A Little History...

1993

• Ordinance 93-17 established a MWBE goal setting program on County projects.

2004

• Business Opportunity Act 2004 included a race-neutral component in the form of the sheltered market program for SBE firms.

2007

• Community Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (CDBE) Act, the first entirely raceneutral program.

2009

• County Business Enterprise (CBE) Act established a 25% cumulative goal on County projects & adjusted size standards for certified businesses

2012

• Business Opportunity Act of 2012, brought the CBE and SBE programs together in one act and continued cumulative 25% CBE goal.

2018

• Amendment to the BOA of 2012 to increase opportunities for small businesses.

- Must be 51% owned, managed and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individual(s).
- Personal Net Worth (PNW) must not exceed \$1.32 Million.
- Must be for profit and a small business as defined by the SBA.
- DBE Gross receipts must average and not exceed \$23.98 million over 3 years. ACDBE \$56.42 million.
- Must be an independent business located in District 4 (DOT).
- Owners must be U.S. Citizens or residents who belong to one or more of the following:
- Black American Hispanic Subcontinent Asian
- Asian Pacific Native American
- Woman



Certification: Federal Programs

About the Program:

Unlike the Local Program, the DBE/ACDBE Program is intended for M/WBE to participate in federally funded projects.

The current program goal on projects are set as follows:

- FTA Overall Goal for 2018-2019: **19.13**%
- FAA Overall Goal for 2017-2019: **20.3%**

Certification: Federal Programs

- DBEs can have an average annual gross receipts up to \$23.98M over the preceding three fiscal years.
- ACDBEs can have an average annual gross receipts up to \$56.42M
 over the preceding three fiscal years.
- Certified Companies throughout the State of Florida and outside Florida can participate in Broward County federally funded contracts.

Required Documents for All Applicants

☐ Résumés (that include places of employment with
corresponding dates), for all owners, officers, and key
personnel of the applicant firm
☐ Personal Net Worth Statement for each socially and
economically disadvantaged owners comprising 51% or more
of the ownership percentage of the applicant firm.
☐ Personal Federal tax returns for the past 3 years, if
applicable, for each disadvantaged owner
☐ Federal tax returns (and requests for extensions) filed by
the firm and its affiliates with related schedules, for the past 3
years.
☐ Documented proof of contributions used to acquire
ownership for each owner (e.g., both sides of cancelled
checks)
☐ Signed loan and security agreements, and bonding forms
☐ List of equipment and/or vehicles owned and leased
including VIN numbers, copy of titles, proof of ownership,
insurance cards for each vehicle.





☐ Title(s), registration certificate(s), and U.S. DOT numbers
for each truck owned or operated by your firm
☐ Licenses, license renewal forms, permits, and haul
authority forms
☐ Descriptions of all real estate (including office/storage
space, etc.) owned/leased by your firm and documented proof
of ownership/signed leases
☐ Documented proof of any transfers of assets to/from your
firm and/or to/from any of its owners over the past 2 years

- ☐ Personal Federal Tax returns for the past 3 years, if applicable, for other disadvantaged owners of the firm.
- ☐ Trust agreements held by any owner claiming disadvantaged status
- ☐ Year-end balance sheets and income statements for the past 3 years (or life of firm, if less than three years)

Lauderhill Mall Transit Center Construction (\$6.5M)

Project Description:

A new Transit Center centrally located within the existing Lauderhill Mall property immediately adjacent to State Road 7; approximately a 1.5 acre parcel. The new facility will accommodate 10 individual Bus Bays utilized by Fixed Route, as well as, local Community Buses. The facility will house a Customer Service Center, Covered Exterior Platforms with fixed seating and ample Public Restrooms for patrons. Office space / Meeting Rooms and a Driver's Lounge will also be provided for County Staff. The total building area is approximately 3,000 SF.

Project Description:

The Miramar Park and Ride Facility's proposed scope of work shall include the relevant construction services necessary to develop the +/14 acre parcel of vacant land located within an existing FPL easement.
The scheduled development is located to the East of Hiatus Road between Miramar Boulevard and Pembroke Road and will accommodate convenient parking for over 450 daily patrons.


