From the Salt Lake valley, Park City is a mere 25 miles away, nestled high in the Wasatch Mountain Range sitting at about 7,000 feet in elevation.

History & lasting legacy.

From silver mining town to world-class skiing destination, a glimpse into the colorful history of Park City.

Park City is incorporated as a town.

884

The Great Fire destroys nearly everything in the commercial district. It will take about 20 years until everything is rebuilt.

1898

ParkCityturnsintoaghost town as mining becomes unprofitable,leavingminers out of work.

1950s

Salt Lake XIX Olympic Winter Games brings athletesandspectators up to Park City for ski, snowboard, and ice track events.

2002

Park City has grown to be a year-rounddestinationsought bynational and international guests for its lively town, amazing recreation and easy access to/from Salt Lake International Airport. Today, 47 buildings from the Silver Mineera are included on the National Historic Register, as well as the entire Downtown District listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Present

1874

An abundance of silver is discovered in the Park City mountains. Word quickly spreads and the small camp booms into a town.

1889

The town's population reaches over 5,000 people. Nationalities of immigrants included Swedish, Finnish, Cornish, Chinese, Scottish, Yugoslavian, and a large number of Irish.

1930s

Locals begin introducing skiing into the hills.

1960s-1980s

Skiing begins to pique interests once again for locals and tourists.

2018

Park City's Council unanimously votes to adopt one of North America's most ambitious climate goals to achieve net-zero carbon and run on 100% renewable electricity for city operations and forthewhole community by 2030.

XXVII Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City


