

PARK CITY AND YELLOWSTONE 7 NIGHTS / 8 DAYS

Park City, Utah is North America's most accessible mountain recreation destination, just a quick 35-minute drive from Salt Lake City International Airport. Start your National Parks adventure in Park City where you will immediately feel your vacation has just begun! Park City caters to all kinds of travelers with over 100 lodging options ranging from cozy boutique hotels to spacious condominiums and full-service hotels. The town is home to two renowned ski resorts, Deer Valley and Park City Mountain, offering The Greatest Snow on Earth®. These resorts, along with nearly 650 kilometers of public trails, offer endless opportunities for outdoor activities year-round. Food lovers will appreciate Park City's nearly 150 bars and restaurants, while shoppers can explore a variety of unique stores along historic Main Street and Kimball Junction.

DAY 1

1. Salt Lake City International Airport to Park City

Today your adventure begins as you arrive to Park City.

2. Explore Historic Main Street

At the heart of Park City is its historic Main Street — home to over 200 unique and local businesses. You can shop at independent boutiques and galleries, dine at one-of-a-kind restaurants, and enjoy local craft beer and spirits at the many bars and saloons or learn about the history of the area by exploring the Park City Museum. Everything is within a short walk or take a free ride on the Main Street Trolley.

DAY 2

1. Visit Park City Mountain

Summer brings long sunny days, cool mountain air and a variety of outdoor activities. Thrill seekers can enjoy a ride on one of the world's longest alpine slides, ride the Mountain Coaster or explore kilometers of stunning hiking and biking trails. Take in the views with a scenic lift or gondola ride or spend the day on the greens with your travel companions at Canyon Village's 18-hole golf course.

2. Visit Deer Valley Resort

Experience the "Deer Valley Difference" in Park City. Indulge in luxurious lodging, dining, and impeccable service, all contributing to unforgettable mountain memories. DAY 7

Explore the park's two free museums to learn about the history of skiing in the west and relive the Salt Lake 2002 Olympic Games. Take the ride of a lifetime on the bobsled or check out the extreme tubing, ziplining, ropes courses, alpine slide and more.

1. Enjoy Park City's Arts & Culture or Shopping

Hit the Park City shops and art galleries before your trip back home. We have everything from souvenirs, books, and sportswear to art collectibles. INTERNATIONAL DARK SKY PARKS

Jordanelle State Park is the closest accredited dark sky space to Park City. The Provo River flows from the Uinta Mountains and fills Jordanelle Reservoir. Water enthusiasts delight in maritime play opportunities.

Rockport State Park is between Wanship and Peoa on State Road 32 with the Wasatch Mountains spreading to the west and the Uinta Mountains dominating the eastern skyline. The park facilitates reoccurring programming to educate visitors about best dark sky practices and why dark skies are essential for nocturnal animals.

GUIDED TRIPS & TOURS

When there are so many things to do in Park City, sometimes you need someone to show you the way. And whether you're a thrill seeker, nature enthusiast, or history buff, there's a guided experience perfectly tailored to you.
