirits is a mainstay in the Benson neighborhood (think Cheers but with cigars) and Copa Cabana in west Omaha offers a cigar smoking lounge along with a large whiskey collection.



Benson is home to some of the coolest venues in the city. The Waiting Room Lounge is known for hosting a variety of local, national, and international stars.

Omaha Performing Arts provides the best Broadway, jazz, blues, dance, comedy, family and popular entertainment. Its landmark venues, the Orpheum Theater and Holland Performing Arts Center, present worldclass performances and events throughout the year. Scriptown Brewing Company: Specializing in session-strength beers with a lower alcohol content, allowing customers to enjoy several pints in "session" with friends or family.

Upstream Brewing Company: Known for its fresh-brewed draught beers, cask-conditioned and barrel-aged beers, along with a full menu of New American pub fare.





From space to serenity, the stunning glass chapel, **Holy Family Shrine**, was created for travelers as an oasis for peace and tranquility. Two streams cut through the limestone that forms the floor and foundation of the chapel, and its unique glass architecture with its curved wooden arches makes it a perfect place to stop and enjoy the beauty.



HOME TO THE ORIGINAL REUBEN

The Reuben sandwich was invented in Omaha back in the early 1900s. We don't care what New Yorkers say, this is our story and we're sticking to it. During a late-night poker game at the Blackstone Hotel, a local grocer was asked to "ante up" and create a new dish. The ingredients he had on hand resulted in an American menu staple. How do you create a national treasure? You start with two pieces of grilled marble rye and stuff it with slow cooked corned beef topped with sauerkraut, bubbly Swiss cheese, and creamy Russian or Thousand Island dressing. Omaha continues to perfect the classic while local restaurants add their own unique spin.

TIP: Get a taste of Omaha's many Reuben sandwiches with an Omaha Culinary Tour.

Brazen Head Irish Pub's Rachel Reuben is made with tender smoked turkey, sauerkraut, Thousand Island dressing and havarti cheese all between the traditional marble rye.

Barrett's Barleycorn Pub & Grill takes the classic approach of corned beef, Swiss cheese, sauerkraut and Thousand Island dressing on grilled rye.

The Drover's Reuben swaps out the corned beef for a mound of slow-roasted prime rib covered in melted Swiss cheese, creamy dressing and sauerkraut.

Wilson & Washburn's Reuben starts with their house-smoked brisket and includes all of the traditional fixings like Swiss cheese, sauerkraut and house dressing, all stacked between two slices of Russian rye bread.

Across the street from the Blackstone Hotel is the **Crescent Moon**, a local favorite still serving the original recipe.

The Reuben has been a menu staple at the **Dundee Dell** since 1934. Choose from corned beef or turkey and taste test their super-secret sauce.

AFTER ONE TASTE, YOU'LL KNOW WHY OMAHA LOVES DINING IN DIVES.

Being an Omaha dive is an honor bestowed upon only the worthiest restaurants ... those that serve quirky dishes destined for fame, attract hordes of ravenous fans, inspire numerous Instagram posts, and garner the attention of national television audiences.

Answer the call of the wild at **Alpine Inn**, where everyone loves the fried chicken ... everyone. Evening diners (okay, raccoons) sit outside the restaurant's windows feasting on chicken scraps—your dinner party just got a lot bigger. The chicken's perfectly seasoned crunch gives way to tender, juicy meat—after just one bite, folks (and animals) fall in love. California Tacos and More is a beloved collegejoint-turned-food-attraction after being featured on the Food Network's "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives." "Cali Taco" is known for its signature tacos (housemade fried, puffy taco shells stuffed with meat and fixings) and entrees with Mexican flair. Big Mama's Kitchen is another "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives" alumnus and was featured on the Travel Channel's "101 Tastiest Places to Chow Down." This soul food joint is known for dishes like the Afro Burger, Pig Ear Sandwich, oven-fried chicken and sweet potato pie ice cream. For more fresh fried food, cruise to The Surfside Club. Here's the short and sweet menu: chicken, pork tenderloin, catfish and corn fritters - all fried and all delicious. Stop for a cozy and portable Runza, aka "a meal in a bunza," at Runza. A local favorite and Nebraska invention, the Runza is a pocket of dough filled with beef, cabbage, seasonings and sometimes cheese. They're so popular, out-of-towners order them by the case and take them home. Bronco's, another Omaha fast-food tradition, opened nearly 60 years ago when "fast food" was still a new concept. Known for its 100 percent ground-beef burgers, Bronco's still makes its French fries daily from fresh whole potatoes.


SOME DISHES NEED TO BE CONQUERED

The Stellanator at Stella's Bar and Grill weighs in at 4.5 lbs. and contains a mere 4,900 calories. It includes ... wait for it ... six burger patties, six fried eggs, six pieces of cheese, 12 pieces of bacon, lettuce, tomato, fried onions, pickles, jalapeños and peanut butter. If you can eat it in 45 minutes, it's free. Only 36 have succeeded, 651 others have tried and failed. The current record is held by a skinny girl named Molly; it took her just 3 minutes and 40 seconds to eat the whole thing plus an order of fries. Bring on the meat sweats!

Eli recommends Caribbean Delights in north-center Omaha. He likes to order the Jamacian Jerk chicken, fried plantains, sweet potato pudding and the must-try lemonade.

At Omaha's **Block 16**, die-hard fans line up and out the door on a daily basis. The locally sourced, award-winning burgers are piled high with fresh produce and covered in a secret sauce that keeps every mouth watering. (Locals recommend ordering extra sauce!) It's not just about the burgers - you gotta try the popular Gangsta fries, covered in green onions and pork rinds, then drizzled with Chipotle sauce. Considered one of the greenest restaurants in the country, The Grey Plume's awardwinning chef and owner Clayton Chapman maintains the vision of a fine dining experience where food is art—even the plates are created by local artists. Stirnella Bar & Kitchen is a refined gastro pub serving approachable food inspired by local and seasonal ingredients. Modern Love inspires vegans from across the country to plan their foodie excursions to Omaha. Popular vegan cooking personality Isa Chandra Moskowitz leads with the focus of providing "swanky vegan comfort food" made with local ingredients.

The nation is taking notice of the city's fresh fare. Omaha is home to three of the top 100 certified restaurants on the Good Food 100 List—The Grey Plume, Dante and Kitchen Table are recognized for their strong commitment to sustainable sourcing.

J. Coco's creations start with local, organic and natural ingredients. The restaurant uses fresh herbs and vegetables from their on-site garden. It doesn't get any fresher than that!

Omaha farmers markets run weekends from May through mid-October and offer everything from farm-fresh produce and cooking demonstrations to handmade soap and pet-friendly treats.

Mail-order favorite eCreamery serves 16 staple flavors of specialty ice cream, gelato and dairy-free sorbet in-store; customize your own flavor from home at eCreamery.com.

CHOCOLATE

Old Market Candy Shop whips up an array of chocolate confections like their famous Mud Ball truffles, "chicken legs," and fudge. Find whimsical chocolate covered cherries at **The Cordial Cherry**, whose cherries were one of Oprah's Favorite Things. Farine + Four serves up homemade bonbons almost too pretty to eat (almost). Hollywood Candy will thrill the kid at heart with retro candies, homemade fudge and chocolates. Chocolat Abeille serves hand-painted confections, including custom chocolate shoes, in a dreamy setting.

SIGNATURE DESSERTS

Locals rave about **Lithuanian Bakery's** Napoleon Torte, a three-day labor of love built of 17 layers of wafer and vanilla and lemon buttercreams, with a luscious apricot surprise at its center. **Bob's Donuts** serves up square donuts in flavors like Oreo Delight and Maple Bacon. Tip: The massive "The Bob" donut is a crowd pleaser (it will feed the whole family). **Stirnella's** Gooey Butter Bar is made of banana curd, Nutella ice cream, and shortbread crumble – it's the talk of the city.

Harold's Koffee House is known for homemade doughnuts and the Suzi Special—a plate overflowing with grilled onions, hash browns and two scrambled eggs (add the cheese and gravy). Float into foodie heaven with hash browns, eggs and biscuits smothered in creamy sausage gravy with Lisa's Radial Café's signature breakfast dish, The Raft. Saddle Creek Breakfast Club is a favorite with the locals flocking (and often waiting in lines out the door) for tasty morning fare like banana pancakes topped with thinly sliced bananas and peanuts, and the hearty steak-and-eggs burrito.

Sure, steak's in Omaha's DNA, but we also celebrate all things pork. Fact: Breakfast is better with bacon. **Bailey's** proudly claims to serve the best bacon in town. Other specialties include an array of eggs Benedict dishes and fresh, fluffy pancakes.

Other breakfast hotspots include 11-Worth Café, Shirley's Diner and Wheatfields.

OMAHA'S BRUNCH SCENE IS AN INSTAGRAM-WORTHY DINING ADVENTURE.

Railcar Modern American Kitchen has perfected dishes both sweet and savory, from lemon ricotta pancakes with zest to prime rib and artichoke potato pancakes. Over Easy whips up farm fresh faves with artistic flair, like homemade pop tarts and an elevated take on chicken and waffles. Caddy's Kitchen & Cocktails serves up a Meal-in-a-Mug Bloody Mary complete with a slider, hard-boiled egg, bacon, chicken wings, beef jerky and more. Enjoy brunch every day at Early Bird; try their Cereal Killer Pancakes with sweet vanilla glaze and your choice of kid-approved cereal.

Other brunch options include **Baela Rose**, **Le Bouillon** and **712 Eat + Drink**.

THE OLD MARKET

THIS LIVELY 9-SQUARE BLOCK AREA IS UNIQUELY OMAHA AND FILLED WITH NOSTALGIA AND INNOVATION.

obblestone streets lined with unique boutiques, antique emporiums, innovative restaurants, local pubs and tasty sweet shops create the magic of the Old Market Entertainment District. The Old Market and its red brick warehouses were the epicenter of activity back in the 1880s, bustling with produce dealers, buyers and traders, until the late 1950s when the area was threatened with building condemnation. But Sam Mercer, the son of a prominent physician and landowner, wanted to renovate the old buildings for new uses. At the time, Mercer's idea was said to be foolish; today he is considered a visionary.

The Mercer family still runs one of the most popular restaurants in the Old Market, **La Buvette**. This quaint European-style wine bar offers a French menu, grocery with bread baked daily and one of the best outdoor side walk café settings in the neighborhood. Other dining standouts in the Old Market include: **M's Pub** known for its Lahvosh and Carrot Dog; **Blue Sushi** and its legendary happy hour; **The Monster Club** with its horror-themed restaurant and bar; and **Le Bouillon**, known for the chef's take on French comfort food.

TIP: Most downtown Omaha hotels are within walking distance and offer complimentary shuttle service to and from the Old Market Entertainment District.









For sweets lovers, you must try a Mud Ball from the **Old Market Candy Shop**, the cheesecake by the inch at **Wheatfield's**, the honey-infused chocolate at **Chocolate Abeille**, and ice cream from **Ted and Wally's**, where premium ice cream is made from scratch and comes in some wild, never-before-heard-of flavors. Oh, yeah ... you also have to visit **Hollywood Candy**, a wall-to-wall retro candy experience unlike anything you've ever seen.

Shopping in the Old Market runs the gamut from boutique clothing shops such as **Flying Worm**, **Nouvelle Eve**, and **Overland Sheepskin Co.** to specialty shops such as **Tannenbaum Christmas Shop**, **Old Market Artist Gallery** and **City Limits**, where nothing is off limits.




Nancy recommends Laka Lono Rum Club – for wheelchair users, this downstairs tiki bar may not look accessible, but employees are happy to escort you down the elevator to enjoy the exotic drinks and atmosphere.



In addition to carriage rides and sidewalk musicians that really capture the neighborhood's charm, the Old Market also offers a distinctive nightlife scene. Laka Lono Rum Club welcomes patrons to paradise with over-the-top fun craft cocktails. Mister Toads and Billy Frogg's, in addition to their amphibian reference, both offer an eclectic atmosphere and great outdoor patios. The Berry & Rye serves experimental, contemporary cocktails and both Upstream Brewing Company and Brickway Brewery/Distillery create some of the best tasting craft beer around.

Shhhh ... don't tell anyone, but right outside the Old Market near the **Orpheum Theater** look for the **Looking Glass Cigar and Spirits** shop. Go in and ask for the **Wicked Rabbit**—this secret speakeasy will not disappoint.





NODO AND THE CAPITOL DISTRICT

ust north of downtown, hence its nickname, this urban neighborhood is home to big sports, big music and big style ... and it's only getting started.

The new kid on the block is **The Capitol District**, which offers a modern twist on the traditional town square. More than a dozen restaurants, nightlife options, and entertainment venues all in one spot make for an easy night of unwinding and enjoying. Be sure to check out **The Jewell**, a contemporary music venue celebrating Omaha's rich musical history and great jazz musicians.

Across the street, **CHI Health Center Omaha** (don't let its name fool you) is the city's award-winning convention center and arena. It attracts the world's biggest names in music and entertainment and also plays host to major sporting events such as the **2020 NCAA Men's Basketball Championships** (1st and 2nd rounds), **2020 U.S. Olympic Swim Trials** and the **2020 NCAA Volleyball Championships**.

A short walk out the door is **TD Ameritrade Park Omaha**, home of the **NCAA Men's College World Series**. This summer tradition creates an electrifying atmosphere that fills the NoDo area and has everyone ready to play ball.





Cutting-edge art adds a hip side to NoDo with **Hot Shops Art Center**. Watch as more than 80 artists create works ranging from metal forging and glass blowing, to hand-crafted jewelry and photography. NoDo's creativity continues at the **Omaha Design Center**, a sleek venue serving as home of **Omaha Fashion Week** (OFW). OFW is one of the country's largest celebrations of fashion. Twice a year the season's hottest trends walk the runway and offer fashionistas the chance to snag looks before they hit the stores.

The **Slowdown** is a great place to catch some of the hottest rock shows at one of the hottest music venues in the nation. Watch a first-run indie film or documentary at **Film Streams at Ruth Sokolof Theater**, an intimate cinema arthouse. **Hook & Lime** specializes in tacos and tequila - go for the house margaritas, stay for the flavorful small plates. **The Trap Room** is a quirky, retro bar with a serious cocktail menu built for the craft-curious. **DJ's Dugout Sports Bar** is a great pre or post-game spot with drink and food specials. **Nosh Restaurant and Wine Lounge** has over 100 wines available and servers are ready to match you with your perfect pinot.



The Motens, avid performing art lovers, recommend **The Jewell** jazz club for great live music served with a chef-inspired meal.



MIDTOWN CROSSING

idtown Crossing's epicenter is **Turner Park**, hosting a variety of free events throughout the year. Keep centered with yoga in the park sessions on select Sundays in the spring and kick off the week with movie screenings that will keep the entire family entertained in both spring and summer. Live jazz music fills Midtown and offers a relaxing way to spend a Thursday summer evening. Once the leaves start to turn, it's fall festival time and dazzling entertainment lights up the holiday season.

Find plenty of food options ranging from trendy vegan food at **Modern Love** and upscale Mexican dishes at **Cantina Laredo** to comfy casual at **Black Oak Grill** and hearty seafood at **Krab Kingz**. Enjoy acclaimed farm-to-table freshness at **The Grey Plume**, one of the nation's greenest restaurants. Thirsty? Indulge in a trendy treat at **Thirst-Tea**, a tea-drinkers candy store with a variety of flavor-infused teas made customizable with a number of "toppings."

Proof offers hundreds of whiskies from around the world, along with handcrafted cocktails and an impressive spirits list. Find funky, fun gifts and décor at **The Afternoon**, a long-time Omaha favorite for jewelry, books, pottery, gadgets and more.



Make your own succulent arrangement and find locally made accessories, décor and furniture at **Hutch**. Four-legged family members are welcome on a handful of pet-friendly patios, with pet-centric events like the **Patio "Pup" Crawl** to **Halloween Tricks for Treats** offering more fun for the furry. **Element Hotel** invites patrons to recharge and find balance, making a stay in Midtown Crossing its own rejuvenating experience.





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BLACKSTONE

KNOWN AS THE BIRTHPLACE OF THE REUBEN SANDWICH, THIS ULTRA-HIP NEIGHBORHOOD SERVES UP CRAFT BREW, TRENDY RESTAURANTS, FRIENDLY LOUNGES AND GIANT MEATBALLS.

es, the Reuben sandwich was originally created in the Blackstone District back in the 1920s and visitors can taste the original recipe at **Crescent Moon**. Consistently ranked one of the top beer bars in the country by *DRAFT Magazine*, "The Moon" is located above **Huber Haus**, an authentic German beer hall serving up bier, brats and the famous Das Boot! Both are friendly neighbors to **Beertopia**, Omaha's premier beer emporium offering nearly 600 international specialty beers.

Along with its rich history, Blackstone District offers some new local favorites. Two craft breweries, **Farnam House Brewing** and **Scriptown Brewery**, have added to Omaha's growing reputation as a craft beer city and each offers a unique experience. Not to be ignored, **Corkscrew Wine & Cheese** serves a variety of vino for every palate. **Coneflower Creamery** offers farm-to-cone ice cream in out-of-this-world flavors. A typical order consists of two scoops and some may be tempted to "be good" and only order one. We know from experience ... everyone wants the second scoop.



Marcos, Nancy, Eli and Chad all recommend Nite Owl in Blackstone for its retro atmosphere and some of the best burgers in town.







Nite Owl is the quirky, cool craft cocktail bar with a late night food menu featuring thick burgers, salty fries, and fresh salads until 2 a.m. **The Blackstone Meatball** takes an Italian American classic and adds locally-sourced twists ... these aren't your mama's meatballs. **Mula** is Blackstone's ultra-trendy Mexican restaurant and certified tequileria. **Noli's Pizzeria** and **Forno** serve up fresh New York-style and wood-fire pizzas, respectively. **Stirnella** offers a chef-driven farm to fork menu and **Early Bird** only does brunch, but they do it every day in a not-so-every-day way. Hungry yet? Because there's a lot more. **Butterfish, Indian Bowl** and **Ansel's Pastrami and Bagels** help round out this celebrated dining district.

on't miss this trendy, historic neighborhood always buzzing with activity ... especially at night. Walking up and down the Benson "strip" is energizing, with live music pouring out of **The Waiting Room**, a nationally recognized indie rock club. For a more intimate venue, stop by **Reverb Lounge**, known for live music and a host of tiki drinks. **Krug Park** will spice up the night with a dozen Bloody Mary concoctions and an array of craft cocktails. A strong contender in the battle for the best Bloody Mary can be found across the street at **Jake's Cigars & Spirits**.

Known for strong drinks and an inclusive humidor, Jake's is the epitome of the friendly neighborhood bar.

Benson is a well-rounded and not-so-mild mannered entertainment district with a cool atmosphere ... so cool even animals get in on the fun. Benson regulars keep an eye out for Shooter, the Benson bar cat. Shooter can be seen sauntering in and out of the neighborhood bars greeting patrons and nuzzling bartenders. Benson's other party animal is Sam, the beloved party dog of **Burke's Pub**. The friendly Great Dane entertains patrons and adds to the bar's carefree vibe.

If you want really good nachos, just ask a teenager – Noah recommends the pulled pork nachos at 1912.



On nice days, visitors enjoy the rooftop patios at **1912** and **Benson Brewery**. Watch the strip come to life while sipping a craft cocktail and enjoying gourmet bar menus.

The streets light up during **Benson First Fridays**. Artists and art enthusiasts enjoy live music, spoken word, street performances, visual art and more.

Beercade is every fanboy's dream come true. Enjoy craft beer and wall-to-wall classic arcade games such as Skeeball, Pac-Man and Mortal Kombat.

An array of dining options can be found on the strip. **IKA Ramen and Izakaya** is known for mixing noodles with gangster rap. **Taco Co**. has quickly become a fan fave serving cold margaritas and addictive puffy shell tacos all in a trendy atmosphere. **Yoshitomo** is a unique sushi dining experience for the culinary curious. **Au Courant Regional Kitchen** is a fine dining experience with European-influenced meals.

ksarben Village is a distinctive mixed-use development marrying urban space with events, dining and shopping options in the heart of the city. Bring your appetite for food and drink to the village. From **DJ's Dugout** and its dueling pianos to **Jones Bros.** and its Cupcake War-worthy assortment of unique treats, there's no shortage of casual restaurants and bars to enjoy. Try the braided crust pizza at **Dudley's Pizza & Tavern**, the mango crab rangoon at **Mai Thai** and tacos stuffed with shrimp, brisket or even alligator at **Voodoo Taco**. Featured nationally on *CBS' Sunday Morning* with Jane Pauley, a new must-try is **Inner Rail Food Hall**. It includes nine specialty food vendors serving elevated cuisine from across the globe in a modern food hall atmosphere.

Stinson Park is adjacent to Aksarben Village and offers live concerts and entertainment events throughout the year. From May through October the farmers market fills the streets with fresh produce and handmade products. Active folks will be tempted to hop on a **Heartland B-cycle** bicycle to explore nearby trails.

Take a breather from all the fun and indulge in area history. Aksarben Village stands where the bustling Ak-Sar-Ben Race Track (1919-1995) and Coliseum once stood. Its celebrated history is punctuated in Stinson Park with a bronze figure marking the grave of Omaha, the 1935 Triple Crown winner. FUN FACT: Aksarben is "Nebraska" spelled backwards.



While dining, here's an interesting fact to share with culinary comrades: Dundee is home to a national cartoon artist, a successful romance novelist and billionaire Warren Buffett, one of the richest men in the world. You never know who could be dining next to you in this fabled neighborhood. (Beatles Icon Paul McCartney was spotted here eating ice cream with Buffett a few years ago, and Bono's been known to drop into Dundee Dell.)

orth Omaha is where jazz greats like Duke Ellington and Count Basie once played. Today, the notes from live jazz performances still float through the air from Love's Jazz and Art Center, dedicated to preserving and showcasing all types of African American art. The Union for Contemporary Arts is another opportunity to experience and create modern art, while the Great Plains Black History Museum celebrates the contributions of African Americans through exhibits and seminars. Civil Rights leader Malcolm X was born in Omaha; his birthsite includes an historical marker and an events plaza.

For soul food, check out **Big Mama's Kitchen** and order up a pig ear sandwich and sweet potato pie ice cream. Big Mama's has become a television culinary staple, featured on Food Network's *Diners, Drive-Ins & Dives*, Sundance Channel's *Ludo Bites America* and Travel Channel's *101 Tastiest Places to Chow Down*. **Emery's Cafe** offers southern food favorites like smothered chicken, smoked turkey collards and candied yams.







Florence is a historic neighborhood that has more history markers in one square mile than anywhere else in the state. Experience firsthand the Mormon migration of the 1840s at the **Mormon Trail Center at Historic Winter Quarters**. Just north is the **Florence Mill**, constructed in 1846 as pioneers made their westward trek; this museum and art gallery is open spring through fall. Other area historical attractions include **Florence Bank** and **Florence Depot**.

Comfort food is never far in Florence. Old school diner **Harold's Koffee House** serves up breakfast classics (don't skip the pancakes) while **Alpine Inn** serves up signature fried chicken. **Finicky Frank's** offers comfort foods with a twist in a dining room full of character and **Tussey's Casual Grill** serves up a bright and fresh globally-inspired menu.

rom folk art and hand-painted murals to authentic cuisine and local shops, South Omaha offers big doses of Polish, Czech, German and Mexican culture at every turn. At its heart is Historic South 24th Street, filled with Mexican traditions. Dozens of family-owned restaurants line the intricately tiled sidewalks of South 24th Street. Enjoy savory slow-cooked chicken enchiladas, fiery roasted jalapeños and carne asada (marinated and grilled thinly sliced steak) at a handful of eateries. Afterwards, grab a yo-yo (a traditional Latino pastry) or artisan bread at The International Bakery. Don't forget about margaritas; El Alamo, Gauca Maya and elsewhere in "South O," are known for serving up a mean cocktail. South Omaha offers tried-and-true dishes made from old-world family recipes and Lithuanian Bakery's Napoloen Torte is a shining example. Joe Tess Place has been an area staple since the 1930s, serving quality fresh fish and their famous fish sandwich; it's also been featured on the Food Network's Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives. Don't let the hole-in-the-wall ambiance fool you; the meatball sub and Italian sausage sandwich at Ethnic Sandwich **Shop**, which has been making Italian food since 1977, will have you craving more.






El Museo Latino celebrates the area's rich diversity with exhibits and programs, where special events include performances by "CHOMARI" Ballet Folklorico Mexicano. Apollon Art Space is Omaha's multi-genre arts and entertainment venue offering locally produced art exhibits and events. Don't miss the themed, interactive dinners allowing the audience to get into character and join in the fun. South Omaha Museum works to preserve and display the past and present of the "Magic City" with rotating exhibits on the area's stockyard history, Cinco de Mayo and more.

Mora recommends The International Bakery for authentic Mexican pastries. They have wall-to-wall treats at great prices.



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
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


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
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
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
