


Explore Aviation History and Be Inspired

Exhibits

The Museum is home to an extraordinary collection of aircraft, spacecraft, and Cold War artifacts that make it one of the premier air and space museums in the nation.

The history of our collection spans more than 70 years, featuring aircraft that range from propeller aircraft of the pre-World War II era to the supersonic jet aircraft of the Cold War to the cutting-edge technology of manned space exploration.

During your visit to the SAC Aerospace Museum you can explore the history and technology that played an important role in American history. You will see more than 45 aircraft, spacecraft and missiles along with exhibits and displays that provide detailed examinations of the incredible operations and events such as Linebacker II, the Doolittle Tokyo Raid, and the Martin Bomber Plant.

The Museum features the special heritage of manned space flight from the Mercury Program to the International Space Station with a spotlight on Nebraska's own astronaut, Clayton Anderson.



Museum Amenities

The Museum is a 330,000 square foot facility with three hangars, a Children's Learning Center, Flight Simulator rides, Museum Store, Restaurant, Education Classrooms, and a Gallery for temporary exhibits. We also restore aircraft on-site, and guests can observe the process through our Observation Gallery.

We offer guided tours, camps, workshops, monthly family events, and unique rental spaces. Whether you are seeking a location to celebrate a wedding, birthday party, or a private event, the Museum has it all!

Education

Each year, the Museum serves school-age children through a variety of field trips, camps, overnight programs, and outreach. Our staff is focused on providing quality STEM related, cross-curricular, programs that meet state standards and engage students with interactive lessons.

Our educators work with children one-on-one to improve critical thinking skills with interactive tactics and tools in areas of robotics, design challenges, science experiments, coding technology, and a variety of cross-curricular STEM subjects.
