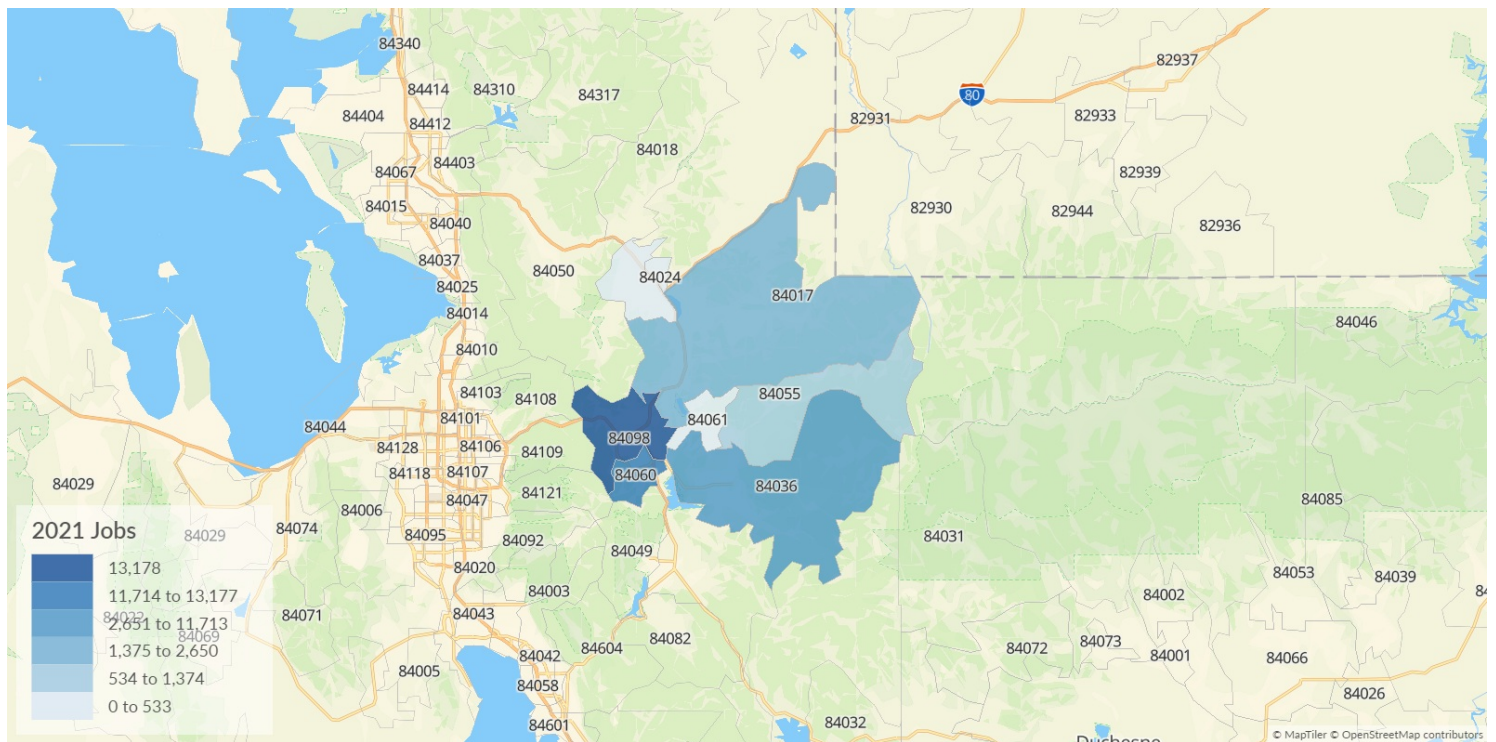

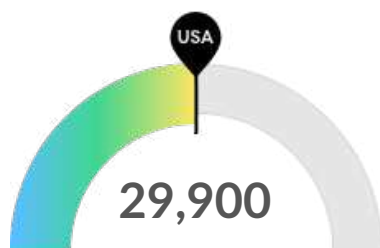

Aggressive Hiring Competition Over an Average Supply of Regional Talent



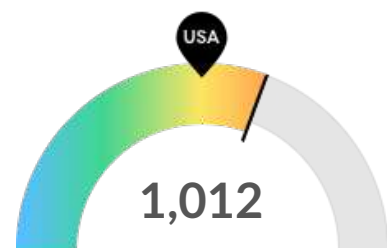
Supply (Jobs)

Demand (Job Postings)

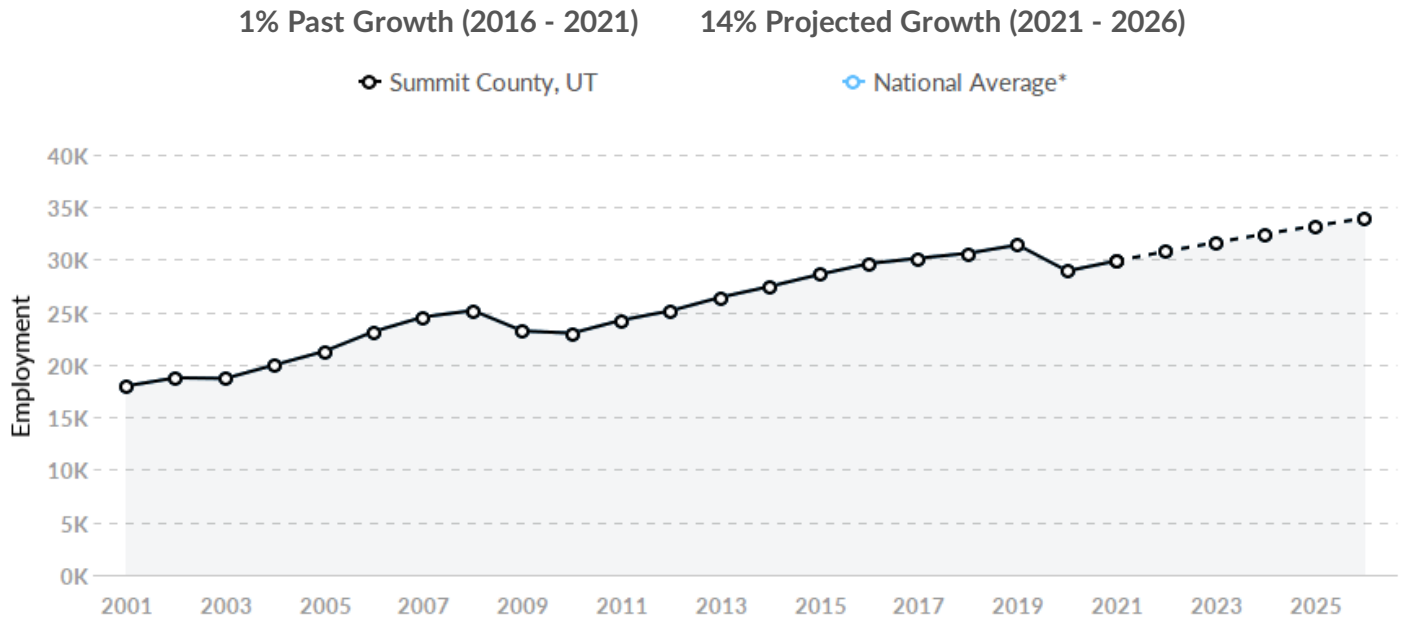
Competition from online job postings is high in Summit County, UT. The national average for an area this size is 739* job postings/mo, while there is 1,012 here.

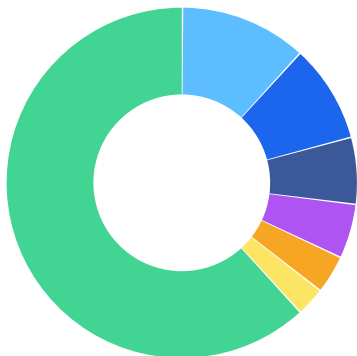
Supply Is About Equal to the National Average

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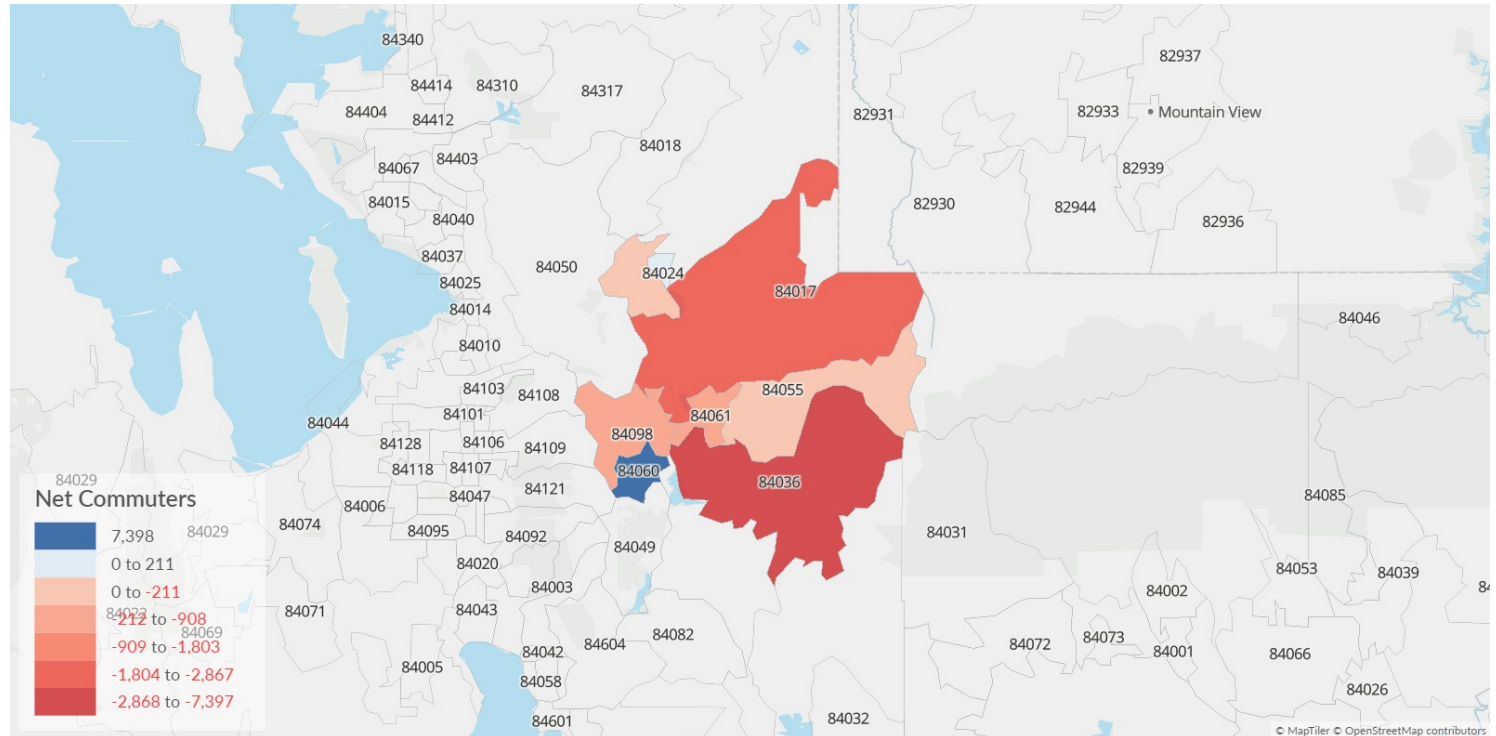

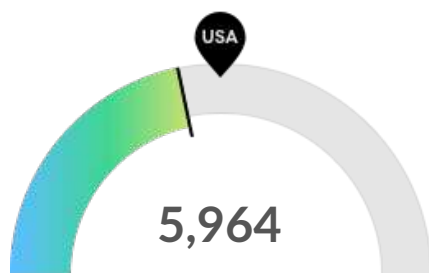

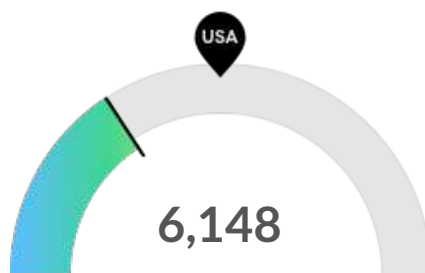

Retirement Risk Is Low, While Overall Diversity Is Low



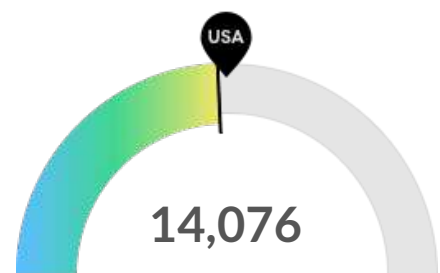
Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is low in Summit County, UT. The national average for an area this size is 11,224* racially diverse employees, while there are 6,148 here.



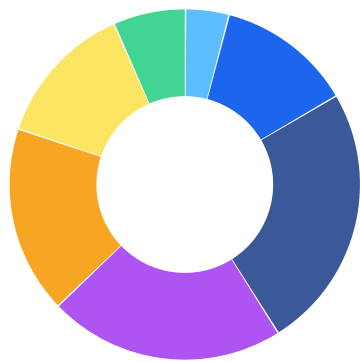
Gender Diversity

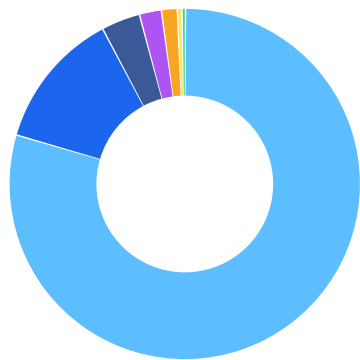

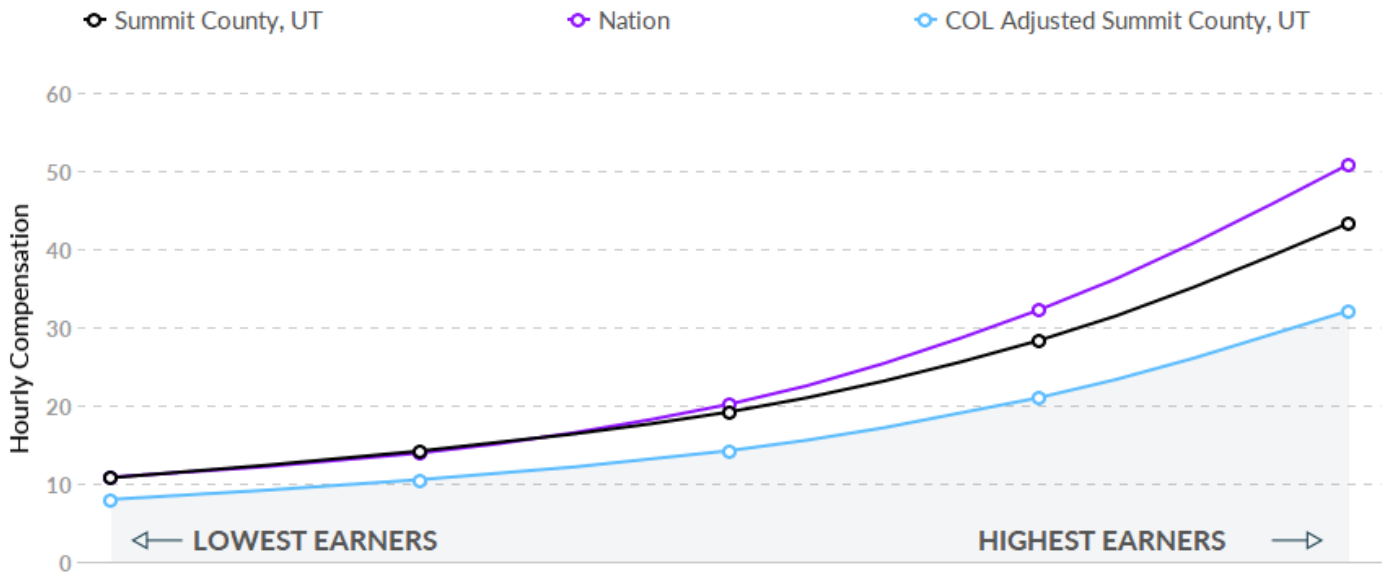

Compensation

Talent Is 5% Cheaper, While the Cost of Living May Make Attraction Difficult

In 2020, the median compensation for your occupations in Summit County, UT is \$19.16/hr. Based on the national median wage of \$20.15/hr for this position, this means you will spend about 5% less to employ your occupations here. However, their actual purchasing power will be 30% less than the national median when we adjust for regional cost of living (which is 35% higher than average). This may make it harder to attract talent to the region at this price.

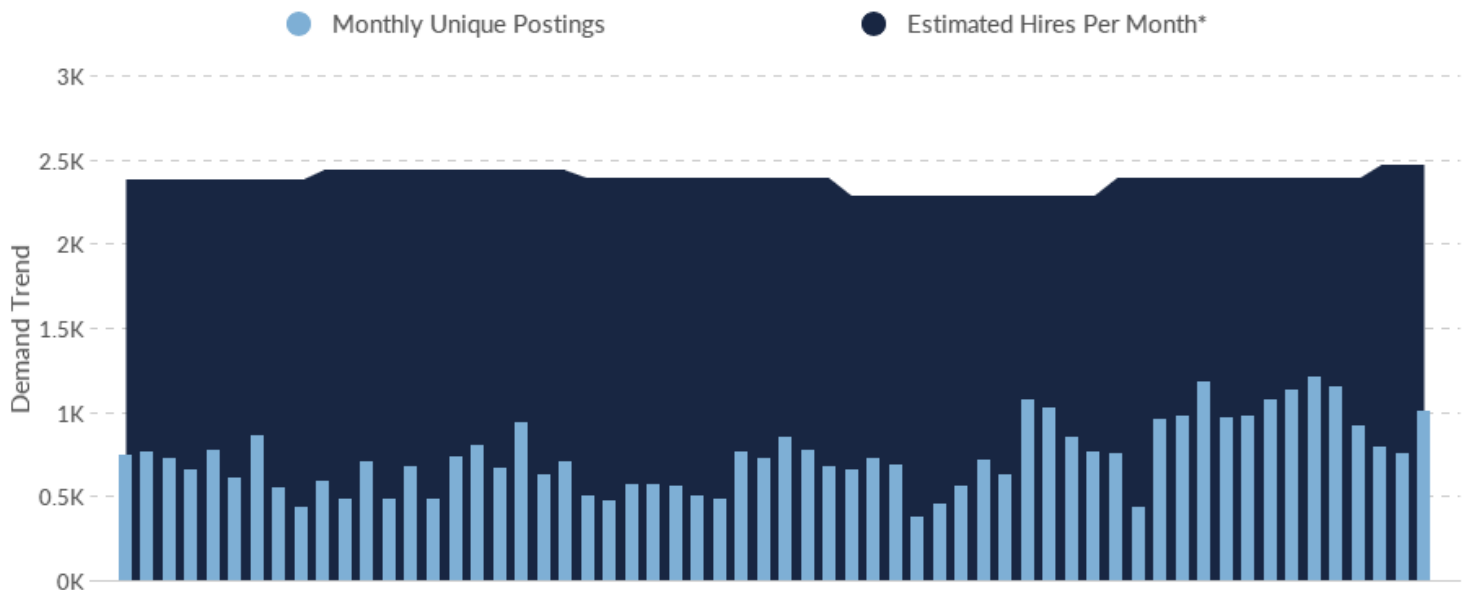

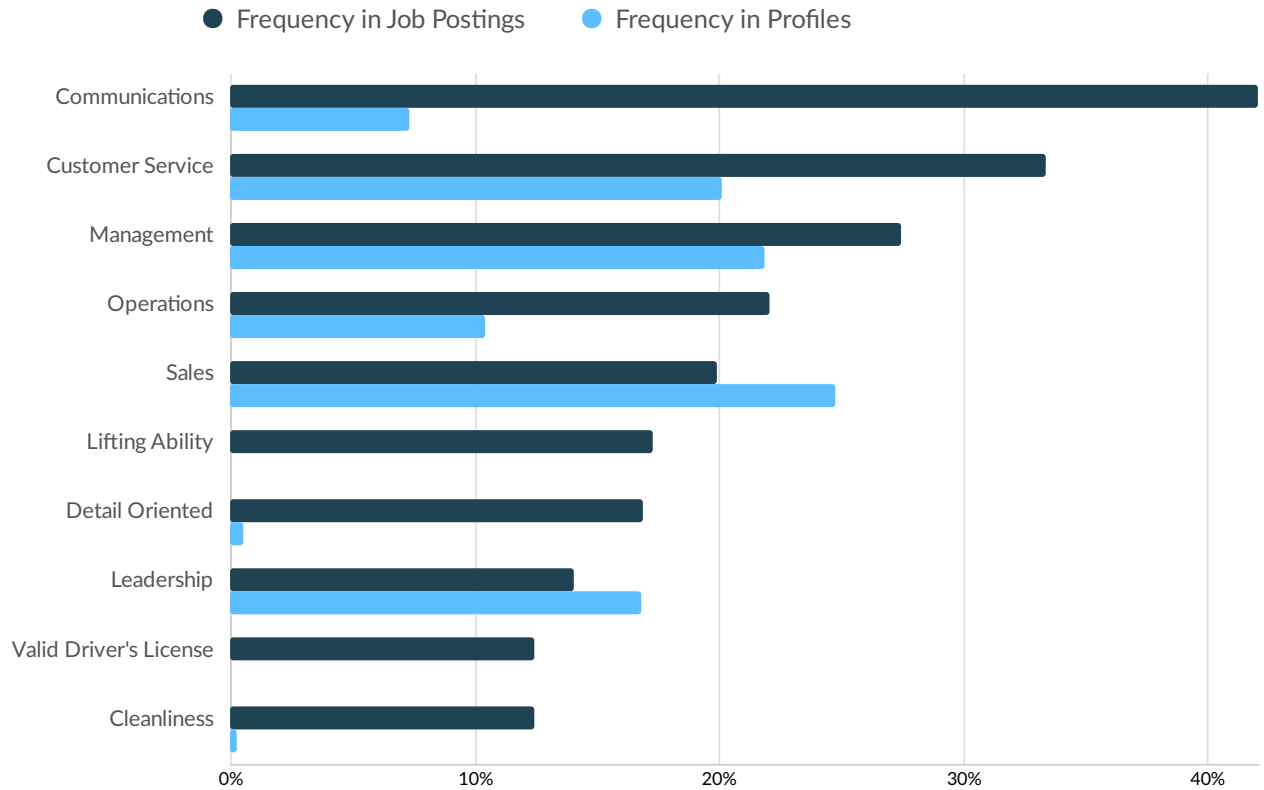

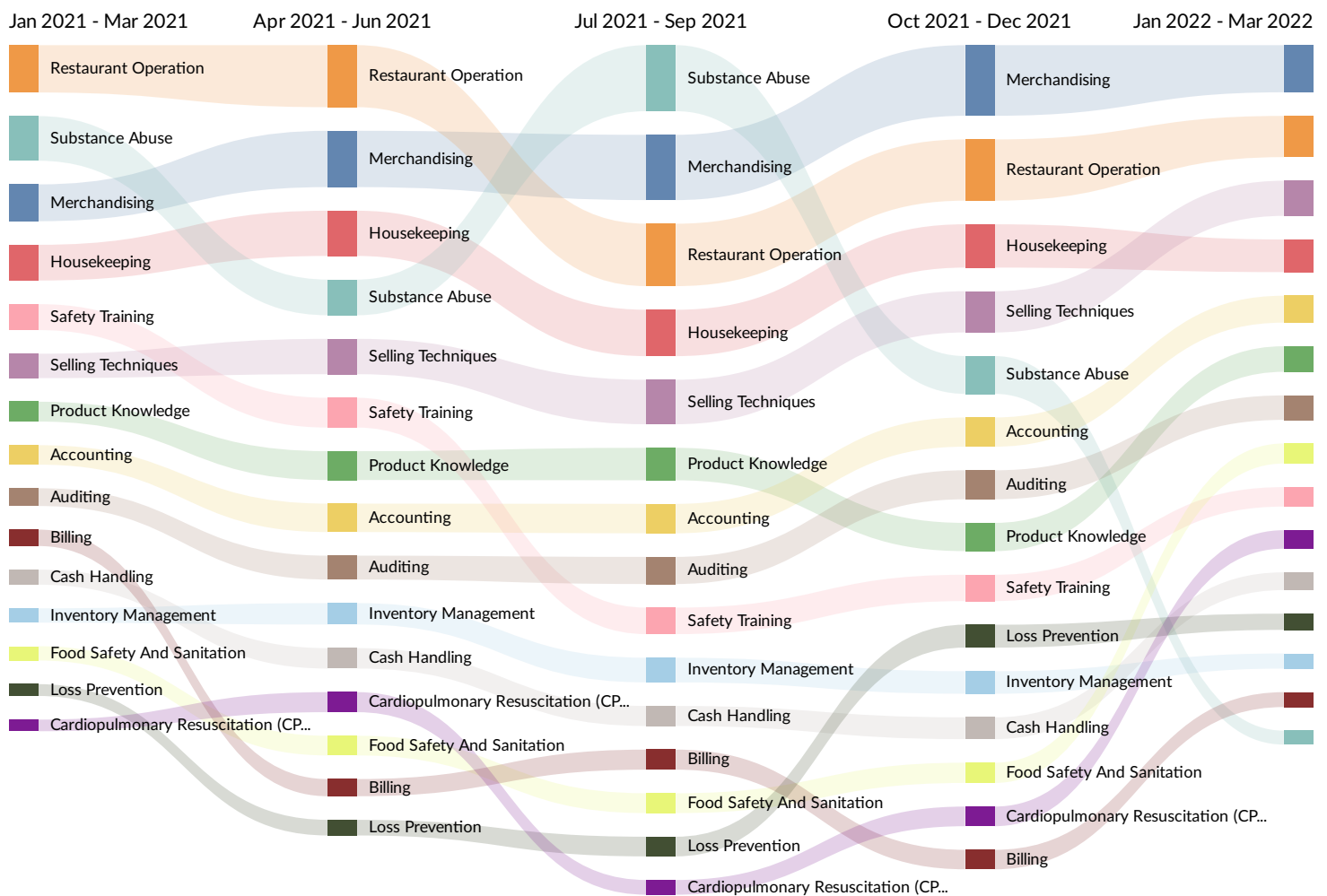

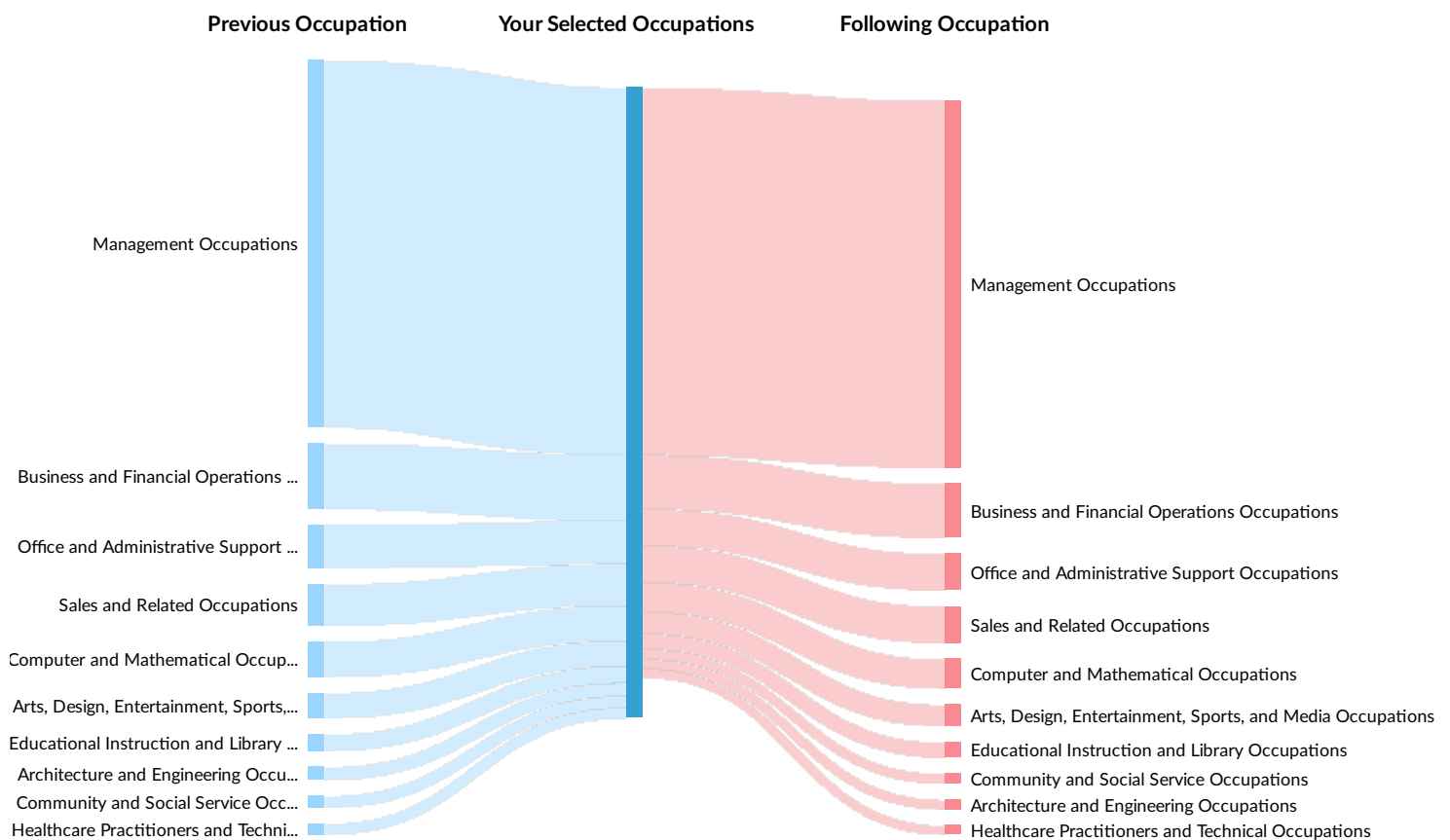
